

# Nehru's 2nd Round Of Talks With Kishi

## INDIA'S PLAN FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT EXPLAINED

**TOKYO, Oct. 5.—**Prime Minister Nehru and Japanese Premier Mr. Kishi concluded their second round of talks at the scenic mountain resort, Hakone, near here tonight.

The talks which were in continuation of those held on the 'pressing problems of the day' for two hours at Mr. Kishi's residence here this morning had for their venue the Fujiyama Hotel where the two Asian leaders dined.

Mr. Nehru and Mr. Kishi had earlier in the afternoon travelled by a special train to Hakone lying at the foothills of Mount Fuji.

At the morning's talk were present on the Japanese side, Foreign Minister, Mr. A. Fujiyama, who returned home after a visit to the United States and Britain day before yesterday, Mr. K. Ono, Deputy Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. Frank Matsumoto Parliamentary Vice-Minister for Foreign Affairs, Mr. K. Aichi Secretary-General of Foreign Affairs, and Mr. Yoshizawa, Japanese Ambassador to India. The Indian Premier was accompanied by Mr. N. R. Pillai, Secretary-General of External Affairs Ministry, Mr. C. S. Jha, Indian Ambassador in Tokyo and Mr. O Mathai, Mr. Nehru's private secretary.

### DISARM ISSUE

The two Prime Ministers were understood to have exchanged views on the 'pressing problems of the day'. The talks, which were held in a 'very friendly and cor-

dial 'atmosphere' were said to have been mainly devoted to disarmament question with special reference to suspension of nuclear tests. Other international problems also figured in the conversation. Mr. Nehru is also said to have explained to Mr. Kishi India's plans for economic development.

A large crowd of Japanese correspondents and sightseers had collected at Mr. Kishi's residence at the time of the conference. The two Prime Ministers on emerging out of the talks stood on the porch in brilliant sunshine to allow cameramen to take photographs. Mr. Nehru reacted to correspondents questions with a smile while Mr. Kishi stood by

The Japanese Government might issue a communique on today's talks between the two Prime Ministers. A joint statement is expected to be issued later before Mr. Nehru concludes the tour of Japan.

## VISIT TO PALACE

Mr. Nehru began his ten-day visit to the Imperial Palace to sign Emperor Hirohito's visiting book before being driven to Mr. Kishi's residence in pleasant weather.

This afternoon the Indian Premier will visit the Odawara city folk art training centre, near Tokyo, before leaving for Hakone.

Mr. Nehru, who took protocol and police officials completely by surprise last night by going out of schedule to visit the famous neon light shopping centre has been received everywhere with traditional Japanese courtesy and friendliness. Despite cold nip in the air this morning scores of children had gathered outside Mr. Nehru's residence here to cheer him on his way to Imperial Palace.

Hundreds of people came out of shops and houses to greet him as he went round the city to fulfil his engagements. Trams and buses, which had been stopped to let Mr. Nehru's car pass, were full with passengers eagerly peering out to have a glimpse of the Indian Prime Minister.
