# SETTLEMENT REPORT

OF

## G A N J A M.

1. I have the honor to report on the results of the Revenue Administration of this District during Fasli 1272, and to submit the usual annual Statements as per accompanying list.

2. I. SETTLEMENT. *Statement No. 1.*—The Goomsur Taluk and the Poobacondah and Moheri Divisions of the Berhampore Taluk were settled by myself at Russelcondah and Chetterpore, and the Itchapore Kundum of the latter Taluk by the Acting Senior Assistant, Captain Lane, at Itchapore. The Sub-division was settled by the Acting Principal Assistant, Captain Grove, at the stations noted in the margin.

3. II. VARIATIONS IN THE NUMBER AND TENURE OF VILLAGES.—The following remarks are in explanation of the variations in the tenures of villages in the Government Taluks for Fasli under notice as detailed in the margin. The increase in the total number of villages is the result of bringing to account for the first time 21 Khond hamlets, situated in the forests below the Ghats of the Goomsur Taluk.

4. *Ryotwar.*—To 774 villages under this head in Fasli 1271, 65 have been newly added, viz., 54 from the Joint rent, one from Annual rent, and ten from Rents for more than one year, thus raising the number of Ryotwary villages to 839.

5. *Joint Rent.*—The number of villages under this head in Fasli 1271 was 399, 54 of these have reverted to Ryotwary as above stated, and three are now classed as depopulated villages. In these villages the amount collected on account of Mango and Tamarind trees has hitherto figured as Revenue. These receipts are now credited under head of Topes. Thirteen villages have been added to this class, 12 from Annual rents, and 1 from Rents for more than one year, together with 21 Khond villages already mentioned. The number of Jointly rented villages is thus reduced to 376.

6. *Annual Rents.*—Of the 14 villages classed under this head in Fasli 1271, one reverted to Ryotwar, and 12 to Joint rent, leaving but one village.



7. *Rents for more than one year.*—There were 38 villages under this head in Fasli 1271, of these ten have become Ryotwar, and one has been leased out on Joint rent. The total number is therefore reduced to 27.

8. The causes for the increase under the head "Depopulated villages," in which there is no Jeroyari cultivation, have been explained in paragraph 5.

9. In 23,318 Puttahs no alterations were made. 3,946 Puttahs were altered in consequence of changes in the Ryots' holdings, and 3,123 fresh Puttahs were granted for holdings in villages newly brought under Ryotwar, and for newly cultivated lands to persons who hitherto held no Puttahs.

10. III. SEASON AND SANITARY STATE OF THE DISTRICT.—Rain fell copiously, but not in excess up to the latter part of September when there was a very heavy fall throughout the District, causing some damage to the irrigation works and paddy fields, and rendering rivers and even smaller streams impassable for days together. Wrecks also occurred on the coast. Again, from 20th to 24th October, there were heavy and disastrous floods throughout the District. Many tanks breached. Injelly bridge was washed away, and paddy lands inundated to a depth of from 5 to 10 feet; the bridges on the road between Ganjam and Chetterpore were hidden for two days, and the whole of the paddy flat between Injelly and Ganjam for about 15 miles was a sheet of water, the villages scattered about it suffering more or less from the effects of the flood. At Chicacole much damage was done to houses, the streets of the town having been under water for three days. No such floods have been known in the District within the memory of living inhabitants.

Happily these formidable inundations occasioned no loss of life, and but a few cattle perished, though the peril of whole villages was imminent. Paddy and Sugar-cane crops both suffered from being submerged, but not so severely as might have been expected, and the harvests both on dry and wet lands were on the whole good. The yield of Gingely seed was large. This seed occupies a prominent place among the staple export of this District. Its cultivation is under increase in reference to the enhanced demand in European markets, where it is said to be largely used in making salad oil.

11. During the Fasli under review cholera and small-pox prevailed to some extent. There

were 1,058 cases of cholera, of which 693 were fatal; and 1,019 of small-pox, of which 198 were fatal. Loss of cattle from murrain was great. 1,406 head of cattle are said to have died. On the whole, however, the season was healthy. The marginal table shows the result of vaccination. I do not consider it trustworthy.

12. IV. PRICES OF GRAIN.—The prices of all sorts of staple produce were high as has been usual of late.

13. V. RYOTS' HOLDINGS. *Statement No. 3.*—From Enclosure B of this Statement it will

be seen that the Cist of lands given up and transferred from one Ryot to another amounts to Rupees 11,412, and that of lands taken up by Ryots amounts to Rupees 30,486 as detailed below :—

14. It will be seen that none of the above items require particular notice.

15. *Statement No. 6.*—During the year under review 1,698 Acres of land, subject to a Cist of Rupees 2,971, were taken on Progressive Cowle against 1,709 Acres with a Cist of Rupees 2,447 in the preceding year. 137 Acres of land, bearing a Cist of Rupees 167, were abandoned owing to the inability of the Cowle holders to bring the land under cultivation. The entire extent held on Progressive Cowle up to the close of the Fasli under notice was 8,334 Acres, subject to a Cist of Rupees 12,423.

16. VI. ACTUAL CULTIVATION.—The following is the table showing the actual Cultivation during Fasli under report:—

It will be found that there is an increase of 12,731 Acres, bearing a Cist of Rupees 26,007 in the actual Cultivation as compared with the results of the preceding Fasli.

17. VII. WASTE CHARGED AND REMITTED.—From the Enclosure C of Statement No. 3 it will be found that no assessment was remitted on account of waste, and that an assessment of Rupees 1,279 was charged on waste kept for pasturage.

18. VIII. REMISSION. *Statement No. 4.*—A remission of Rupees 2,211 was granted during Fasli under notice, of which Rupees 2,044 are only nominal, being the quasi remission on lands held on Cowle. Rupees 167 was on account of 88 Acres thickly covered by sand in seven villages of the Goomsur Taluk during the heavy floods of October last. The Sari remission of 195, usually granted in certain villages of the Chicacole Taluk, has been permanently discontinued.

19. *Statement No. 5.*—It will be found from this Statement that no remission was granted on account of withered crops during the year under notice.

20. IX. SUNDRY ITEMS.—The increase under the head Cuttoobady is Rupees 33-5-0, Rupees 7-5-0 being Cuttoobady of an Inam restored under the orders of the Board of Revenue, dated the 13th September 1862, No. 1,986, and Rupees 25, being that of Mooktamali Jamadayepur, a hamlet under the village of Chongóode Bhudra Nowgaum in the late Bramanachayee estate of the Berhampore Taluk. This Inam was continued under the orders of the Board of Revenue, dated the 23rd January 1858, No. 327, with the Cuttoobady of the above sum, but owing to a mistake in the order issued by the then Collector, this Cuttoobady was never levied from the Inam holders. This mistake having been since discovered, the Cuttoobady has been levied with arrears, the latter being carried to the credit of Sevoy Jumnah. From the above increase of Rupees 32-5-0, Rupees 4-8-0 will have to be deducted on account of the Cuttoobady of two Inams resumed, one on the dismissal of a Sumastanum Naigue in the Goomsur Taluk, and the other on the desertion of a certain Inamdár in the Chicacole Taluk, thus leaving a net increase of Rupees 27-13-0.

21. The increase under Government Plantations and Chayroot, amounting to Rupees 180 and Rupees 2 respectively, arises from the promise of the season.

22. The blank under the head of Fishery is the result of the abolition of this impost.

23. The total increase in Inam Teerwajasty is in consequence of the levy of 2 Rupees per Acre on Inam dry lands irrigated by water from Government sources.

24. X. SPECIAL PRODUCTS. *Statement No. 7.*—The decrease in the extent and Cist of land cultivated with Sugar-cane and Cotton, is chiefly attributable to the Ryots in the Government Taluks having betaken themselves to the cultivation of Gingely and other crops, which are supposed to be more remunerative and less laborious; also to the non-receipt from most of the Zemindars in the principal Division of the returns of lands cultivated with these products. I think it useless to call upon the Zemindars for these Statements as they are not trustworthy, and never punctually rendered.

25. A small extent of land was for the first time cultivated with Indigo in a village of the Chicacole Taluk, and Mr. Minchin also introduced its cultivation experimentally in the compound of the Aska Factory with advantage.

26. XI. LAND REVENUE. *Statement No. 10.*—The subjoined table shows the General results of Land Revenue Settlement compared with Fasli 1271 :—

There is a difference of 25 Rupees in the items of Ryotwar and Shrotriern Jodigee, &c., as shown in the Statement of Demand, Collection, and Balance for June 1863, and the Jama-bundy Statements, which is in consequence of the Cuttoobady of Mooktamali Jamadayepuram, the hamlet alluded to in paragraph 20 of this report, having been carried to the credit of Shrotrierns Jodigee in the Statement of Demand, Collection, and Balance under the impression that it was an Inam village; whereas it should have been credited to Ryotwar as Cuttoobady of an Inam land belonging to the Jeroyati village of Cheregoodebhudra Nowgaum.

27. The decrease in the Rents for more than one year is due to the transfer of several villages from this to other heads, to the exemption of the Cist of  $32\frac{1}{2}$  Rupees on 23 Acres of land cultivated with Cotton under the orders of the Board, dated the 14th December 1861, No. 7,004, and of 8 Annas on account of a small piece of land occupied by Police huts.

28. The decrease under the head Annual Settlement is referrible to the first cause given in the preceding paragraph.

29. The increase in Ryotwar is owing chiefly to certain villages having been added to this head, during the Fasli under report, to the discovery (by measurement) of excess in Ryots' holdings in the Berhampore and Goomsur Taluks; also to the extension of the minimum rates of 1 and 2 Rupees per acre to dry and wet lands hitherto held at still lower rates of Cist, to waste lands having been newly brought under cultivation, and to Progressive Cowle land reaching full assessment.

30. The causes of increase in "Miscellaneous" are given in paragraph 58 of this Report.

31. The total decrease in Sayer is due to the transfer to the head "Land Revenue Miscellaneous" of the items which composed it.

32. The increase in Forest Revenue is apparent from the forests of this District having yielded a Revenue for the first time to the General Treasury during the year under notice, the receipts from this source having been hitherto carried to the credit of Jungle Conservancy, forming part of Local Funds.

33. XII. SUNDEY SOURCES OF REVENUE. *Abkarry*.—The decrease of Rupees 45 is the result of the discontinuance of the collection of fees for granting licenses for the sale of European liquors, in reference to the correspondence noted in the margin.

34. The increase in Miscellaneous is owing to the large balance on which the interest was charged during the year under notice.

35. *Miscellaneous Interest on Arrears of Revenue, and Refunds of Charges, &c.*—The total decrease under this head is the result of the transfer to "Land Revenue" and "Abkarry," Miscellaneous, of the items which composed it.

36. *Moturpha*.—The total decrease under this head is owing to the abolition of this branch of Revenue.

37. *Salt*.—The decrease in the balance of Salt (which includes also the quantity destroyed owing to its inferior quality) is the result of increased sales during the Fasli under notice.

38. The increase in storage (which includes 1,670 Maunds of Swamp Salt from Nowpadah, &c.) is due to nearly the whole of the quantity of Salt manufactured having been stored within the close of Fasli; whereas 1,18,180 Maunds were left unstored at the close of the Fasli immediately preceding it.

43. *Sea Customs.*—The decrease under this head is chiefly owing to the diminution of exports of dutiable goods.

44. The trifling decrease under Miscellaneous calls for no remark.

45. *Stamps.*—The small increase in this head is due to the operation of provisions of Act X of 1862 having affected the sales of that year very favorably.

46. The decrease in Miscellaneous is owing to the smaller amount of penalties levied during the Fasli under notice.

47. *Income Tax.*—The decrease under this head is chiefly the result of the abolition of this impost on incomes below 500 Rupees, under Act XVI of 1862.

48. The trifling increase in Miscellaneous calls for no remark.

49. XIII. ABSTRACT OF LAND AND SUNDRY SOURCES OF REVENUE.—Subjoined is an

The decrease in "Permanently settled" is chiefly due to certain proprietors of estates having paid a small portion of their Peshcush subsequent to the close of Fasli under report.

50. The increase in "Not permanently settled" is partly referrible to the reasons assigned in paragraph 29, and partly to the collection of arrears outstanding against the Moheri Khundum of the Berhampore Taluk.

51. The variations in "Sayer or Extra Revenue," "Miscellaneous," and "Forest Revenue," are attributable to the reasons given in paragraphs 31, 58 and 32.

52. The increase in Abkarry arises chiefly from the collections of arrears outstanding at the beginning of Fasli under notice. For the increase in "Miscellaneous," *vide* remarks given in paragraph 34.

53. The causes of variations under the heads "Miscellaneous Interest on Arrears of Revenue and Refunds of Charges, &c.," "Moturpha," "Salt," "Sea Customs," "Stamps," and "Income tax," have been explained in paragraphs 35, 36, 41, 43, 45 and 47.

54. XIV. SEVOY JUMMA, RYOTWAR SUNDRY ITEMS.—The causes of variations in the items shown under "Ryotwar Sundry items" have been given in paragraphs 20 to 23. There are no Dasbundum Inams in this District, and the Jodi on personal and service Inams cannot be distinguished as there have been several alterations since the Inam accounts were taken in Fasli 1259. They will be duly distinguished in the accounts of the current Fasli 1273. No new Jodi has as yet been fixed by the Inam Commissioner. The particulars composing the other items have been duly detailed at the foot of the Statement.

55. Under orders of the Board dated the 19th June last, No. XLIX, Board No. 3,635, the items of Quit-rent, and rent of Topes and Chayroot, and Inam Teerwajasty ought to have been shown under "Land Revenue Miscellaneous," instead of "Ryotwar Sundry items;" but these items having been included as usual under the head "Ryotwar," in all the accounts rendered to the Accountant General, long before the receipt of these instructions, they have not been followed in the accounts of the Fasli under notice. This will be done in the accounts from the current Fasli 1273.

56. As under the recent instructions above quoted, the Ryotwar Sundry items, which are detailed in the 2nd page of the Statement No. 4, again occur in the first part of the new form of Statement No. 9. I beg to know whether they cannot be conveniently omitted in the 2nd page of the Statement No. 4.

57. *Land Revenue Miscellaneous.*—The decrease in the 1st item is due to a small extent of land brought to account subsequent to the close of Jamabundy Settlement during Fasli under notice, and that in the 50th item is because the bribes tendered to public servants, and the sale proceeds of Tigers' skins, &c., have been carried to credit under a separate head under the orders of the Accountant General.

58. The increase in the 12th, 39th, 41st, 44th to 47th items is chiefly the result of credit to the first mentioned item of the surplus proceeds of the produce of inams attached to certain village offices, the duties of which are conducted by Gomastahs on fixed pay; to the charge of interest on payment of kists made by some of the Zemindars and proprietors of estates after the prescribed dates; to the increase in the revenues of estates under management of the Court of Wards; to the numerous fines imposed upon villagers of the Kimeddy estate (where demarcation and survey is now under progress) for disobedience of orders regarding the erection of boundary pillars; to the adjustment of the salary of the First Assistant Superintendent of Revenue Survey in charge of the Survey party in Kimeddy, which was at first erroneously charged to Government instead of to the estate; to the receipt of a large amount in excess of the fixed demand; and to the credit to this head, under orders of Accountant General during Fasli under notice, of contributions by the Zemindar of Vizianagram and certain Mokhasadam, which were formerly credited to Public Works.

59. The small increase in the 3rd item requires no remark.

60. *Forest Revenue.*—The total increase in Seigniorage on timber is the result of the transfer to the Conservator of Forests of the Goomsur and Suradah forests from October last.

## 61. XV. DEMAND, COLLECTION, AND BALANCE OF ALL SOURCES OF CURRENT REVENUE.—

Of the balance of Rupees 581 under "Permanently settled," Rupees 570 have been subsequently realized.

62. Of the balance of Rupees 2,966, which remained at the close of Fasli under "Not permanently settled," Rupees 1,669 have been subsequently realized, and the remainder will shortly be collected.

63. Of the balance under "Miscellaneous," viz, Rupees 188, being interest on arrears of Peshcush of certain Zemindary and proprietary estates, Rupees 58 have been subsequently collected, and the remainder will shortly be realized.

64. The balance of Rupees 8,314, under Abkarry Revenue, has been subsequently reduced to Rupees 57, and for the recovery of which necessary steps have been taken.

65. Of the balance of Rupees 4,105, under the head "Income tax," Rupees 2,122 have been subsequently collected, and the remainder is expected to be collected at an early period.

66. XVI. DEMAND, COLLECTION, AND BALANCE OF ALL SOURCES OF ARREARS OF REVENUE.—The following is an Abstract showing the Demand, Collection, and Balance of all sources of the Arrears of Revenue, at the close of Fasli under Report :—

Of the old balance of Rupees 2,765, remaining uncollected at the close of the Fasli under report, Rupees 57 have been collected up to the end of August last, leaving a balance of Rupees 2,708, of which Rupees 2,048 have now been recommended for remission, and for the recovery of the remaining sum of Rupees 660, necessary measures will be adopted.

The balance against Ryotwar, Joint Rents, Rents, Cuttoobady, and Moturpha of the Berhampore Taluk, viz., Rupees 2,010-2-8, arises from the causes herein under enumerated:—Death, desertion, and poverty of certain Zeroyeti and Moturpha Ryots; Renters and Inamdars, whose Inams have been subsequently resumed; the desertion of a Curnum, who appropriated to his own use certain collections made by him; deficits discovered in the extent of Zeroyeti holdings and Inams; the fact of certain Zeroyeti and Inam lands having been taken up for roads, and submerged from extensive repairs of tanks; loss of crop; lands left waste; retention in the demand of Cuttoobady of certain Inams which was originally kept under sequestration, and subsequently resumed; Cist having been erroneously fixed on a certain Service Inam; grant on Cist through an oversight of the burning ground of a certain village; error in the calculation of the demand; a small piece of disputed land between a Zeroyeti and Inam village having been awarded to the latter; and also the Cist of a resumed Inam having been credited to Sevoy Jummah through an oversight.

68. The balance against Ryotwar and Cuttoobady of the Chicacole Taluk, viz., Rupees 37-9-11, is owing to the poverty of a certain Ryot; to a disputed piece of land between a Zeroyeti village, and a proprietary estate having been awarded to the latter; and to an Inam land having been taken up for a road.

Under these explanations, I trust the Board will be pleased to obtain the sanction of Government for writing off the account the above sum of Rupees 2,047-12-7.

69. The balance of arrears of Revenue against Extra Revenue, which was left uncollected, owing to the poverty of the Ferry renter of Ganjam for Fasli 1269, viz., Rupees 47-2-8, has been omitted from the Jummabundy Statements, under orders of the Board dated the 1st April 1863, No. 1,974.

70. XVIII. COERCIVE PROCESS.—Coercive process in the collection of Revenue was employed only in 15 cases of the Goomsur Taluk, as detailed in the margin.

71. XIX. CHARGES.—The increase in Collector's salary, &c., is owing to the charge during Fasli under notice of five months' allowances, and pay of Captain Marshall as 1st Assistant District



Engineer, Nellore, and as Captain in Madras Staff Corps, and of two months' deputation allowance of the Principal Assistant Collector.

72. The increase in fixed and extra tentage, and house and office rent, is because the arrears of the previous Fasli having been disbursed during Fasli under report.

73. The decrease in Hoozoor and District Establishment is due to the complete revision of Establishment according to Mr. Pelly's scheme.

74. The increase in Saderward and Extra Revenue, or Miscellaneous, is referrible to the contingent nature of the latter charge.

75. The increase in Medical Revenue Charges is the effect of the debit to this head, during the year under review, of eleven months' salaries of the Medical Officers attached to Revenue Department; whereas only two months' salaries were charged to this head in the preceding Fasli.

76. The total increase in Forest Revenue is because there was no Forest establishment in Fasli 1271.

77. The causes for the variations in the several items of Salt have been given in the column of Remarks of the Statement No. 17.

78. The increase in the Hoozoor and District Establishment, Saderward and Extra Charges of Sea Customs, is owing to the recent revision of Establishment.

79. The increase in Drawback is referrible to the circumstance of there having been no such charge during Fasli 1271.

80. The decrease in Hoozoor and District Establishment, under Stamp charges, is the effect of the abolition of the post of Stamp Darogah from the second half of Fasli 1271, and the trifling decrease under Contingent charges requires no remark.

81. The increase in commission to Vendors is referrible to the increased sale of Stamps, and the decrease in Refunds of duty is in consequence of the comparatively small number of withdrawals of suits during Fasli under report.

82. The decrease in the Establishment under Income Tax is the effect of the reduction of Establishment, and the same in Extra Charges requires no remark.

83. The increase in "Refunds" is because of the grant of refunds to certain individuals under orders of the Board, dated the 21st April 1863, No. 2,290.

84. XX. WORKING OF THE SYSTEM OF VILLAGE ACCOUNTS.—The new system of Village accounts has already been fully brought into operation, except in some villages of Goomsur and Moheri Kundum of the Berhampore Taluk, as stated in my last Jummaundy Report.

85. XXI. BRIEF REFERENCE TO THE REGISTER OF LANDS ACQUIRED BY PUBLIC SERVANTS.—A new Register of lands held by public servants is under preparation, and will be shortly transmitted to the Board.

1. I have the honor to submit the Annual Report on the Land Revenue, and Extra Sources of this District, for Fasli 1272 (A. D. 1862-63), together with the prescribed Statements.

2. I. VILLAGES AT WHICH THE SETTLEMENT WAS MADE.—Of the Government Taluks, Palconda continues on rent to Messrs. Arbutnot and Co., and Narsipatam forms the charge of the Principal Assistant, who made the Settlement at the places noted below :—

The number of Pattahs issued is 3,299, being an increase of 291 in the year. Of the gross number, only 314 were renewed, particulars of which are given in the margin.

4. III. SEASON AND SANITARY STATE OF THE DISTRICT.—The season has been favorable. In the Taluk of Narsipatam there was a partial failure of rain in the paddy transplanting season, but the crops turned out good and abundant. The average rain-fall in the Taluk was 32 $\frac{7}{10}$ ths inches. In the District it

was 31  $\frac{4\frac{1}{2}}{10}$ ths inches as shown in the margin.

It will be observed that this Statement is prepared as directed for the months named by the Board in their Miscellaneous Circular No. LXIX, Board's No. 3,635.

5. The District has been remarkably healthy during the year.

6. In my report for Fasli 1271, I brought to notice the want of vaccine lymph in Narsipatam. This and other complaints from the Principal Assistant, who takes great interest in vaccination, led the Civil Surgeon to inspect the southern portion of the District. The following

Extract from his Annual Report is hereto appended, showing the good results of this inspection:—

“ From 1st July 1862 to 30th June 1863, 11,786 cases are reported, of which 11,803 were “ successful. The above number shows a steady “ increase\* upon previous year.”

“ I inspected the Vaccinators in the southern portion of the District early in the year. The “ lymph appeared good, but the Vaccinators were able to produce very few subjects for inspection. “ Since my visit to them the returns have increased showing that my appearance amongst them “ produced good results.”

“ The inhabitants of the plains appear anxious to secure the benefits of vaccination, but Ooriah “ inoculation is still practised to a great extent near the hill ranges.”

“ Two Vaccinators have been promoted to 1st Class, five to 2nd Class, and four fresh 3rd “ Class Vaccinators have been appointed to complete the establishment to its full strength, as “ desired by the Acting Collector and Government Agent. Two more Vaccinators are required, “ and Volunteers are being instructed to fill these vacancies.”

“ The Vaccinators still complain that the Sub-Magistrates do not give their hearty assistance, “ this may be the case, but I am inclined to think that they are too willing to counter-sign the “ Returns of the Vaccinators without inquiring into the truth thereof. A good plan for checking “ these Returns has lately been introduced at the suggestion of the Principal Assistant Agent.”

“ The Vaccinator is made to keep a Register in which the name, age, place of residence, “ &c. of those vaccinated is entered; the Register is counter-signed by the Sub-Magistrate, and sent “ in with the Return; the return of course may still be falsified, but the Sub-Magistrate has it in his “ power to find out the truth without much trouble.”

“ Small-pox has prevailed in the northern portion of the District, and several Vaccinators “ have been sent there. I am sorry that circumstances have hitherto prevented my inspecting “ the Vaccinators in that direction, but I intend to pay a visit there as soon as I can find any “ Medical Officer sufficiently disengaged to attend to my Hospitals, &c. a few days.”

8. V. RYOTS' HOLDINGS.—Lands bearing a Sist of Rupees 2,757 were relinquished during the year. Of these lands yielding Rupees 2,235-8-9 were taken up by other Ryots, other lands previously given up and bearing a Sist of Rupees 442-10-7 were this year re-occupied; and a sum of Rupees 839-11-6 hitherto written off as "Nagad Maf" was this year realized.

The difference in the Statement, or 35,628 Acres, is owing to the rate of conversion from Visams and Garces to Acres having been changed as already reported to the Board in my Administration Report, dated 12th May last, paragraph 5.

10. VII. WASTE CHARGED AND REMITTED.—The amount charged under this head in Fasli 1272 was Rupees 9,416-6-4. Of this sum, the small amount of Rupees 71-10-6 was remitted on account of certain lands having been inundated by the overflow of the lake at Komaravole, and the cultivators having no other means to pay.

11. VIII. PARTICULARS OF REMISSION.—Under this head nothing has been granted in this year.

17. The decrease on the year amounts in all to Rupees 38,445.

That in Salt is owing, as the Acting Salt Deputy Collector reports, to two causes firstly to the continued want of roads (some of these are being constructed) connecting the pans with the interior; and secondly to the fact that last year, Cholera breaking out at the Vomaravilli pans in Ganjam, diverted the Bunjary trade of those pans to this District.

The Income tax decrease is owing to the abolition of the two per cent. tax on all incomes above two and below 500 Rupees.

In Sea Customs the decrease is Rupees 4,987, which is owing to a falling off in exports at Bimlipatam in Gingely and Valisalu seeds,

# SETTLEMENT REPORT

OF THE

## GODAVERY DISTRICT.

---

1. **SUBMITTING REPORT AND ACCOUNTS.**—I have the honor to submit my Report on the Settlement of this District for Fasli 1272 (1862-63), accompanied by the Annual Statements prepared in the usual forms.

2. As I joined the District after the completion of the Jummaundy, I can say nothing from personal observation; and I will, therefore, confine myself to such remarks as the usual Statements seem to demand.

3. **NEW ARRANGEMENT OF TALUKS.**—The arrangement of the Taluks according to Mr. Pelly's scale was fully completed during the year. There were formerly sixteen Taluks in the District there are now nine.

4. **OFFICERS BY WHOM SETTLEMENT WAS MADE.**—Statement No. 1 shows the Officers by whom, and the places at which the Settlement was made. Mr. Purvis conducted the settlement of the two Taluks under his immediate charge, as well as the two of the Head Assistant Collector, and one of the two in the Deputy Collector's

range, the former Officer\* having been appointed to act as Sub-Collector of the Kistna District, and the latter† having been away on leave.

The remaining Taluk, viz., Ellore, in charge of

each Taluk has been made within its limits, and at the localities that best suited the convenience of the Ryots, except two villages§ of the Tanuku Taluk in the Sub-division. As several accounts of these two large villages were not prepared in time during the Sub-Collector's stay in the same Taluk, they were deferred and settled at Nursapore, to which place the Ryots could most conveniently repair.

5. **DISTRIBUTION OF PUTTAHS.**—The District is partly under the Joint rent, and partly under the Ryotwary system. In accordance with the order of Government, under date the 24th June 1861, No. 1,231, the permanent settlement was introduced into the Western Delta Taluks of the Sub-division. Of the 16,331 Puttahs entered at the bottom of the Statement No. 1, 15,413 are the individual Puttahs distributed in the Sub-division, and 76 in the principal Division. One hundred and sixteen Puttahs were not renewed as no material change was required, and the remaining 726 were given to the single and joint rent villages.

6. **VARIATIONS IN THE NUMBER AND TENURE OF VILLAGES.**—The number of villages remained unaltered: 240 villages which were entered under Joint rent up to Fasli 1271 have been converted into Ryotwary, and four hitherto under Joint rent were in the year under report rented out to single individuals. The fresh Puttahs distributed in the Sub-division are not in a permanent form, and a good many of them will require renewal during the ensuing Jummaundy, because the assessment of the Ryots entered in the Puttahs of the year under



report will be increased for Fasli 1273, with reference to the gradual imposition of the assessment

as ordered in paragraph 2 of the Government Order,\* and as the system should be experimental as mentioned in paragraph 1 of the above order.

7. SEASON AND CROP.—It was on the whole a favorable season, and there was no obstruction to the usual agricultural operations. The rains were deficient at the early part of the season, consequently the cultivation in the upland Taluks and under the river Yelair was not carried on to its full extent. The Godavery rose as high as 25 feet, and the supply of water from the annicut channels was abundant. The cultivation in the Delta Taluks was carried to a considerable extent, and yielded a fair return; but in some villages of the Delta Taluks, the wet crops were reported to have suffered a little from unseasonable winds. The yield of the early dry crops, both in the upland and Delta Taluks, was good. The first crop of Gingely-oil seed and Jonna was slightly injured by the heavy rains in September and October. In the following months the rains were moderate. The cultivation of the summer Gingely-oil seed under the influence of the annicut water was good, and the yield most profitable. The cultivation and yield of Cotton was much greater than in the preceding year, especially in the upland Taluks. The cultivation of Tobacco, Indigo, Bengal gram and Horse gram was carried on to its full extent, and the yield of the second crop Paddy cultivation was good. The Ellore canal was closed for repairs for a certain period in the early part of the season, and consequently the first crop and Dalwa cultivations under that canal were not carried on properly. Sugar-cane was extensively cultivated by means of the annicut water; but the Ryots have not derived the profits which they expected, because the price fell after the manufacture of the Jaggery, owing to

diminished demand. Sugar-cane has been this year cultivated in parts where it has not been hitherto attempted, and the Ryots seem to be very anxious to extend this branch of agriculture wherever the annicut water is available. They generally realize a very good profit from it, as the expenses for cultivation have been much reduced.

8. RAIN-FALL.—The fall of rain in each month from April 1862 to March 1863, taking the average of the whole District, is exhibited in the margin. The total fall is below that of the previous year by about nine inches.

9. SANITARY CONDITION.—The sanitary condition of the District during the Fasli under report was good. The greater number of deaths by cholera were in the Taluk of Ellore. The mortality amongst the cattle† is much below that in the preceding year. The epidemic appeared in a very mild form.

10. VACCINATION.—The number of persons vaccinated in the year under report was 10,07:1 the number returned as successful is

7,590, and as unsuccessful is 2,481, being nearly equal to the number in the preceding Fasli.

11. PRICE.—Statement No. 2, showing the prices of grain is discontinued, as directed by the Board of Revenue, in paragraph 4 of their Proceedings of 19th June 1863, No. 3,635. The price of paddy and grain of all kinds is steadily rising. The average price of paddy during the

time of harvest was between 15 and 20 Rupees, and in other seasons was 25 Rupees a putty or candy. This dearness presses hard on those who subsist on fixed salaries. The cultivators, who form the large majority of the population, are well off, and make considerable profits. Neither is the scarcity felt by agricultural labourers, as they are paid in grain, and the amount given has also largely increased owing to the paucity of day labourers, now that the cultivation in the District has been so considerably extended. The rate of hire for labourers, artificers, and other workmen is increased to more than double the rate which was paid in former years. The rise in prices is attributable, I think, to the demand for labour, to the increase of commerce, and to the improvement in the condition of the agricultural population.

land by the new Survey, and a large reduction has resulted in the land assessment according to the revised rates. The water tax has been excluded from the entries in this Statement.

13. SETTLEMENT.—The Taluk of Undi in the Sub-division has been completely brought under the Settlement. The greater part of the Tanuku Taluk, and nearly two-thirds of the Nurusapore Taluk have also been brought under its influence. The extent of land relinquished by the former holders, compared with the results of Fasli 1271, appears very large, and calls for explanation. On the introduction of the Survey assessment, Ryots gave up their lands to a larger extent than in the previous year under joint rents, owing to the change in the assessment consequent on the Survey, and took up other lands which suited them better.

14. TRANSFERS OF LAND FROM ONE HEAD TO ANOTHER.—Transfers of land from dry into wet, and other heads according to the settlement classification, had to be effected by deduction from one head and addition to the other. The increase in the area by Survey has been added, and the decrease deducted.

15. ACTUAL CULTIVATION.—The actual cultivation amounted to Acres 3,84,937, bearing an assessment of Rupees

13,13,000, or Acres 6,572 with an assessment of Rupees 1,78,009 above the preceding year. The cultivated area is partly according to the Survey, and partly according to the Village accounts.

The great decrease, especially in the extent of "Dry," and "Dry converted into Wet" and "Gar-

den," and the great increase in the extent of "Wet," is chiefly owing to the fact that land

entered as Dry in the accounts of Fasli 1271 has been entered as Wet, according to the Settlement Registers in which water tax has been imposed on every field that has ever been irrigated since the opening of the channels, and upon the whole of a field, even though a part only may have been watered in conformity with paragraphs 2 and 6 of the Water Tax rules.

16. REMISSIONS.—Statement No. 4 exhibits particulars of remissions, the results of which are compared below :—

The decrease of Rupees 18,346, under the head of Occasional remissions, is the result of a gross decrease of Rupees 20,777, and a small increase of Rupees 2,431. The former is principally owing to remissions on account of the great damage occasioned by the floods in Fasli 1271, and the latter is due to remission granted for withered crops, and for lands covered with salt water, as well as to an increase in the remissions granted for waste lands.

The decrease of Rupees 27,187, under the head of Customary remissions, has resulted from the discontinuance of the usual allowances to Religious institutions, Village Establishments, and Vernacular schools, consequent on the introduction of the new settlement in the Sub-division.

Sundry items have been shown in detail in the Statement of particulars of Current Demand of Ryotwar, &c., as directed in paragraph 8 of the Board's Miscellaneous Circular, No. XLIX, dated 19th June 1863.

17. *Statement No. 5.*—This Statement shows a small remission on account of withered crops, which was found necessary in the Taluk of Ellore.

the first named product, which is owing to the advantages afforded by the annicut irrigation. The large increase in Cotton was owing to the stimulus occasioned by the unprecedented demand for that article in Europe. The increase in Indigo is attributable to the seasonable rains.

There is a decrease of Rupees 16-4-5 in the Peshkush. In the village of Bommur, a sum of Rupees 48-13-3 was sanctioned to be reduced from the Permanent assessment, on account of land given up for the purpose of enlarging the Cantonment at Dowlaishweram; but only two-thirds of this sum, or Rupees 32-8-10 had been deducted from the Peshkush in Fasli 1271, as mentioned in paragraph 19 of the last Jummabundy Report; and the remaining Rupees 16-4-5 have been deducted from the Peshkush in the year under report.

*Quit-rent and Shrotriem.*—The decrease of Rupees 86 in the amount of Quit-rent and Shrotriem, is owing to the quit-rent of a village for three Faslis having been included in the Demand of Fasli 1271.

The increase of Rupees 751 in the Rents for more than one year, is owing to the transfer of four villages from that tenure to another.

The large increase of Rupees 12,94,950 in the Rents for one year, and the large decrease of Rupees 15,20,984 under Ryotwar, is chiefly owing to the Rents for one year in fasli 1721 having been shown under Ryotwar for a period of ten months, according to the classification of the Treasury accounts. The increase and decrease would have been still greater under these heads had it not been for the transfer of water tax on the Proprietary and Inam lands, to Land Revenue Miscellaneous, under paragraph 8 of the Board's Proceedings of the 19th June 1863.

*Redemption of Quit-rent on Inams, &c.*—There appears a decrease of 291 in the amount of redemption of quit-rent on Inams, owing to the transfer of this item to 17 H Public Debt in Fasli 1272 under orders.

*Land Revenue Miscellaneous.*—The large increase of 4,66,614 in the Land Revenue Miscellaneous is owing chiefly to the transfer of the water tax, Rupees 4,59,392, on the Proprietary estates and Inam lands to this head as stated above. To show the real increase and decrease in the Land Revenue exclusive of water tax on Proprietary Estates and Inam lands, a Statement is annexed in the margin, from which it will be observed that there is really a net increase of Rupees 83,539 in the Land Revenue. The large decrease of Rupees 1,50,916 in the Land assessment is owing to the reductions in the assessment consequent on the new settlement. The large increase in the water tax of Rupees 2,34,455 is attributable to the water tax having been imposed on the survey acreage in both the Principal and Sub-divisions.

20. **SUNDRY SOURCES OF REVENUE.**—The particulars of the Sundry Sources of Revenue, in comparison with those of the preceding year, are given in the following Statement:—

*Income Tax.*—The large decrease of Rupees 47,501 in the Income Tax is chiefly owing to the abolition of the 2 per cent. tax in the year under report. The decrease in the duty on Arts and Trades of Rupees 1,632 is in consequence of its abolition.

*Sea Customs.*—The decrease of Rupees 9,988 in the Sea Customs is chiefly owing to the great falling off in the exportation of rice and grain to Mauritius and Bourbon, and of piece goods in consequence of the prices of Cotton.

*Land Customs.*—The decrease of Rupees 4,847 in the Land Customs is in consequence of the piece goods having been exported to a smaller extent than in the previous year to Yanam, owing to the high prices of Salempores.

*Salt.*—The accompanying Statements Nos. 3, 4, 5 and 6 exhibit the details of transactions in Salt. The quantity in store at the beginning of the Fasli was 6,30,716 Indian Maunds, and the quantity received during the year was 3,54,968, making a total of 9,85,684 Indian Maunds.

The sales and remission of wastage within the Fasli amounted to Indian Maunds 2,74,321, leaving a balance of Indian Maunds 7,11,363 at the end of the Fasli inclusive of wastage in Fasli 1272, which amounted to 11,474 Indian Maunds, and the salt supplied to the District

Engineer for the Depôt at Manikdeokunta, the price of which has not yet been received. This balance has been outstanding for the last two years.

The actual quantity in store, deducting the above and wastage, was 6,87,889 Indian Maunds. I request the sanction of the Board for writing off the wastage of Indian Maunds 11,474 in the accounts, with reference to the remark given in Statement No. 4.

The past season was for the most part favorable for making salt, though the heavy rains towards the latter part of the season impeded the progress of manufacture to a certain extent, and have caused a decrease in the out-turn. The estimated quantity of salt manufactured in the year under report was Indian Maunds 2,64,993, the quantity actually received into store, both within the Fasli and subsequently, was Indian Maunds 2,61,282. The whole quantity of salt in store, including that which was received after the end of the Fasli, amounts to 7,76,858 Indian Maunds, which is sufficient for two years' consumption. The salt manufactured being of a far better quality than usual, the full rate of 7½ Rupees per garce was disbursed.

As shown in the comparative Abstract on the back of Statement No. 5, there is an increase of 77,196 Indian Maunds in the Home and Inland sales, which is owing to the limited

sales of last Fasli. A greater number of merchants and Brinjaries resorted to the stores during the year than during the preceding one.

Statement No. 6.—The comparative Statement in the margin shows collections and charges. Explanation of the cause of the fluctuation in each item is given in the column of Remarks of the Statement No. 6. The increase in the collections is owing to the increased sales for Home and Inland consumption, and the decrease in the charges is in consequence of the payment of the Kudivaram in Fasli 1271, for a larger quantity of salt manufactured in Fasli 1270 than that in Fasli 1272, which again was less in quantity than that of the previous Fasli.

*Stamps.*—The decrease of Rupees 24,900 in the sale of Stamps is in consequence of the large sales in Fasli 1271, owing to the operation of the law of Limitation.

21. TOTAL DEMAND OF LAND REVENUE AND SUNDRY SOURCES OF REVENUE.—The entire demand in the year under report on account of all Sources of Revenue, including Extra Revenue and Income tax was 42,08,652, or Rupees 2,62,153 above the preceding year as shown in the following Statement :—

*Land Revenue Miscellaneous.*—The large increase of Rupees 4,63,466, under the head of Land Revenue Miscellaneous, is owing partly to water tax on Inams and Proprietary estates

having been transferred to this head, and partly to an increase\* in the sale proceeds of the right to hold unoccupied lands liable to the payment of annual assessment. The increase in the water tax principally arose from the Inams in the Government villages where the settlement was introduced, for reasons given in paragraph 19 regarding the water tax on Government lands, as well as from such Inams in the two Taluks of the Principal Division where they are charged with water rates on the new survey acreage. The increase in the sale proceeds of unoccupied lands has occurred in consequence of such lands having been applied for by numerous persons, on the right to hold them being sold by auction.

*Miscellaneous of Sundry Sources.*—The net decrease of Rupees 4,119 in Miscellaneous, under the head of Sundry Sources of Revenue, is the result of the interest on arrears of Revenue and Refunds of charges and Sayer having been transferred from this head to that of Land Revenue Miscellaneous, and Local Funds.

*Interest.*—The increase of Rupees 2,390 in interest, both on the Land Revenue and Sundry Sources of Revenue, is chiefly owing to the instalments of Land Revenue and Abkarry not having been punctually paid in the preceding Fasli.

22. *SUNDRY ITEMS.*—The particulars of the Sundry items have hitherto been shown in Statement No. 4; but this head has this year been transferred to the Statement of particulars of Current Demand of Ryotwar, Sundry Items, and Land Revenue Miscellaneous, under the instructions in paragraph 8 of the order of the Board of Revenue, 19th June 1863.

It will be observed that there is a decrease of as much as Rupees 3,11,492 under the head of Sundry items. This is mainly in the item of water tax on Inams and Proprietary lands, which has been transferred from this head. The real decrease as compared with the preceding year is only Rupees 2,277, as particularized below:—

It was owing to the gross increase of Rupees 6,244, and the gross decrease of Rupees 8,521, the former is chiefly in two items: one is the grazing tax, which was in consequence of certain uncultivable lands in the Undi and Nursapore Taluks,

which have been set aside for the purpose of grazing by the Settlement Department\* having been let out at low rates, and the other has arisen from the excess in Inams in Government villages found upon survey, being assessed in accordance with the order of Government, dated 16th November 1859. The latter consists chiefly

of two items also, viz., the Jodi on Sundry Inams, and the tax on Palmyras; the decrease of Rupees 3,758 in the first has resulted from the demand of quit-rent for two or three years being included in the past year, and the decrease of Rupees 4,424 in the second is owing to the abolition of Tadinella in the Taluks in which the revised assessment has been introduced.

23. DEMAND, COLLECTION, AND BALANCE OF ALL SOURCES OF CURRENT REVENUE. *Statement No. 11.*—The following is the Abstract showing the Current Demand, Collection, and Balance of Fasli 1272:—

It will be observed from the above Statement that the total demand was Rupees 42,08,652, of which Rupees 39,63,030 were collected within the Fasli, leaving a balance of Rupees 2,45,622, which was reduced by the 31st August 1863 to Rupees 65,054. Of the Peshkush balance of Rupees 1,743, detailed in Statement No. 12, Rupees 1,314 are against the estate of Billumilli and Bayanagudem on account of a certain bund (which has already formed the subject of correspondence) not having been repaired: and Rupees 429 are outstanding on the remaining estates. This amount will shortly be collected.

The balance of Rupees 21,515, outstanding on the 1st September under the head of "Not permanently settled," will, it is hoped, be shortly brought to account.

The balance of Rupees 9,093, outstanding under the head of Sundry Sources of Revenue, is on account of Abkarry and Income Tax.

Of the balance of Rupees 5,395 on account of Abkarry, Rupees 1,858 are against the renters of Kapavaram and Cocanada: the farm of the former has been under attachment throughout the Fasli, owing to the failure of the renter to pay his instalments with punctuality. A part will, it is still believed, be collected. The balance of the latter farm is owing to the failure of the renter to pay for the year under report, on the grounds of his having sustained a loss from the reduction in sales, owing to the removal of the troops from Samulcottah.

This has already formed the subject of correspondence, and measures have been taken for the realization of the remaining balance due on the other farms.

The balance of Income Tax is outstanding, in consequence of the fourth Kist falling due in August. A great portion of it has been collected in the month of September, which has not been accounted for, and the remaining portion will be realized at an early date.

The balance of Rupees 29,665, under the head of Miscellaneous, is on account of water tax as particularized in the margin. Measures have been adopted for the early realization of the balance, a great portion of which will be collected. The greater portion is on account of the water tax on Inams, whose owners say that they have been erroneously entered as irrigated in the Settlement Registers. The subject is

The balances outstanding under all heads amounted at the commencement of the Fasli under review to Rupees 3,18,031-15-2, this amount was reduced to Rupees 76,065-9-3 at the close of the Fasli, partly by collections, and partly by remissions under the sanction of Government. By subsequent collection and remissions to the end of August 1863, the sum has been further reduced to Rupees 72,811-15-6, which are classed as Recoverable, Doubtful, and Irrecoverable as stated below :—

The greater portion of the recoverable balance will, I trust, be realized soon. Of the recoverable balance of Peshkush, Rupees 2,052-9-8 are due by the proprietor of the Tangillamudi estate. He complained that he had sustained a loss in Fasli 1271: certain lands in the villages of Malakapuram and Komadavole having been left waste in consequence of the non-supply of water, owing to the bunds of certain tanks having been cut by the Public Works Department. The matter was referred to the Deputy Collector for inquiry, and the result showed that no remission was thought necessary; and, consequently, my predecessor, just before he left the District, issued instructions for the recovery of the balance. It will, I hope, be collected at an early date.

The arrears still outstanding under Miscellaneous, from Faslis 1242, to 1266, classed as Recoverable are on account of quit-rent on a certain Mokhassa village in the late Masulipatam District, as explained in paragraph 43 of the Jamabundy report for Fasli 1270.

The most part of the recoverable balance under this head, from Fasli 1268, is due by the proprietors on account of water tax, this amount has been suspended owing to their claims to certain exemptions being under inquiry. It will be settled as soon as possible. Upwards of Rupees 10,539-11-3 are due by the Zemindar of the Nidadavole and Baharzalli estates for

Fasli 1271. He has promised to pay such sum as the higher authorities may think proper.\*

The irrecoverable arrears, Rupees 17,524-4-8, have been inquired into, and found to be altogether hopeless for reasons given below; and I, therefore, request sanction for writing them off the accounts.

The three first causes require no remarks. The sum of Rupees 1,313-9-10, classed as irrecoverable under "Permanently settled," is due against the estates of Bayanagudem and Billumilli for Fasli 1271, in consequence of a bund not having been repaired. The Government have in their Order, dated 20th June 1863, No. 1,084, expressed a desire that early steps should be taken for the execution of the repairs, and the Superintending Engineer is, I trust, making arrangements for their execution. Under those circumstances, I beg to recommend that the balances on this account may be written off.

25. RESULT OF INQUIRY REGARDING THE BALANCES OF FASLI 1271.—With reference to paragraph 8 of the Board's Proceedings of the 22nd May 1861, No. 2,610, the following Abstract is prepared from Statement No. 13 to show the result of the inquiry made regarding the balances of Fasli 1271 during the Settlement of Fasli 1272 :—

*Coercive measures. Enclosure A in Statement No. 13.*—Enclosure A of Statement No. 13 exhibits the extent to which it was found necessary to resort to coercive measures in the collection of the revenue in the year under review. Notices were issued against 371 Ryots, by whom arrears amounting to Rupees 20,930 were due. Property valued at Rupees 17,744 was attached, of which property to the value of Rupees 3,637 was sold.

25. *COLLECTION AND CHARGES. Statement No. 14.*—The undermentioned Statement shows the collections both current and arrears, in Fasli 1272, as compared with the preceding year:—

The decrease in the collection of arrears is owing to there having been smaller arrears to collect, while the increase in the current collections is chiefly in consequence of the large increase in the amount of water tax for reasons already stated.\*

25. Under the head of Sundry Sources, there is a net increase of Rupees 30,894 in the collections, both current and arrears, which is owing to an increase in the demand on account of Salt.

There is a net decrease of Rupees 24,134 in the first item. It has been occasioned by the salary of the establishments in all the Taluks having been disbursed agreeably to Mr. Pelly's arrangements. The net decrease of Rupees 1,24,406 is mainly attributable to the sum of Rupees 1,41,222-12-0 having been paid to the Zemindar of Nidadavole and Baharzalli, under the orders of Government dated 23rd September 1862.

27. *WORKING OF THE NEW SYSTEM OF VILLAGE AND TALUK ACCOUNTS.*—Of the total number of 978 Government villages, the accounts of 574 villages were examined in Fasli 1272 under the superintendence of the Officers making the Jamabundy. Those of 339 were found to be correctly prepared. The errors in the others were pointed out to the Curnums and Taluk Officers, and orders issued for their correction. The Taluk accounts were examined at the same time. I am informed that they were, on the whole, prepared more carefully and accurately than they have been hitherto.

28. *REGISTER OF LANDS ACQUIRED BY PUBLIC SERVANTS.*—The annexed Statement shows the number of Public Servants, and the extent of land held by them:—

The Deputy Collectors have no lands in the District in which they are employed. The Tahsildars and Sub-Magistrates possess no land in their respective ranges. The possession of lands by other servants, whether in the Huzur or the Taluks, needs no special remark, under the order of Government dated 4th October 1862, No. 2,137.

29. COSTS AWARDED AND RECOVERED.—Statement A, showing the costs awarded to Government by the Civil Court, the amount collected, and the balance still due, is submitted with reference to the Board's Proceedings dated 30th October 1855. The sum of 942 Rupees, due by Plaintiff and Appellant Balsu Pattabhiramayya, in Original Suit No. 2 of 1859, Civil Court's file, has been realized in the year under report.

## SUB-COLLECTORATE.

1. I have the honor to submit my Report on the Settlement of the Sub-division for Fasli 1272 (1862-63), with the usual explanatory Statements.

2. THE NEW REVENUE SETTLEMENT.—The new Revenue Settlement, as stated in the last paragraph of my Report for Fasli 1271, has been introduced into the whole of the Sub-division,

Taluk; besides which there are six villages still under the Joint rent system, five of them are situated in the north of the Tanuku Taluk, and formed part of Pentapad,† but were transferred to Tanuku to make the boundary more regular, and Government have not yet sanctioned their being brought under the new Settlement; and one in the Narsapur Taluk, which, being on the Nagaram side of the river, is included among the villages in the Eastern Delta, and is therefore still joint rented.

3. THE STATIONS AT WHICH THE ANNUAL SETTLEMENT WAS MADE.—The following Statement shows the stations at which the annual settlement was made, and the time occupied upon it; and also the number of Puttahs distributed. Each Taluk I settled myself within its limits. Attili and Pennagonda, in the Tanuku Taluk, I had to defer till after my return to Narsapur, as several necessary accounts could not be got ready in time for their settlement when I was in the Taluk, and it was impracticable to remain at one station waiting for the accounts of these two villages, and thus delaying the whole of the remainder of the Jamabandi. As it was, the settlement was not completed till the 28th May, and occupied 38 days more than the settlement of the previous Fasli. This being the first year of the practical working of the Ryotwar Settlement in the greater part of the Sub-division of course satisfactorily accounts for the difference of time occupied. In Fasli 1271 Joint rents prevailed, and Puttahs were given to each village, whereas now they are distributed to each individual Ryot.

4. Ryotwar Puttahs were newly distributed this year, none can therefore be particularized as "Renewed," or "Not renewed."



5. VARIATION IN THE NUMBER AND TENURE OF VILLAGES.—The following Statement shows the number of villages and their tenure as compared with the preceding Fasli. It shows that 234 villages under Joint rent, and six under Whole rent were transferred to Ryotwar; the remaining 55 under Joint rent in the preceding Fasli have remained unaltered :—

6. SEASON AND CROPS.—The rain-fall, though less than in Fasli 1271, was sufficient for agricultural operations, and the season on the whole may be considered as a very fair average one. The river rose up to 25 feet at Rajahmundry, some 17 feet above the summer level, which was amply sufficient for all practical purposes. The crops generally were good, and were free from blight.

7. SANITARY CONDITION.—The sanitary condition of the people was very good, and the following Statement, showing the mortality caused by cholera, small-pox, and fever in Fasli 1272, contrasts most favorably with that of last Fasli. The increase in the mortality among the cattle, I fancy, is to be accounted for by the increase in the possession of the Ryots, rather than to any other cause, for no disease of any kind has been prevalent.
