All of these have now been separately reported on. The abolition of (1) to (11) has been sanctioned by Political Agent and Council and (12) will be disposed of in the *maf* enquiry. A few more special taxes or cesses in these tahsils require separate mention :—

(a) In Ajabgarh and the 27 *Gawaras* or hamlets allotted to it, a sum of Rs. 141 is annually realised in excess of the revenue and cesses to meet subscription to temples, feeding of pigeons, tahsil expenses, etc., etc. None of these items is a legitimate charge on the people and I have proposed their abolition.

(b) In Sunera, tahsil Thana Ghazi, Rs. 50 per annum is levied through the tahsil with the revenue to discharge a private debt due to the influential Thakur of Thana. He should be left to the ordinary forms of redress through the Civil Court.

(c) In Buteri of tahsil Bansur a fine of Rs. 1,050 is due from the Shaikhawat owners, being the arrears of a fine which the Alwar Darbar paid in 1869 on their behalf to Jaipur as compensation for crimes committed by them on Jaipur subjects. I have proposed that this be spread over a period of 20 years and realised as arrears of revenue at the rate of Rs. 52-8-0 per annum.

(d) In Bansur annas 2 per village is levied to pay the tahsil water-carrier, who should be paid by the State.

(e) In Thana Ghazi contributions varying from annas 8 to Rs. 2 are levied from each village on behalf of a new temple erected close to the tahsil. The total amount is Rs. 89-4-0. This payment into the tahsil which tends to become compulsory should be abolished, and the people left to contribute direct to the temple funds if they chose.

149. I have gone at what may appear unnecessary minuteness into these Necessity for abolishing petty cesses and taxes because trifling as and taxes. They may seem, they are vicious in principle, and form an evil precedent for the levy of more harassing and burdensome imposts. Nothing is easier than for a Court favourite or hanger-on to suggest and for the Chief to sanction his receiving a reward or maintenance by the

grant of a trifling sum from each village in the State or in a tahsil. It is not so much the actual amount levied as the manner of levying it that harasses the people. Thus the "Bard" already referred to in case his fee on marriage is not promptly paid, has been accustomed in the past to invoke the aid of the State, which took the form of quartering police on a village till the rupee was forthcoming. Every such petty cess exposes the people to the interference of one department or another, and I know I am only expressing the general feeling of the present administration in urging that such interference should be cut down as much as possible.

150. As stated in paragraph 154 of last year's report, general rules will now be framed to give elasticity of assessment

Di-alluvion rules.

in villages subject to di-alluvial action,

viz., those adjoining the Landoha, Sahibi and other large *nals* which are liable to shift their channels or to deposit sand. Similarly the fluctuating system of assessing lands liable to be submerged (paragraphs 18 and 154 of last year's report), will be applied to lands within the Siliserh *band* and to other *bands* where similar conditions may require it.

Revenue instalments.

151. The dates sanctioned for the revenue instalments in the tahsils already assessed are:—

Kharif—1st instalment, 25th November to 10th December.

2nd „ 20th December to 5th January.

Rabi—one „ 1st to 31st May.

and these seem also suitable for this tract. It has been suggested to me that as *bajra* and *masina* the chief *kharif* crops, and barley and gram the chief *rabi* crops all ripen early the dates might be put 15 days earlier. No doubt in a year of scarcity like that which we have just gone through, the State through its tahsildars is compelled in its own interests to anticipate the dates of collections.

Summary of proposals.

152. The chief points to which sanction is now required are:—

(1) The proposed new assessment (paragraph 129) and revenue rates (paragraph 135).

(2) The remission to be given to Rajputs and others on account of favourable rates of assessment in Bansur and Thana Ghazi (80).

(3) The proposal for the disposal of arrears down to 1898-99 (65 and 134).

(4) The proposed method of assessing *dahri* lands and land liable to diluvion and alluvion (23 and 150).

(5) The proposals regarding the term of settlement (131), rate of cesses (138 and 147), and of *malba* (146) and dates of revenue instalment (151).

(6) The abolition of forced labour for cutting grass for the State (94), and of miscellaneous cesses (148).

The question of the arrears of the year 1899-1900 will be reported on as soon as I have had an opportunity of discussing it with the Political Agent and Council.

The proposals are generally on the same lines as those of my previous two reports, which have been fully discussed and revised by Political Agent and Council and the Agent to the Governor-General. Practically no new principle is involved, and I trust therefore that the orders of Government will be obtained on them in time to allow me to give out the assessments in August before proceeding on three months' leave. As this report completes the proposals for the re-assessment of the Alwar State, I feel bound to put on record my obligations to the Political Agents, Lieutenant-Colonel Jennings, R.E., and Captain Impey, with whom most of the important questions bearing on the Settlement have been discussed and decided, for the hearty co-operation they have shown throughout, as well as to the State Council and in particular to Dewan

Bahadur M. Balmukand Das for the broad and intelligent spirit in which they have received my proposals, and the promptitude with which they have disposed of the numerous questions I have constantly referred to them. Without such assistance I should have been unable to carry on the work with the despatch and absence of friction which I think may be claimed for it.

153. The excellent work done in these and other tahsils by the two Settlement Deputy Collectors M. Gauri Shankar and M. Rallia Ram has been referred to by me in previous reports.

Notice of Officers. I could not wish for more capable, zealous, and loyal assistants. Both have also won the high opinion both of the State Administration and of the people by their scrupulous integrity. M. Gauri Shankar has now returned to the Punjab on promotion to the office of Personal Assistant to Director of Land Records and Agriculture and M. Rallia Ram still holds direct charge of the operations in these three tahsils. Both have carried out every stage of the Settlement from the revision of the survey and the record to the preparation of excellent assessment reports for their respective tahsils on which I have based the present and previous reports. They have also had to dispose of all the judicial work in their circles which in British districts goes to the Civil Courts, and I consider them fully qualified to carry through a Settlement from beginning to end. I must not omit to mention the services of M. Amar Singh, Deputy Collector, which have been of equal value and which have already been recognised by his appointment to the post of Revenue Deputy Collector in the State. Of other officials the work of Babu Ram Kang, B.A., my Head Clerk, and of M. Mithan Lal, Superintendent of my office, deserves special mention. Of the Sadar Munsarims M. Mahomed Hosain has done best.

154. This report like the preceding ones deals only with the Settlement from Progress in other branches of the State. purely an assessment point of view and touches only indirectly on the many other important questions on which the successful working of the Settlement so largely depends, viz., the preparation of a correct record of rights, the disposal of the enormous mass of judicial and revenue cases and the general enquiry into revenue-free tenures, the reorganisation of the Patwari and Kanungo Agency, the system proposed for future working, especially as regards the keeping of the record up to date and the preparation of annual agricultural statistics for State purposes, and also for submission to the Government of India. To include these matters in the present report would unduly expand its already bulky dimensions. They have all been discussed in the annual reports sent in to the Political Agent and extracts from them will be found printed in the Annual Administration Reports for Rajputana.

Work to be done before closing the operations.

155. The chief matters to be completed before winding up Settlement are :—

(1) The announcement and distribution of the assessments in these three tahsils and the completion of the records.

(2) The enquiry into revenue-free tenures of which about three hundred cases have been disposed of and about 3,000 more are still under enquiry or awaiting disposal.

(3) The clearing off of large pending file of judicial cases and appeals of which I have over 200 still pending, though over 600 appeals have already been decided.

(4) The reorganisation of the Patwari and Kanungo Agency towards which a good deal has been already done.

(5) The preparation of a set of rules or manual for the future working of the Revenue Administration.

When these have been completed, I hope to submit a brief final report giving a *résumé* of the results of the Settlement operations, and indicating the points to which special attention will be required in working the Settlement.

As I have an equal if not a greater amount of work to dispose of in Bharatpur, and I wish to bring operations in both States to a close during cold weather, it will be seen that the carrying out of the programme largely depends on early orders being issued on this report and that which I am just about to take in hand for the four remaining tahsils of Bharatpur.

The cost of the Alwar Settlement up to 15th June has been Rs. 3,95,926. 5-11.
