

PREFACE.

THE capture of Fort William in the year 1756 is one of the most prominent incidents in the history of the British in Bengal, not merely as one of the first great clashes of arms between the British and the Natives of the country, nor because of the sufferings of those who took part in the defence or underwent the hardships of the long stay at Fulta, but for this reason, that the behaviour of the Nawab, Siraj-ud-daula, forced the Honourable East India Company to reconsider the whole question of its relations with the native Government of Bengal. Up to the outbreak of the war the Servants of the Company had been satisfied to pose as foreign traders, practically unarmed, and not presuming in Bengal-whatever they had done in Southern India-to take any active share in the political arrangements of the country. Siraj-ud-daula by his violent action convinced the Company that its merchants must be no longer looked upon as mere foreigners but as lords of the country in which they resided for the purposes of trade. It took nearly ten years to realize this fact and perhaps still longer to acknowledge it, but the recapture of Calcutta is the starting point of the new idea. It therefore becomes a matter of interest to know something about the Europeans who were in Bengal at the time, and to whose hands fell the task of accomplishing the Revolution. Very few of their names are to be found in the Dictionary of National Biography and again not too many are to be found even in the Records of the East India Company. All that can be done is to make as complete a list as possible from the records at our disposal and to trust to the future to fill in further details. The conquest of Bengal is no Norman Conquest. The British in India do not boast that their ancestors came with Clive on his mission of delivery and vengeance, for there has been no British colonisation of Bengal and the sons of the conquerors have but seldom followed in their fathers' footsteps. There must, however, be in Great Britain many families whose relationship with the India of the past is not wholly forgotten, and if this compilation ever reaches their eyes, I hope the dry details of what is, after all, only a Directory of Bengal in 1756 may awake the remembrance of the ancestral bond and cause them to look up old letters and documents from which fresh light may be thrown upon the life story of as bold a set of adventurers as ever left the shores of Britain to build up our great Empire of to-day.

Of the inhabitants of Calcutta in 1756 it is perhaps natural that our greatest interest should attach itself to the names of those persons who actually perished

in the Black Hole, and it will perhaps be useful to summarise the information we possess as follows:--

Luke Scrafton, one of the Company's servants, who was stationed at Dacca during the time of the siege, says that when the Black Hole was opened on the morning of the 21st and Siraj-ud-daula was told of the sufferings of the English "he testified no concern (and even then might have saved the lives of many who had some little life left in them, and might have been recovered by bleeding and proper care) but suffered, if he did not order them, to be thrown with the dead into the ditch." This added horror, prophetic of the behaviour of the mutineers at Cawnpore, seems to be based on a remark in Holwell's letter of the 3rd August 1756, written from Hughli, in which he says that the number of those who died in the Black Hole was only 123, "many recovering after air was let in by the opening of the door in the morning, and many more I doubt not might have recovered had any means or care been taken of them." Holwell

It remains only to say a few words about the sources from which the List has been compiled. Most of them are given in the note which stands at the foot of every page. A few additions have been made from the Bengal Obituary (see Thornhill), the East Indian Chronologist (see Roop), and from the accounts of persons t who give too little additional information to make it necessary to note them separately.

(a) Holwell's Lists .- These are three in number-

(1) The List appended to his letter of the 3rd August 1756, written from Hughli to the Council at Fort St. George, Madras.

(2) The List appended to his "Genuine narrative of the deplorable deaths of the English gentlemen and others who were suffocated in the Black Hole in Fort William at Calcutta, etc."

(3) The Epitaph on the monument which he erected in Calcutta at the north-west corner of Dalhousia Square, supposed to be the spot upon which the dead bodies taken from the Black Hole were buried.

These lists, as far as they refer to the Black Hole, are almost exactly the same, and mutually contradictory only in the case of Stephen Page, who in the letter of the 3rd August is, I believe by a mistake, put down amongst those who deserted the Fort, and again as Captain Stephen Page, one of the victims.

(b) Holwell's Letters. These, of course, contain the names, not only of those who were killed, but of some who survived the Black Hole and of a number of persons who were present at the siege. The most important of these are as follows:—

(1) and (2) Letters to the Councils at Fort St. George and Bombay, dated 17th July 1756. (Duplicates.)

(3) Letter to the Council at Fort St. George, dated 3rd August 1756.

(4) Letter to the Council at Fulta, dated 25th October 1756.

(5) Letter to the Court of Directors, dated 30th November 1756.

(6) Letter to William Davis, dated 28th February 1757.
(7) Letter to the Court of Directors, dated — August 1757.

- Europeans put in claims for damages. One of the conditions in the Treaty which placed Mir Jafar on the masnad was that he should recoup the Company and individual Europeans for their losses. Payments of this nature are entered in detail in Public Proceedings of the 4th and 29th December 1759, the 31st January, 3rd March, and 1st May 1760. At first sight it might be supposed that all persons claiming restitution must have been in Bengal during the siege, and, generally speaking, this is true; but there are a number of claims on account of the estates of deceased persons. Some of the claimants on these accounts were certainly not in Calcutta during the siege, and some of the deceased had died before the siege. For the presence, therefore, of persons belonging to either of these classes corroborative evidence is required.
- (d) General Journals.—These are the monthly accounts of the Company's expenditure in Bengal. Fortunately, when all other Records for 1756 were lost, these were preserved, and they give many details of the expenditure at Fulta, the place of refuge to which most of the English betook themselves on the fall of Calcutta. They tell us very little of the refugees at Hughli and other places, but enable us to fill in a number of Christian names and personal details not ascertainable from any other sources. I found these Journals in the charge of the Comptroller General, and they have been of the greatest possible assistance.
- (e) Public Proceedings and Letters to and from Court.—These are by no means in a satisfactory condition, and the labour of searching through them has been very tedious. The Public Proceedings, spart from the lists of European Sufferers, are of use chiefly to supply the names of persons who sent provisions or military stores into the Fort a few days before the siege, or who claimed payment for bonds or goods lodged, for sate custody or trade purposes,

in the Fort and lost during the siege. The Letters of the Council at Fort William to the Court of Directors contain details regarding persons who figured in the siege, but as the Council finally determined to submit no official report of the loss of Calcutta to the Court of Directors, on the ground that its members could not agree upon any unanimous narrative,* these letters are not as useful as they might be. The letters from the Court of Directors to the Council at Fort William of course contain only such information as was supplied to them by official or private letters. One learns a little from these letters, but not much.

(f) Account by George Gray, Juntor.—This was attached to a letter from Messrs. Watts and Collet, dated Chandernagore, the 16th July 1756, and is probably the earliest English account of the siege. Mr. Gray stood to his duty throughout the siege, and made his way to Chandernagore in the confusion which followed the capture of the Fort, thus escaping the horrors of the Black Hole.

- (g) The Fulta Lists I give this name to certain lists of persons killed in the fighting and in the Black Hole, of persons who took refuge at Fulta, both men and women, and of persons captured at the other Factories. These were, I believe, compiled at Fulta or in Madras from lists sent down from Fulta, and were sent home apparently in private letters, where they were published in English and Scotch newspapers. Drawn up in the confusion and distress of Fulta, they appear to me to be of rather doubtful accuracy, and therefore need corroboration. At the same time, they give details of the deaths of certain persons in the fighting (see Blagg, Carse, etc.) which are so circumstantial that they cast doubt upon Holwell's Lists and make one inclined to doubt their absolute accuracy. I believe the horrors of the "Hell in Miniature" † were so great, that in his delirium Holwell saw again the faces of men who had been killed during the siege-not only saw but spoke to them. His first list is dated 3rd August 1756, only about six weeks after the fatal night. It was drawn up before he could have recovered from the effects of his sufferings in Calcutta, his journey, ill and feeble as he was, in an open boat to Murshidabad, and his imprisonment at that place. These continuous tortures must have impressed the hallucinations of his delirium indelibly on his mind, so that later on when he erected his monument to his fellow-sufferers he relied on his own memory only. I should mention that attention was first drawn to the Fulta Lists by Mr. T. R. Munro, of the Port Commissioners' Office.
- (h) Lists of the Company's Servants in 1756 and 1757.—When the Council at Fort William decided it could not agree upon an unanimous account of the Troubles,‡ it coolly informed the Court of Directors that, if they would compare the list of Covenanted servants of 1757 with that of 1756, the Court

would see who had died and who were still living.* These lists were, as was usual with work done, in those times, for the Council at Fort William, carelessly drawn up, but they supply us with a little information regarding the occupations of the various Company's servants, the length of their service, and their ages at the time of the siege. The oldest amongst the Civilians (Holwell) was 45 years old, the youngest, eight in number, were only 18. Of these eight, four died in the Black Hole, two survived, one escaped after the capture of the Fort, and only one is accused of having followed the example of Governor Drake, whilst another account says he also escaped after the capture of the Fort.

(i) Mr. Tooke's and Mr. Orme's accounts.—Mr. William Tooke was a Factor in the Company's service and a Volunteer at the time of the siege. He wrote a voluminous account of the Troubles, parts of which appear to have been included in a letter by Otme to Robert Clive. Orme was at Madras at the time, but he had large business interests and many friends in Bengal. In his manuscripts, preserved in the India Office, there is a mine of information from which every historian of the period has extracted fresh nuggets, but no one, as yet, seems to have thought it his duty to publish them as a whole.

(j) Orme's List of Inhabitants, who bore arms at the late siege of Calcutta.—This is exactly what it calls itself. Being the only list of its kind, it is, perhaps, ungracious to remark that it would have been much more useful if Orme had given the Christian names of the people mentioned and if he had said how the people, whom he describes as having perished during the

Troubles, actually did die.

(k) Parish Register of St. Anne's Church.—The writings of the Rev. H. B. Hyde have made every one familiar with the fact that the first English Church in Calcutta was that of St. Anne, on the site of the present Council Chamber of the Bengal Government. Mr. Hyde copied, with his own hand, the Parish Register of this Church, and from his copy I have recovered the Christian names of a large number of the persons who lived in Calcutta as this time, and the names of their children. As the Parish Register ceases abruptly early in 1756 † and the new Parish Registers begin in 1757, not only is the Fulta period (June to December 1756) blank, but also the preceding three or four months. Accordingly, there is a little doubt about the names of the children. I have entered as doubtful the names of some persons of little importance who appear in the lists of marriages and christenings, though I have not always been able to obtain corroborative evidence of their being actually alive at the time of the siege.

(1) Captain Mills' Packet Book.—This is among the Orme manuscripts. Captain Mills was a rough seaman; he gives us the names of certain persons not mentioned by more dignified writers. His lists, as I have said above, enable us, with one addition (see Roop), to complete the tale of twenty-three who survived

Amongst them are a number of Wills and Petitions for letters of administration to the Estates of persons who died intestate. From these many Christian names and, in a few cases, Professions and Relationships have been traced.

A number of corrections and additions have been made from notes kindly supplied me by His Excellency, Lord Curzon.

In submitting this List to the Public I wish to call attention to the fact that it is almost impossible to be absolutely certain of the spelling of proper names. The same documents, whether legal or commercial, often show the same name spelled in two or even three different ways, and one is often at a loss whether to choose the form which is probably correct or the form which is certainly the most common.




