Letter from the Commissioner in Sind, No. 902 A., dated 10th March 1885—Submitting the Annual Report on the Revenue Settlement of the Province of Sind for the year 1883-84.

RESOLUTION.—There are some differences in the numbers of the villages in different districts of the province of Sind as shown in the report under review and those shown in the report for the previous year. The transfer to the Upper Sind Frontier District of portions of some talukās of the Shikārpur District and the introduction of revised settlements in the Hyderabad and Karāchi Districts caused some alterations in the numbers in those districts. The total number of Government villages in the year under review is shown as 3,186 or 1 less than in the previous year. A decrease of 15 in the number of alienated villages (96) is due mainly to the fact that partially alienated villages, which should be shown as Government villages, were previously shown as alienated, but a corresponding increase is not shown in the number of Government villages. An increase from 15,671 in 1882-83 to 15,919 in 1883-84 in the number of Government hamlets is attributed to more accurate enumeration. The Commissioner states that clusters of temporary huts and homesteads set up in isolated places by graziers and other nomadic tribes, which were formerly shown as hamlets, have now been excluded from the list.

2. The total assessed culturable area is shown as having declined from 4,520,588 acres in 1882-83 to 4,459,841 acres in 1883-84. The figures are not however quite correct, as some of the Collectors have excluded unoccupied fields in talukās under temporary settlement because the assessment on such numbers is not shown in the survey registers. The Commissioner points out that as the fields are available for cultivation, and the rates to be imposed according to the kind of cultivation are sanctioned, there is no good reason for excluding them. The area of occupied land in 1883-84 was 3,649,663 acres as compared with 3,790,763 acres in the previous year. The decrease is attributed to relinquishment on the introduction of a regular settlement of portions of land held under leases and to a better understanding of the fallow rules. The area of land taken up for cultivation was 203,799 acres, while that of land relinquished was 334,477 acres and that of land forfeited 10,422 acres.

3. There was owing to an unusually low inundation a contraction of cultivation in all districts except Thar and Parkar, where owing to the protective embankments and favourable rainfall lands which had never before been tilled were brought under cultivation. The area of land under cultivation is shown as having fallen from 3,072,949 acres in 1882-83 to 2,611,559 acres in 1883-84. But this area includes some lands held under leases or under old settlement, and portions of fields held under temporary or revision settlement for which assessment was paid, but which were not actually cultivated, and which are not even shown as occupied land lying fallow. In future this area should be entered under the head of occupied fallow. The area actually under cultivation in the year under review is estimated to have been 1,952,035 acres. The area of occupied land lying fallow is shown as 1,038,104 acres.

4. Of the total area shown as cultivated $\frac{2}{3}$ was under kharif (early) crops and a little over $\frac{1}{10}$ under rabi (late) crops. Kharif crops were sown to the largest extent in Hyderabad and rabi in Shikārpur.

There was a large decrease in the area sown with jowári, the decrease in the Shikárpur District alone amounting to 111,477 acres, and a small decrease in the area sown with wheat, oil-seeds and cotton, but the area sown with bájri and rice was rather larger than in the previous year. In the Shikárpur District the largest area was devoted to the cultivation of jowári, wheat and rice, while in the Hyderabad and Thar and Párkár Districts extensive areas were sown with bájri. Cotton was grown to a considerable extent in the Hyderabad District only.

6. The total number of occupancies, including inám holdings, in the year under review was 145,030 or 796 less than in the previous year, the average size of occupancies in the whole province being 32 acres 31 gunthás. The average size of occupancies in the different districts was as follows:—

The miscellaneous revenue shown in the preceding statement comprises the collections of miscellaneous items of irrigation revenue during the official year ending 31st March 1884, whereas in the reports for previous years they were shown for the revenue year. Mr. Erskine explains that this revenue is shown for the official year in the Public Works Accounts, and that accurate figures cannot be obtained for the revenue year. There was a decrease of Rs. 73,300 in the net revenue for collection after deducting remissions. If the expenditure on canals in 1882-83, which amounted to Rs. 15,16,323, be deducted from the revenue for collection in the year under review, there remains a net profit of Rs. 21,70,431; in the previous year the profit similarly calculated amounted to Rs. 22,84,095.

8. The net land revenue obtained independently of canal irrigation amounted to Rs. 11,71,925 in 1883-84, or Rs. 88,950 less than in 1882-83. The details are as follows :—

There was a large decrease in the revenue derived from land irrigated from the Indus and from land dependent on rainfall, but it was partly counterbalanced by an increase in the proceeds of the village officers' cess, which is extended as talukás are brought under settlement. There has also been a satisfactory increase in the revenue from land irrigated from wells, which is said to be due to the orders of Government that such land is not to be subjected to extra assessment on account of irrigation from wells, and in miscellaneous items.

9. The general results of the administration of land revenue during the year under review and the previous year are shown in the following statement :—

Note.—The figures for 1882-83 differ from those given in the report for that year, the difference being due (1) to exclusion of items of miscellaneous revenue credited in the Irrigation Department accounts; (2) to the inclusion of certain items of Sayar Revenue credited in the accounts under the head Land Revenue.

There was a decrease in the gross revenue in all the districts except Thar and Párkar, which is due chiefly to the contraction of cultivation in consequence of the low inundation and scanty rainfall which have been mentioned above, and to the exclusion from the Government demand of the assessment on fallow lands which was included in the demand shown for the previous year.

10. The total amount of alienated revenue in 1883-84 was Rs. 4,20,225 as compared with Rs. 4,24,289 in 1882-83. The decrease occurred in the Hyderabad and Karáchi Districts owing to lapses of ináms and resumptions of grants in consequence of the holders failing to observe the conditions on which the grants were made. The decrease in the revenue of lands held free by special agreements is due to the levy of assessment on some lands assigned for plantation or other purposes which were cultivated contrary to the terms of the grants. The increase of Rs. 1,812 in the revenue credited to the Irrigation Department is attributed to the adoption of the revised rates of Hakabo sanctioned in Government Resolution, Public Works Department, Irrigation, No. 142 A. I. 7 624, dated 22nd November 1882.

11. Remissions amounting to Rs. 1,2³₁,599 were granted in the year under review as compared with Rs. 2,46,886 in the previous year. Rs. 95,425 were remitted on account of insufficiency of water and Rs. 26,174 on account of damage done to crops by floods, rats, erosion and other causes. The ravages of rats were confined to the Thar and Párkar District, where vast numbers of them are still found. Since the close of the year under review an additional sum of Rs. 83,093 has been remitted on account of insufficiency of water.

12. The revenue for collection in the year under review is shown to have been Rs. 46,90,832 or Rs. 2,08,790 less than in the previous year. The Commissioner doubts the accuracy of the figures, because remissions were granted after the close of the year as noticed in the preceding paragraph. He states that applications for remissions were unduly delayed, and did not reach him till after the close of the year. The amount of land revenue inclusive of village officers' cess collected in 1883-84 was Rs. 46,12,299 as compared with Rs. 46,79,001 in 1882-83. Of the balance outstanding at the close of the previous year Rs. 1,71,278 were collected and Rs. 1,98,416 were written off, the total balance outstanding at the close of the year under review being Rs. 4,98,198. This amount is classified by the Commissioner as under:—

But of the amount shown as recoverable, Rs. 72,401 were recovered before the date of the Commissioner's report, Rs. 1,74,973 are due by the Manager, Encumbered Estates in Sind, the recovery of Rs. 69,571 was temporarily postponed, and coercive measures were adopted for the realization of the remainder. It would appear from the Commissioner's report that a large part of the balances shown as doubtful and ~~disputed~~ is really irrecoverable.

As in previous years, the revenue was collected in the Thar and Párkar District without pressure of any kind. In the other districts, particularly in Shikárpur, the coercion was considerable, but it is asserted to have been exercised only in cases of actual contumacy, and the statement is corroborated by the facts that in the great majority of cases the assessment was paid before property distrained was sold, and that the greater part of the land forfeited was restored. The number of notices issued fell from 44,631 in 1882-83 to 32,755 in 1883-84, but the sum levied on account of notice fees was more by Rs. 32 than in 1882-83. Penalties under Section 148 of the Land Revenue Code were levied in 295 cases in the Shikárpur District and in 1 case in the Karáchi District. In the Hyderabad District 1,395 warrants were issued for the distraint of moveable property, but most of the arrears were paid without execution of the warrants, and in 22 cases only was it found necessary to sell the property. Immoveable property other than land was sold in 29 cases in the Shikárpur District. Of the total area forfeited (67,779 acres) only 796 acres were sold.

14. Advances under the Land Improvement Act were made in the year under review in all the districts except the Upper Sind Frontier, but the total sum advanced on this account was only Rs. 9,075, of which Rs. 200 were recovered during the year. Of the balance outstanding at the close of the previous year Rs. 4,009 were recovered during the year under review, the balance outstanding at the close of the year being Rs. 10,943. Rs. 266 have subsequently been recovered and the remainder is stated to be recoverable. Advances for other purposes connected with agriculture amounting to Rs. 45,164 were granted in 1883-84. The balance outstanding on this account in 1882-83 was Rs. 52,914. Rs. 35,005 were recovered during the year under review and Rs. 345 were written off the accounts.

15. In the statement of sáyar (miscellaneous) revenue appended to the report for the previous year were shown items which come under the head of Land Revenue, but the statement appended to the report under review includes only such items as are credited to the head 'Miscellaneous', items credited to Land Revenue being shown in Statement No. I according to the instructions conveyed in Government Resolution No. 6829, dated 14th November 1877. The former items amounted to Rs. 4,268 in 1883 as compared with Rs. 5,676 in 1882-83.

16. The total revenue for collection and the amount collected in the year under review and the previous year respectively were as follows:—

There was for reasons above explained a large decrease both in the revenue for collection and in the revenue collected, but the proportion collected was greater than in the previous year. The cost of collection rose from Rs. 5,79,913 in 1882 to Rs. 6,66,554 in 1883-84, and the proportion of cost to revenue from 12.26 per cent. to 14.27 per cent.

17. The thanks of Government should be conveyed to Mr. Erskine for the efficient supervision which he has continued to exercise over the land revenue administration of the province.
