Will Home Department kindly see their file connected with Mr. Wallinger's special duty in England which has been sanctioned up to 31st March 1913 (Secretary of State's telegram to His Excellency the Viceroy, dated 5th December 1911). Mr. Wallinger has continued to do most valuable work, and as he himself is willing to remain on this duty, I do not think the question of replacing him by another officer need be considered, while the necessity for an officer of his class for the work in England and on the Continent is acute.

MY LORD MARQUIS,

WE have the honour to refer to the correspondence ending with Your Lordship's telegram of the 5th December 1911, in which the deputation of Mr. Wallinger of the Bombay Police to watch and report on the movements of Indian anarchists in London and on the continent, was sanctioned up till the 31st of March 1913.

2. We have given our careful consideration to the necessity of retaining further Mr. Wallinger's services in Europe, and we are satisfied that at the present juncture it would be most unwise to dispense with them. Mr. Wallinger has furnished us with information from time to time of much value, and while the existing situation continues we are anxious to retain him in his present capacity. We trust, therefore, that Your Lordship will approve of a further extension of his special duty for a period of one year.
