

Nellore. The proportion of land thrown up to the entire holding is large in the Districts South Arcot noted in the margin. The Government request the Board to inquire into the causes which led the people to give up lands in those Districts. The extent of land taken up was however considerably more than that relinquished, and the net area of occupancy shows an excess of acres 4,09,068 above the occupancy of the previous year, though there is a decrease in the assessment of Rupees 82,405, owing however to the very proper omission from the accounts of the permanent remissions granted in Cuddapah.

7. The Government are glad to find that the rule of requiring the Ryots to pay for all lands not relinquished is being generally carried out, so far as circumstances permit. This result is highly satisfactory.

8. The Ryotwar settlement is shown in paragraph 12 of the Board's report. The net result was a decrease of Rupees 3,66,803. This decrease* occurred under "irrigated land" and "second crop assessment," and is owing to failure of water towards the close of the season, and the consequent grant of large remissions. Under unirrigated land there was an increase of Rupees 1,12,493, which occurred chiefly in the Districts where reductions in the land assessment have been effected, and may be attributed to this cause though doubtless high prices have also had their influence.

9. The remissions granted in the year amounted to Rupees 36,52,620, exceeding the remissions of the previous year by Rupees 3,40,799. The increase occurred wholly under "occasional remissions," consisting of "Shamlat Bunger" or parts of fields left unsown, and "Shavi" or withered crops, both owing to the failure of water, the result of the unfavorable character of the season.

10. Under "Sundry items" added to Ryotwar Land Revenue there was a net increase of Rupees 2,12,700, owing chiefly to the quit-rent newly imposed by the Imam Commissioner, and to the water tax levied in the Godavery and Kistna Districts.

11. The cultivation of Cotton and Indigo has fallen off, though in Coimbatore there was an increase under the former head. The failure of the Indigo cultivation occurred chiefly in Nellore and Kurnool in consequence of the adverse season.

12. The entire Land Revenue of the Presidency is shown in the table given in paragraph 22 of the Report. It amounted to Rupees 4,01,46,080, falling short of the Revenue of the previous Fasli by Rupees 2,51,993. The causes for this result have been already noticed. The Board truly remark that the reduction of assessment lately made in several Districts, and the high prices, have in a great degree counteracted the effects of the unfavorable season, or the decrease would have been still larger.

13. The settlement of the Sundry Sources of Revenue resulted in an increase of Rupees 30,67,729. The increase occurred chiefly under the heads noted in the margin. The greater portion of the increase under Abkarri belongs to the town of Madras, where the management of the Revenue is under Government, and the Income tax was levied for the first time in the year under report. The increase under Salt is owing chiefly to the increase in the rate of the monopoly price, and that under Stamps is the result of the new Stamp Law.

14. There was a large decrease of Rupees 1,09,379 under Sea Customs. The Board ascribe it to a large falling off in the importation of Cotton, Piece goods, Metals, &c. There was also a decrease of Rupees 86,037 under Moturpha, but that is simply nominal, those individuals who were excused from paying this tax having paid the Income Tax.

16. The proportion of wastage to the contents of the heaps during the last four years Fasli. is shown in the margin. There is no doubt of an improvement, but the Government believe that with greater care and exertion on the part of the Deputy Collectors in charge of Salt Departments the proportion can be still further reduced.

17. The Salt charges of the year have exceeded the similar charges of 1269 by 20 per cent. The Board ascribe it to payments made in this year for Salt manufactured in the preceding year, to the importation of large quantities of Salt into Canara and Malabar, to the opening of new Cotaurs, and to the pay of the Salt Deputy Collectors and their Establishments. The Board are requested to state how much of this large ratio is due to each of the causes mentioned.

18. The table in paragraph 39 of the Board's report shows the demand under all heads of Revenue for Fasli 1270, amounting to Rupees 5,80,30,402, and the increase in this year compared with 1269 amounting to Rupees 27,88,550, is owing entirely as already stated to the increase under "Sundry Sources of Revenue." The greater portion of the demand or Rupees 5,48,69,632 was collected within the Fasli. The balance left, viz., Rupees 31,80,771, was near 6 per cent. of the demand. This balance has been subsequently reduced up to February 1862 to Rupees 2,65,983, or 5 per cent., a result highly satisfactory.

19. The table of the Demand, Collection and Balance of the Land Revenue of the Neilgherry Taluk, given in paragraph 46 of the Board's Report, discloses a very unsatisfactory state of things. Half the demand due from Europeans, East Indians and others on lands held by them for Coffee plantations and other agricultural purposes, and 45 per cent. of quit-rent leviable from Europeans remained uncollected for three months after the close of the Fasli. The Board will instruct the present Collector to adopt compulsory measures if arrears are withheld in this manner.

20. The Demand, Collection, and Balance of arrears under all heads are shown below:-

Of this balance Rupees 1,44,315-10-0 are stated to be irrecoverable, and the Board request sanction for writing off that sum. The irrecoverable sum under "Permanently settled" amounting to Rupees 6,942-6-9, is due from the proprietors of three estates in the Godaverry District,

who are stated to claim certain remissions. The information placed before Government in regard to these claims is not sufficient, and they cannot therefore authorize the remissions. Sanction is granted for writing off the remainder of the irrecoverable balance amounting to Rupees 1,37,378-3-3.

21. The measures adopted by the Board of Revenue for the speedy settlement of old arrears, pursuant to the instructions contained in paragraphs 22 to 25 of the Order of Government dated 22nd April 1861, No. 907, appear to have been generally attended with good results. But the progress made in the adjustment of the arrears of older years is not very satisfactory. The Board will again place themselves in communication with the Inam Commissioner on the subject of the balances alluded to in paragraph 48. The Government concur with the Board of Revenue in the propriety of requiring such of the Mirasidars of Tanjore as have not yet done so to come to an immediate settlement of the question as to whether they will accept the Mottafysul settlement or not.

22. In paragraph 50, the Board show the entire receipts from all sources. The Collections both current and arrears within the Fasli amounted to Rupees 5,74,72,980, exceeding the Revenue of the previous year by Rupees 17,58,847. The charges of the year amounted to Rupees 71,06,252 or 123 per cent. on the entire receipts. The receipts and charges for the last twenty-one years are clearly shown in Statement No. 25 submitted by the Board. This is a very useful document. The Board propose to dispense with this return as the figures of each year can be easily added on to the Return in the Government Office so as to have a complete record of the transactions for a series of years. The Government do not agree in this view. It is not for the information of Government alone that such a Return is required. The Annual Report on the Settlement of Revenue is an important statistical document, and its usefulness will be much enhanced by the addition of the Return of the description in question. Having been once prepared the Return itself will give no trouble to the Board's Office, and the cost of re-printing it will be well repaid by the value which it is certain to give to each year's report.

SIR,

1. I am directed by the Board of Revenue to submit their Annual Report on the management of the Revenue of this Presidency in the past Fasli 1270, A. D. 1860-61, with the usual explanatory Statements as per accompanying list. The report has been delayed until the present time by the repeated reference to the Districts for the correctness of errors consequent on the first introduction of the new forms of account.

2. STATEMENT NO. 1. *Territorial changes.*—Prior to Fasli 1270, there were 244 Taluks in this Presidency including Madras, and also seven Taluks settled on the Oolungoo principle which were not hitherto entered in this Statement. In connection with the general revision of Revenue Establishments, these Taluks have been re-arranged and reduced to 160 Taluks. The new arrangement of Taluks has been every where adopted for the purposes of account from Fasli 1270, but in many cases the Taluks were not actually amalgamated, nor was the revised scale of Establishments actually adopted, because the introduction of the new Police had not been completed. In effecting the changes, the small and detached Taluk of Suttivade in North Arcot was transferred to the new Madras Collectorate, and a portion of the Chaitput Taluk of South Arcot was annexed to the District of North Arcot. Between Cuddapah, Bellary, Kurwool and Nellore, an interchange of villages took place, as also between Madura and Tinnevelly. These transfers will in a great measure explain the variations observable in the numbers of villages entered in columns 15 and 20 of Statement No. 1. In Ganjam and Tanjore however, there is an increase of 426 and 3,125 villages in the year under report, which arises in the former District from the inclusion of the joint rent villages in this return from which they were hitherto omitted, and in the latter District from the Mottafysal and Oelungoo villages being similarly included on this occasion.

3. *Permanent puttahs.*—Two fresh columns have been opened in the above return to show

what number of Puttahs are "Renewed" and "not Renewed;" the former comprising only fresh Puttahs issued in the year under report, and the latter showing the old

Puttahs which remained either quite unaltered, or were modified only by additional entries. Of a total of 20,68,233 Puttahs, it will be seen that about one-half of the Puttahs remained unchanged, and the proportion will no doubt be greater in the next year. The Board have reason to believe that the discontinuance of the old system of issuing a fresh Puttah every year is generally appreciated.

4. *Season.*—The season (as described in the Revenue Administration Report 1860-61) was generally unfavorable for agriculture. The opening of the year in May and June was promising, but in the subsequent months the fall of rain was very scanty, the early dry crops were deficient, and the cultivation depending on irrigation was seriously impeded. In the north-east monsoon with the exception of one heavy fall in October, it may be said that there were no rains, the slight showers which fell in November and December, having been very partial. The supply of water in the Tanks and in some of the river channels also being insufficient to bring the crops to maturity, many perished, and even under the Kistna anicut, the supply which at first was good fell off just as the Paddy was coming into ear. The wet cultivation in the Delta Taluks which had promised well, suffered seriously; but the benefits of the irrigation works connected with the anicut had been strongly felt in the earlier part of the season, as by their aid a plentiful supply of young paddy had been raised

6. Public health.—Disease in the form of Cholera, Fever and Small-pox prevailed more or less in all the Provinces except South Canara which appears to have enjoyed an un-

usually healthy season. The deaths from Cholera were most numerous in the Districts noted in the margin ; those from Fever were computed at 3,587 in the Godaverry District. Cattle suffered considerably for want of water and pasture.

for transplantations later in the year ; and without the supply of water afforded by the works, the year would in all probability have been one of great scarcity in this District. In the Godaverry channels the supply was generally good, and there were only partial complaints of a deficiency of water.

5. The rain fall in each District as compared with Fasli 1269 is shown in the margin. This Statement

7. On the subject of vaccination, the remarks of Government in paragraph 8 of their Proceedings, dated 22nd April 1861, No. 907, were communicated to the Collectors, and they were requested to exercise strict supervision over the vaccinators and have their Returns carefully scrutinized. The results for Fasli 1270, as now reported are entered in the margin ; the disproportion between successful and unsuccessful cases pointed out by Government is still observable in several Districts. The attention of the Collectors is however being given and will be again drawn to the subject with a view to the adoption of such measures as may be practicable to render the vaccination Returns more trustworthy and correct.

8. STATEMENT NO. 2 AND ITS ENCLOSURE A. Prices of grain.—Prices generally

ranged higher than in Fasli 1269. In that year, they showed a slight tendency to recede from the high standard they attained in the Fasli preceding it ; but in the year under report, they very nearly reached the level at which they stood in Fasli 1268. The prices of some of the principal grains as shown in the following table rose from 31 to 48 per cent. above the

average of the ten preceding years, and were 7 to 15 per cent. higher than the preceding year, Fasli 1269.

A large exportation of grain, and a generally scanty harvest have had their natural effect in maintaining the high prices in the grain market.

9. The pressure upon the laboring population in consequence was much felt notwithstanding the higher rate of wages, and the increased local demand for labor. This is shown in some degree by the number of emigrants to Ceylon from Tanjore, Madura, and Tinnevelly, which amounted to upwards of 50,000 people.

10. STATEMENT No. 3. *Ryots' Holdings.*—The area of land in occupation and entered in the Puttahs of the Ryots for the year under report was (excluding Canara and Malabar) 1,50,50,564 acres assessed at 3,10,03,264 Rupees, as shown in detail in Statement No. 3 of which the following is an abstract :—

More land was taken up than relinquished, owing it is believed in a great measure to the promising circumstances under which the season opened, and generally to the daily increasing desire for landed property consequent on reductions of assessment and high prices. The net area of occupancy shows thus an excess above the previous Fasli of Acres 4,09,068 ; but there

is a decrease in the assessment to the amount of Rupees 82,405, which is chiefly owing to the net assessment only, less the old permanent remission of 25 and 33 per cent. on the lands of Cuddapah being entered in the accounts of Fasli 1270, instead of the full survey assessment as heretofore

with several of the former years this item appears large. But still a larger amount of assessment on unsown land viz. Rupees 18,82,598 was charged to the Ryot which was 2,25,289 Rupees in excess of the land tax on waste charged in the preceding year.

The Board consider this result as affording satisfactory proof that the rule which requires the Ryot to pay the assessment of his entire holding except under circumstances beyond his control was not relaxed more than was really rendered necessary by the character of the season.

The increase in the dry lands, it is satisfactory to note, is chiefly in the Districts in which recent reductions in the land assessment have been made. In South Arcot, however, there was a decrease under the above head amounting to Rupees 1,25,663, which is to be accounted for chiefly by the reductions made in the rates of dry assessment under the Orders of Government, dated 28th September 1859.

13. A large decrease in the actual cultivation of the irrigated lands was to be expected owing to the large deductions in the occupancy claimable in consequence of the failure of water. But the decrease is not so large as might have been anticipated, being only 19,750 acres assessed at 2,19,410 Rupees. In several Districts there was in fact a considerable increase of cultivation of irrigated lands. The increase was 60,502 acres in seven Districts, and the decrease was 80,252 acres in nine Districts. But in every District except Bellary the cultivation of the second crop was considerably less than in the previous year resulting in a net decrease of 2nd crop assessment of 2,67,968 Rupees below the amount of the previous year's assessment for that crop. But it will presently appear that the cultivation of irrigated lands was prosecuted to an extent beyond the means for bringing the crops to maturity, as the large remissions for wet crops testify.

14. In the item "Additional Assessment" imposed on dry lands irrigated by water drawn from a Government source, there is a net increase of 55,101 Rupees, resulting from a gross decrease of 80,285 Rupees, and a gross increase of 1,35,386. The increase is mainly in the Godaverry District, where it amounts to 1,15,082 Rupees. In Bellary and South Arcot there is an increase of 8,026 and 8,903, and a trifling increase in other Districts. The increase under this head in the Godaverry is for the most part a transfer from the head of Fasal Jasty, or 2nd crop assessment under which it was erroneously entered in the preceding year.

15. STATEMENTS 6, 7 and 8. *Remissions.*—The remissions granted on what is termed the actual cultivation, amounting to Rupees 36,52,620 are shown in the subjoined abstract under the usual heads of classification in comparison with Fasli 1269:—

16. There is a large decrease however in the Kowle remissions amounting to Rupees 1,35,721, which occurs principally in the Kistna District where lands granted on Kowle in former years have been brought up to full assessment. The 2nd and 3rd heads of remissions need no remark.

a more extensive use of the Anicut water, but chiefly to the higher rates charged for the water to the Inamdars and Zemindars.

18. The receipts from Cochrane's canal hitherto omitted in the accounts rendered by the Collector of Madras to this office, and the collections previously made from Komeri Cutters in Canara and held in deposit pending the final decision of Government on the subject having been now carried to account, explain the increases under those heads. The decrease in the Revenues from the joint rent villages in Ganjam was occasioned, by the transfer of the item in Fasli 1270 from the usual head "Sundry Items" to its more appropriate place in Statement No. 4; the decrease in Amindevi Coir in Canara is owing to a smaller quantity of coir having been shipped for Calcutta.

19. STATEMENT No. 10.—In the settlement of the few Amani villages there is a falling off of Rupees 14,524, of which Rupees 11,859 is in Tanjore owing to the produce falling considerably short of that in Fasli 1269.

20. STATEMENT No. 11.—The cultivation of Sugar-cane, Cotton and Indigo shows a falling

Sugar-cane appears to have remained nearly stationary, and Indigo cultivation exhibited a large decline in Nellore and Kurnool, the adverse season having it is observed, seriously affected the growth of this product. The high prices of grain would also affect the cultivation of special products in some degree.

21. STATEMENT No. 12.—This Statement, which shows the average assessment per acre of lands cultivated in the field assessed Districts, does not call for any remark except perhaps to note that it has been prepared in the Fasli under report, more in accordance with the Board's instruc-

tions, and with one exception* the entries of cultivation in this Statement will be Tanjore found to tally exactly with those in the Return No. 4. The Board do not attach much importance to this Statement, as they cannot rely on its accuracy, for the areas are not to be trusted as correct, and practically without a knowledge of the different classes and properties of the soil and the various circumstances affecting them; a general average of this kind affords no just criterion of the comparative pressure of the Land tax on each District.

22. The settlement on the Ryotwary tenure has been for the most part reviewed in the foregoing remarks. The result of the entire Land Revenue Settlement will be now shortly noticed. It is composed of the following items:—

23. The Estates noted in the margin paying a Peishcush of Rupees 27,980 which formed part of the Collectofate of Tinnevelly were in the Fasli under report transferred to Madura, and there was an increase to that extent in the latter District and a corresponding decrease in the former, but this does not affect the total result.

24. Of the remaining items of land revenue, the variations under Ryotwar and Amani have been already explained. The decrease in the demand against Shotriem, &c., villages is due partly to the resumption of some of these for arrears of revenue and partly to the reduction made in the amount of their Jodi in compensation for lands taken up for public purposes; and as regards "Rents", the demand fluctuates according to the condition of the villages.

25. The items "Redemption of quit-rent on Inams" and "Sayer or Extra revenue" for May and June 1861, have been newly introduced into the accounts of this year. This was rendered necessary in order to follow the Budget classification of receipts adopted by the Accountant General in his new form of Treasury account from 1st May 1861. By this arrangement, the Forest revenue and certain other items of receipts hitherto included under land revenue were shewn for these two months under the distinct head of "Sayer" and the Extra revenue formerly a separate head with minor headings, is now included as a minor head under each of the major heads of Land, Abkarry, Moturpha, &c. The term Sayer no longer denotes the "Frontier Customs" but comprises the items of forest, and other revenues hitherto included under Extra revenue.

26. The Board directed the Collectors to follow the above classification in the accounts rendered by them to this Office, so that they might correspond with the returns furnished to the Accountant General; but they regret to observe that notwithstanding repeated orders on the subject, some Collectors have not as yet sent in the revised Statements called for, while others have but imperfectly attended to the instructions issued by the Board for their preparation. The endeavour to obtain correct returns has been the cause of the delay in the preparation of the accounts necessary to accompany this Report, but to wait longer for correct returns would further delay the despatch of the Report now so long over-due, that the Board have resolved to close the Statements in the best manner possible, partly from the materials furnished by the Returns received according to the usual forms, and partly from those contained in the revised Statements.

27. The Board consider the result of the Land Revenue Settlement more satisfactory than there was reason to expect from the character of the season, and there can be no doubt that but for the relief granted to the agricultural interests during late years by the reductions of assessment, and by the improved prices of agricultural produce, there would have been a much larger falling off of the Revenue.

28. The Settlement of the Sundry Sources of Revenue resulted in a net increase of Rupees 30,67,294 as shown in the annexed abstract :—

29. Of the increase under Abkarry, Rupees 81,956 occurred in the town of Madras, where this branch of Revenue is under the direct management of the Collector, the rest is in the Provinces where the Abkarry is farmed out. The transfer to the Revenue Department of the Military Abkarry farms of Vellore in North Arcot, and of Wellington in Coimbatore, accounts for the increase in those Districts. In the Kistna District, the Abkarry of the town of Masulipatam was included in the accounts of Fasli 1269 only from December of that year, from which time it was transferred to the Collector, while in the Fasli under report, the revenue of the entire year was brought to account.

30. STATEMENT No. 13—Moturpha.—The decrease under this head of Moturpha was due to the introduction of the Income tax, to which many who previously had been taxed to the Moturpha were now assessed. If the Income tax assessable on an individual was larger than the Moturpha hitherto paid by him, the whole was taken to the credit of the Income tax, and if smaller, the difference alone was credited to the Moturpha.

31. • Salt.—The transactions in the Salt Department are shown in detail in Statement No. 14, of which the subjoined is an abstract :—

It must be explained that the balance brought forward at the beginning of the Fasli under report was Indian Maunds 97,067, in excess of that shown by the accounts of Fasli 1269 to have remained at its close. The difference was a double deduction erroneously made in the accounts of this office so long back as Fasli 1265, as "loss by change of measurement" in Madura and Tinnevelly, but now included to make the balance tally exactly with what is shown in the Collector's Return, and which is declared to be the finally adjusted correct balance.

32. The character of the season was favorable to the manufacture of salt, which circumstance and the low state of the old store, contributed to a more extensive manufacture of the article, and though the sales were also larger during the year there remained at the close a supply equal to nearly two years' consumption.

The facility afforded by the Madras Railway for conveying salt into the interior has enabled (as the Collector observes) the Madras Cottars to compete at Salem with the salt brought only half the distance by the ordinary carriage from the pans in South Arcot. The quantity carried by the Railway from Madras was 5,77,500 Indian Maunds.

The increase in charges is accounted for partly by the larger amount paid in Fasli 1270 to the manufacturers not only for salt manufactured in the year, but also on account of sums due for salt made in the preceding year, and now adjusted partly in consequence of the much larger quantity of salt imported into Canara and Malabar; to the opening of new Cotaurs, and to the pay of the Salt Deputy Collectors and their establishments being debited to the salt charges in this year.

35. *Sea Customs.*—The net decrease of Rupees 1,09,379 under Fasli 1269..... 25,30,410 the head of Sea Customs was the result chiefly of a large falling off in the import duty at the port of Madras owing to a diminished importation of Cotton piece goods, metals, &c., and of an increase principally in Tanjore and Malabar caused by the operation of the new Tariff and the large importation into the former District of stores for the Great Southern of India Railway.

36. *Stamp Revenue.*—Owing to the operation of Act XXXVI of 1860, and the limitation prescribed by Act XIV of 1859, which was expected to come into force on the 31st May 1861, the amount realized by the sale of Stamps was very considerable and more than a hundred per cent. in excess of the year preceding, the new Law was in force from 1st October 1860, or during only three quarters of the Fasli under report.

37. *Income Tax.*—The delays and difficulties which attended the introduction of the Income tax have been already reported to Government. The total amount of assessment on incomes of all descriptions made in the provinces up to June 1861, amounted to Rupees 13,61,343.

The average for each District was about 68,000 Rupees, the highest assessment being in Bellary 1,50,000, the next in Vizagapatam 1,00,000, and the lowest was in North Canara 17,000 Rupees; to this the assessment made by the Special Commissioners at the Presidency Town, and by the Ex-Officio Assessors not included in the settlement accounts being added make a total of Rupees 22,01,760, as particularized in the margin.

38. *Extra Revenue and Interest Account.*—The change in the accounts noticed before in paragraph 25, accounts partly for the decrease in the extra Revenue. Besides this in Tanjore, the Revenue from the Mokassa villages of the late Raja for the previous years collected and kept in deposit up to Fasli 1269, was in that year brought to the credit of Extra Revenue, but no similar credit occurs in the Fasli under report. The decrease was however in great measure counterbalanced by a new item of receipt, viz., the proceeds of the Pearl Fishery in Tinnevelly amounting to Rupees 2,45,866, which was carried to account under this head, and the net result was therefore a decrease of Rupees 30,597 as shown in the margin. The increase under the head of "Interest Account" is too small to require comment.

As the revised form of the Demand, Collection and Balance Statement does not provide for the exhibition of the particulars of the Land Revenue balance under the distinct heads of "Permanently settled" and "Not permanently settled," the subsequent collections up to February 1862, and the balance remaining on that date under each of those heads respectively are omitted in Statement No. 18. By far the largest portion of the Land Revenue balance occurred in the Districts noted in the margin, and chiefly under the head of Ryotwar, &c., or not permanently settled. In the Godavery District, the balance consists principally of water tax imposed for the first time on lands classed as wet, but the irrigation of which, previous to the construction of the Anicut, was precarious, and of quit-rent newly imposed by the Inam Commissioner. Both items were expected to be shortly realized, and in regard to the latter, the delay was occasioned by the Registers not having been received from the Inam Commissioner till late in the year. The attention of the Collectors of the Kistna and Madras Districts will be drawn to the necessity of realizing their balances speedily. In the remaining Districts, the balances were small.

41. Adverting to paragraph 3 of the Order of Government, dated 6th June 1860, No. 1,178 Public Works Department, the Board beg to append a Statement showing the Demand, Collection and Balance of the whole Land Revenue of the Neilgherry Taluk for Fasli 1270. This information was not furnished by the Collector of Coimbatore in a complete shape in his Settlement Report for Fasli 1269, and was therefore omitted in the Board's report to Government for that year.

It will be seen that more than half the demand due by Europeans, East Indians and others on lands held by them for Coffee plantations and other agricultural purposes was still left uncollected three months after the expiration of the Fasli on account of which the demand was due. Similarly there was a large balance of no less than 45 per cent. in the item of quit-rent due by Europeans on properties belonging to them at the several stations on the Neilgherry Hills. Mr. Thomas has

explained in paragraphs 90 to 94 of his Settlement Report, the circumstances which in his opinion render the collection of revenue from Europeans more difficult and dilatory than from Natives, and recently he has again addressed the Board on the subject which is now under consideration in the Board's Office, and the result will in due course be communicated for the information of Government.

42. STATEMENTS 19 AND 20. *Demand, Collection and Balance of Arrears.*—The total amount of arrears under all heads on account of previous years amounted to Rupees 37,85,997 at the beginning of the Fasli under report. The collections and remissions during the year being deducted there remained a balance at its close of Rupees 6,20,020 which was reduced by further collections up to August 1861, to Rupees 5,53,330 consisting of the following items:—

Subsequently to August 1861, the monthly Statement of Demand, Collection and Balance received from the Collectors has been prepared according to a revised form following the new Budget classification referred to in paragraphs 25 and 26. The transactions up to August were exhibited in the returns of that month under the usual heads, but in the accounts for September, several sums were transferred from one head to another according to the new arrangement. Owing to these transfers it is found impracticable to ascertain correctly the collections under the several heads according to the old classification, though as regards the total balance, no such difficulty exists. The collections on account of arrears entered in Statement No. 20 have, therefore, been closed up to August 1861, instead of up to February 1862 as in the case of the current collections.

43. The collections between August 1861 and February 1862, on account of arrears under all heads, amounted to Rupees 51,954 which still further reduced the balance to Rupees 4,98,379 at this last date. Of this balance, a sum of Rupees 1,44,315-10-0 has been reported by the Collectors to be irrecoverable, and the remainder is either recoverable or doubtful and still under investigation.

The amount under the first head is the balance due by the Estates noted in the margin in the Godaverry District. The Proprietor of the first named Estate put forward a claim for remission in consequence of the Ellore canal having been taken through certain tanks in his Estate in Fasli 1269; in the other two Estates the balance occurred in consequence of a bund across a hill stream not having been repaired. These claims were investigated by the Collector and admitted.

45. Of the irrecoverable arrears under the second head, the largest portion is in the Godaverry and Tanjore Districts. In the former it consists chiefly of the water tax imposed in Fasli 1269, on certain lands on which a second crop had been raised, but which did not come to maturity, and certain other items which ought to have been struck out of the demand at the annual settlement,

but which was not done in consequence of the necessary examinations not having been made in time. The balance in Tanjore consists chiefly of the assessment on waste lands, perished crops and disputed Extra cultivation in Olungu villages as detailed in the margin. In the remaining Districts, the irrecoverable arrears are small. They have been

investigated by the Collectors at the last annual

The Board, therefore, request the sanction of Govern-

ment, for writing off the amount of irrecoverable arrears above shown amounting to Rupees 1,44,315-10-0 to the head of "Profit and Loss."

46. In communicating to the Collectors the Order of Government, dated 22nd April 1861, No. 907, their special attention was drawn to the remarks in paragraphs 22 to 25 on the subject of old arrears. The result was that in most cases these arrears were fully inquired into, during the Settlement of the Fasli under review, and orders were given for the prompt realization of such sums as were found to be fairly recoverable. The remainder consisting chiefly of balances irrecoverable from various causes has been either recommended for remission in the Collectors' Settlement Reports of the Fasli under review, or will form the subject of separate communications. To enable Government to understand clearly what progress has been made since October 1860, in the disposal of these old balances, a Statement is subjoined to show the balance outstanding on the 31st August last in each District, out of the arrears of each Fasli under the head of Land Revenue "Not permanently settled," to which the Statement is confined, as the bulk of the arrears appertains to this head only, and as the remarks of Government in their Order above quoted refer principally to this:—

47. If from the total arrears above shown, those of Fasli 1269 be deducted, there remains a balance of only Rupees 3,16,931 on the 31st August last on account of the arrears of all previous years, while on the 31st October 1860 the balance which was outstanding on the same account amounted to Rupees 7,28,499. The difference, viz., Rupees 4,11,568 consists of the collections and remissions made in the intervening period, and tends to show that the local officers have done much to meet the wishes of Government.

48. As regards the old balance of Faslis prior to Fasli 1257, it will be seen that the sum outstanding in the Kistna District is still very large. Almost the whole of this balance is due by certain Inams and Inam villages in the Zemindaries which have reverted to Government in the late Guntur District, the quit-rent of which is alleged to have been imposed or raised by the Zemindars since the permanent settlement, and is therefore objected to by the holders. The circumstances of these Inams were fully reported upon by the Inam Commissioner in his letter to Government, dated 10th October 1860, No. 369, and the Government in passing orders upon this report directed that all the arrears prior to Fasli 1269, should be remitted. With reference to this Order the Collector sent up to the Inam Commissioner so long back as May 1861, a Statement showing the particulars of these arrears which amount to Rupees 1,15,728-7-4, with a view to the final sanction of Government being obtained for writing the amount off from the accounts. The Board are not aware of any application having been as yet made by Mr. Taylor, and though he was requested to state whether he would wish the Board to apply for this sanction, no reply has been received from him. The remission of the above sum of Rupees 1,15,728, will still further reduce the balance under the head of "Not permanently settled" by nearly one-half.

49. On the subject of the arrears in Tinnevelly extending as far back as Fasli 1252, the Collector promises to submit a separate Report, which it is hoped will dispose of the greater portion of the balances in that District. The arrears in Tanjore include a balance of Rupees 9,132, on account of Fasli 1268, conditionally remitted in connection with the Olungu abolition, but retained in the accounts till the Mirassidars of certain villages consent to the conversion of those villages into Mottafysal. The Board would recommend that the Mirassidars be required to come to an immediate settlement of the question. The importance of an early settlement of the old arrears has been already impressed upon the Collectors, whose attention will be again specially drawn to the subject.

50. STATEMENT No. 21. *Receipts under all Heads.*—The collections current and arrears under all heads amounted to Rupees 5,74,72,980, within the Fasli under report, being in the aggregate Rupees 17,58,817, in excess of the year preceding as shown in the annexed abstract:—

Note.—The amount of Collections in Fasli 1270 inclusive of the Income Tax collected in the Madras Town is Rupees 5,81,63,684.

The causes of the increase and decrease have been already generally explained. The decrease of above 4 lacs of Rupees in the arrears collections is accounted for by the fact that the arrears

at the beginning of the Fasli under report were much smaller than those existing at the commencement of the previous year.

51. STATEMENT No. 22.—In the realization of the Land Revenue, coercive measures were adopted to a greater extent than in Fasli 1269. Process was issued against 27,837 defaulters for the recovery of an arrear of Rupees 2,35,325. The estimated value of property attached was Rupees 1,93,118, of which it was found necessary to sell property to the value of only Rupees 34,040, the rest of the amount due having been generally paid before the sale actually took place. The Districts of Madras and North Arcot were conspicuous for the largest number of defaulters, but by far the largest proportion of property sold for arrears was in Tanjore.

This increase occurs principally in the Godavery, Kistna, and Coimbatore Districts in the proportions noted in the margin, owing in the two former Districts to the payments made to the Zemindars of Nedadavole and Davarkota amounting to Rupees 2,20,156, and Rupees 1,08,320 respectively under the orders of Government, dated 3rd April 1861, No. 724, and 8th October 1860, No. 1,814, and in Coimbatore to the circumstance of a large portion of the advances made in previous years for working the Forests having been adjusted in the year under report and debited in the accounts. The management charges comprising the salaries of the Collectors, Establishments, and Saderward, &c., show an increase of Rupees 38,489, which is chiefly attributed to certain charges incurred in Fasli 1269 having been adjusted in Fasli 1270, and also to the inclusion of the Income Tax Establishment in the provinces which item did not occur in Fasli 1269.

53. As directed in paragraph 27 of the Order of Government, dated 22nd April 1861, No. 907, and in paragraph 2 of their Proceedings, dated 21st July 1860, No. 1,208, two Statements are forwarded Nos. 24 and 25, the former showing the demand, receipts and charges under all heads in each District in Fasli 1270, and the latter giving the same information for a series of years from Fasli 1250 to Fasli 1270 both inclusive. The Board are of opinion that in future years it will be sufficient to furnish a Statement for the Fasli to which the report refers, the totals in which can be added on to the Statement No. 25 now sent, so that the Government may have a complete record of the transactions of a series of years. The renewed preparation of this latter Statement every year, will involve the useless repetition of the same particulars, and the Board will, therefore, dispense with its submission from next year if the Government see no objection.

In these Districts, the holdings brought forward in Columns 2 to 9 will be found to differ from the entries in Columns 34 to 40 of the similar Return of Fusli 1269, owing to the circumstance that in Tanjore and Tinnevelly the practice of showing the cultivation of the year as the holding in the absence of the necessary details for the latter in the Olungu, &c., villages was in vogue till Fusli 1269; whereas in the year under report, these villages having been brought under the Mottafusul settlement the omission has been supplied and the holdings correctly and regularly entered. In Cuddapah, a large decrease will be observed in the Assessment Columns; the usual 1/rd, 1/4th, &c., remissions, hitherto included with the Assessment and deducted at the Jamabundy every year, having been now excluded from the Survey Assessment and the remainder alone shown agreeably to instructions.

S. Arcot Between the Districts which are bracketted together villages having been exchanged differences will be found in the holdings entered for each District as compared with what remained at the close of Fusli 1269; but the total of the Districts made from the entries in this Return will tally exactly with the total of the corresponding figures in the Return of Fusli 1269.
