To the Receipt to cancel a tally for 5,000*l.* dated October 26, 1672, on the customs and payable to the East India Company, and of which only 3,128*l.* 16*s.* 3*d.* can be satisfied on the customs of this last year and in lieu thereof to strike two tallies for 3,128*l.* 16*s.* 3*d.* and 1,871*l.* 3*s.* 9*d.* respectively, the latter to be applied to the next year's account. all at the request of Sir John Banks, as Governor of the East India Company, and to accommodate the Receiver-General of the Customs in perfecting his accounts for last year

by Mr. Fly as assistant to Captain Prowd, and of what allowance he should have in proportion to what Captain Beale received when in that employment. Robert Barber's account to be examined. A representation from Samuel Sambrooke, Senior, is read and referred for consideration. On information that Thomas Hopkinson, schoolmaster at Poplar, is given to 'intemperate drinking' and neglects his duty, order is given for him to attend the Court next Wednesday, January 7, and for some of the inhabitants of that place to attend also. The Shipping Committee are directed to visit the Schoolhouse and the Almshouse at Poplar twice a year, at Midsummer and Christmas, ascertain fully how the Minister and Schoolmaster discharge their respective duties, and report; and the Court order that no warrants for salary of either Minister or Schoolmaster be signed until after the quarterly report is made (2½ pp)

from May 4 to May 8, 1673, from
Pepys MS. 2350.*]

From 3 att noo: to this day noo wind att E b S a smale gale & temperate weather wth Smooth water we laye by from 12 at noone till 2 of the clock then made sayle & steared W $\frac{1}{2}$ S 62 miles and before day saw a shipp and at six in y^e morning spoke with him Wee then saw the Land bareing W $\frac{1}{2}$ N and dista about 12 Leags & when the Master of the small vessell came on board me He Informed me that the Island was taken by the Dutch the first of January last past and that Cap^t Medford had carryed all the people off wth Cap^t Johnson & a french man in his Company and soe went for Braize and there hired this vessell & sent two of his Ma^{ts} in her to lye off and on about 11 or 12 Leags to windward of the Island to gue all English men notice of itt We haweing noe other Buisness to doe haweing for some weeks before made our ffield Cullors and appointed our officers & euery day mustred our men doubting w^t we are nowe very well certified In, soe we laye by from 6 till 12 att noone because they should not deserue us from the Island and at one of the Clock bore up & left the rest of the shipp to come in att night Att sunn sett sent our pinace being well manned & armed being six leagues of the Island sent Cap^t Keigwin with a Black in her to Discover the strength of the Roade Att one in the Morning being neere the Island we clap^t by till the rest of our ffeet came up with us and at 7 in y^e Morning Cap^t Keigwin Came on board and acquainted me that noe shipp laye in the Roade Then I added to my former Numb^r for the shoare w^{ch} was 200 & landed 350 These men we putt on board the *Castle* and the Smale Portugize and left them boats to land them I bore away haweing a prosperous gale at ENE and by $\frac{1}{2}$ an hower past 12 at Noone came in sight of Sth Valleeye where I saw the Dutch Cullers fflying and herd their Drummes and Immediatly were saluted by their fiue Gunns butt for bore to Answer them knowing y^t y^t was not the place I designed for, butt before I past them I bestowed a broad side on them. When we opened Chappell Valley we heard largly from them they haweing in this fort 29 Gunns we gaue them our shoare broadside and luft in 10 fath^m water and lett goe our Ankor ab^t a good Pistoll shott from the

Crane Gunns and Just in the middle of the Baye then it was wth in a Qua^r of one the Rest of our shipp not yett in sight w^{ch} Incorridgd the Enimy & we not able to doe them that damage that other wise we might haueing butt 74 in Numb^r on board About one hower & a halfe afterwards our other shipp came in butt when here did not take that care y^t ought to be taken in the letting goe their ankors w^{ch} caused y^m to goe fiarther of yⁿ they or I were willing they should soe that though they did offend the Enimy they tooke noe shott from us about $\frac{1}{2}$ an hower after 4 findeing our selues disabled for men & doubting the safty of our frigott I cutt & towed to the westward & lett goe my anker under breake neck Valley & Resolued to warpe in the W^m & Thomas that night y^t we might be against the ffort in the morning when our Armeey came downe butt they noe sooner saw vs lett goe our Anker againe butt they came off wth a Flagg of Truce and Surrendered the Island upon Condition that they might not be striped of their Cloths for w^{ch} I gaue them under my hand Provided it had not bin y^e Englishes formerly by this time it begun to be darke Soe I sent Cap^t Piles on shoare wth the Kings Cullers and to take possession of the ffort & with him a Trumpeter to Cap^t Keigume Commander of the Land Forces that he might march his men downe to the Fort to prevent any Inuerey might be don to y^e Island by our Soldiers Till this moment of time I haue not heard from Cap^t Hobbs Cap^t Hobbs¹ who I ordered against Sth Valley they haueing receiued our broad sides as wee past allong who fired butt three Gunns against him and struck their Cullers howeuer he was pleased to send his boate on shoare more then once to fetch the Plunder of the Place & neuer so kind to y^e Kings Service to giue me an acc^t of any thing till night they yelded betweene 3 & 4 of the Clock This I impute to Ignorance and Obstinacie which he & some others vsually Practice

This Morning I sent for most the Prisoners from the shoare and by 11 a Clock our Soldiers marched into the Fort. By some English Prisoners I am certainly Informed that we may houerly expect the Dutch Fleet from India & wth them Some men of warr soe Certaine they are of their speedy Coming that they did beleue us to be some part of their Fleete, Wee are adused that 4 of our East India were of this Place 14 dayes² agone w^{ch} makes me feare that we shall not be soe happy as to meet wth any of our Arrants This Euening I went on shoare and tooke a survey of the Fort and Plattforme & appointed Carpenters, & Gunners to reparaire all things that we may be in to Receue an Enimy.

On the 4th of May last in the Morning, We came in sight of the Isle of St. Helena, in two hours after, We had concluded what to do, for the re-taking of the Island, and Ordered 200 Men, with Field-Colours and Officers, appointed to be put on Board a Vessel, out of which they might be Landed, whilst We attacked the Ships in the Road, in case there should be any there, About 11, in the Forenoon, the *Assistance* Frigate made Sayl, lay to till the Evening, and came in to Us in the Night, The next Morning about seven of the clock, all our Ships being to Windward of the Isle about five Miles, Our Boat came on Board and told us, That the Road was clear, so We immediately put 200 Men more on Board the *Castle* Fireship, and left her and the other Vessel to Land our 400 men, to Windward of the Island, in Prosperous Bay, The four Men of War, made sayl for the Forts, against which We Anchored about one in the Afternoon, and after four hours Dispute, went to the Westward and there let go our Anchor again, being confident our Men must be Landed, and Gained the Hills before that time, and that by the next Morning We might expect them on the back of the Forts, against which time it was resolved, to have the *William and Thomas*, and one ship more, close under the Fort The Dutch no sooner saw us come up again, and that We did not intend to leave them, but they came off and yielded the Island, upon condition That they might not be stripped, which We accepted they not yet knowing of any Army that We had Landed, At Sun-set We took Possession of James Fort, and dispatched a Trumpet to Captain Keigwin, Commander of our Land Force, to acquaint him with what had passed, to prevent any Injury that might be done to the Isle by our Men, in their March to the Fort, On the eleventh, between seven and eight in the Evening, a Ship appeared in sight, with a Flag aloft, which We cut after, and by eleven at night,

came up with her, and took her, which proved one of the Dutch East-India Fleet, sent before with the new Governor for St Helena. On the 26 early in the Morning, We saw our Flags on the Mount hoisted, which gave us an account that there were six sayle in sight; About ten in the forenoon We had Advice, that four were coming one way, and two the other, who immediately appeared in sight, at both ends of the Island, They no sooner saw us, but clapped by a wind, and We after them; The *Assistance*, the *William and Thomas*, and the *Castle Fireship* to the Eastward, one Merchant Man, after Four, The *Mary and Martha* with two Merchant Men, to the Westward, after two, but it being a very hard Gale, We could do nothing on them, At night the *Assistance* got up with their Vice-Admiral, and the *William and Thomas* Their Admiral, whom they kept company all night, and the 27 in the Morning took them, but not in company one with the other, every Ship steering his own course, believing by that, to lose us The said four Men of War, Fireship, and three Dutch East-India Prizes together with five English East-India Ships, who came in Company with the Men of War, are since safely arrived (Title-page and two more)
