Dear Mr. Aney,

I received a letter from Mr. Aney, Daman
yesterday. You know he has been associated
with the Benares-Jaipur constituency as a
member of the election petition filed by Pandit
Krishna Kank Malanpuri. He tells me that he
has decided not to contest the seat again.
It seems to me to be the simplest solution
of the difficulty of Pandit Malanpuri could
be induced to stand for this seat and be
declared elected unopposed. That, I understand,
is the desire of Pandit Laxmi Datt Pant
and Mr. A. B. Nair, as also that of Mr. Bhulabhai
Desai. This seems all parties concerned of the
formation of an electoral league election and a
Pandit into the assembly of 1855.

If Pandit Krishna Kant chose to stand for this
 seat, it is possible Cargen might ~~be~~ likely

 nomination paper would be rejected because of
 his previous conviction. I signed the con for
 him on the subject & his nomination was held
 valid by the magistrate, though legally it could
 not be. I ~~therefore~~ ^{therefore} withdrew: I ~~had~~ ^{had}
 had made a caution with Pandit Madhul
 that I should be allowed to withdraw if the
^{Pandit Krishna Kant}
 nomination was accepted. He contested against
 Mr. Chintamani and won. In 1926, I was
 put up for this seat again. Malanji brought
 the whole matter forward & I lost.

I may tell you, in confidence, that it would be difficult to keep father much longer in the assembly. He has, I believe, agreed to come up to the next Simla session, but I doubt if he would be induced to come back after that. There are more seats than available. An amicable arrangement can be come to. Just now he has also been upset at the way Pandit Krishna Kant has been conducting himself - will not be induced to go on to him. I appeal to you to handle matters in such a manner that peace & harmony may not be disturbed between the Special Congress & Pandit Balaram's Mission in the U.P. and a most embarrassing situation safely averted. I earnestly look up to you in the matter. Please excuse me if I have written anything that I regret not to have done.
