Directive to Abdullah

No settlement with India without due talks with Ayub

NEW DELHI, May 6 (PTI)—President Ayub Khan of Pakistan has, in a letter addressed to Sheikh Abdullah, advised him not to reach any settlement on Kashmir with Indian leaders 'without due consultation and agreement' with him (Ayub Khan) and his colleagues.

The letter was handed over to the Sheikh by Pakistan's High Commissioner in New Delhi personally at the Prime Minister's house.

The letter, which renewed President Ayub Khan's invitation to Sheikh Abdullah to visit Pakistan, said: 'You are obviously discussing future of Kashmir with Indian leaders.

'Considering that we have given a solemn pledge to the people of Kashmir that the future of the State would be decided in accordance with their wishes as envisaged in the United Nations' resolutions and the fact that we have vital interests in Kashmir, you will understand our anxiety that no settlement is reached without due consultation with us.'

'Therefore, if you think that time is now ripe for such consultation, we would be very happy to receive you here and discuss this matter with you'.

The letter was read out to correspondents by a spokesman of the Sheikh here this evening.

Asked if the Sheikh had sent any reply to the letter, the spokesman said: 'no'
