RULES REGARDING EMPLOYMENT IN THE CENTRAL PROVINCES PROVINCIAL CIVIL SERVICE.

A.—APPOINTMENT.

I.—Appointments in the Central Provinces Provincial Service will ordinarily be filled by persons who are Natives of India as defined in Statute 33, Victoria, Chapter 3, Section 6, that is to say, "persons born and domiciled within the dominions of Her Majesty in India of parents habitually resident in India and not established there for temporary purposes only," or of subjects of Native Princes in alliance with His Majesty: provided that Europeans or Eurasians, who are not Natives of India, may, with the sanction of the Government of India, be selected for appointment.

Other conditions being equal, preference will always be given to permanent residents of the Central Provinces.

II.—Every candidate for direct appointment to the Provincial Service must furnish satisfactory evidence—

- (a) that he is eligible for appointment in accordance with Rule I;
- (b) that his parents or guardians have recently resided for at least three years within the Central Provinces;

NOTE.—The Chief Commissioner may dispense with this condition with the previous sanction of the Government of India.

- (c) that he is not over 25 years of age, except in the case of barristers, advocates, or pleaders, in whose case the age limit shall be 30 years;
- (d) that he is of sound health, good physique and active habits, and has been successfully vaccinated or has had small-pox;
- (e) that he is of good character;
- (f) that he has passed the B. A. or B. Sc. Examination of a University, or, in the case of a European or Eurasian, has received an education which, in the opinion of the Chief Commissioner is such as to fit him for the discharge of the duties of an officer of the Provincial Civil Service.

III.—Officers of the Subordinate Civil Service, or of the Police or other Departments, may, at the discretion of the Chief Commissioner, be appointed to the Provincial Service on the ground of good service and suitability for such appointment.

IV.—Every person appointed to the Provincial Service shall be on probation for the first two years of his appointment, unless the Chief Commissioner in any special case declares such probation to be unnecessary. During the period of probation he must pass the prescribed Departmental Examinations.

B.—PROMOTION.

V.—Promotion up to the grade of Rs. 400 will ordinarily be made by seniority; but promotions above that grade will only be made by seniority qualified by selection on account of efficiency; and mere seniority will not be considered as giving any claim.

VI.—The Chief Commissioner reserves the power in very special cases to make direct appointments to the higher grades of the Provincial Civil Service.

C.—DISMISSAL.

VII.—A member of the Provincial Service shall not be dismissed otherwise than on the result of a judicial, or formal departmental, inquiry.

RULES REGARDING EMPLOYMENT IN THE CENTRAL PROVINCES SUBORDINATE CIVIL SERVICE.

A.—APPOINTMENT.

I.—Appointments in the Central Provinces Subordinate Service will ordinarily be filled by persons who are Natives of the Central Provinces and permanently resident there.

II.—Every candidate for direct appointment to the Subordinate Service must furnish satisfactory evidence that he—

- (a) is eligible for appointment in accordance with Rule I;
- (b) is not over 25 years of age, except in the case of a barrister, advocate, or pleader, the age limit for such candidates being 30 years;
- (c) is of sound health, good physique and active habits;

- (d) is of good character;
 (e) has passed the B. A. or B. Sc. Examination at a University or the School Final Examination.

NOTE.—This rule will not absolutely debar those who have no higher qualification than F. A., the question of whose appointment comes up prior to the 1st April 1907. But preference will be given to those having the qualification required by rule.

III.—Officers of the Land Record Staff, of the Police, or of other Departments, may, at the discretion of the Chief Commissioner, be appointed to the Subordinate Service on the ground of good service and suitability for such appointment.

IV.—Every person appointed to the Subordinate Service shall be on probation for the first two years of his appointment, unless the Chief Commissioner in any special case declares such probation to be unnecessary.

V.—The rules regarding appointment of Tahsildars and Naib-Tahsildars are contained in Book Circular IV-A—2 and of Munsiffs in Book Circular No. XXV, dated the 12th August 1901, which also lay down the rules regarding suspension, reduction and dismissal.

B.—PROMOTION.

VI.—Promotion will be made in all grades by seniority qualified by selection on account of efficiency.

VII.—Officers of the Subordinate Service may, at the discretion of the Chief Commissioner, be promoted to the Provincial Service, on the ground of good service and fitness for higher office.

OFFICERS WHO ARE EXEMPTED FROM PASSING THE DEPARTMENTAL EXAMINATION.

Officers of the Provincial or Subordinate Civil Service who have passed the Central Provinces Pleadership Examination are exempt from examination in Law and Procedure. Officers of the Provincial or Subordinate Civil Service who have been called to the Bar or who have the degree of B. L. or LL. B. are exempt from examination in Criminal and Civil Law and Procedure, and if they have passed the Local Laws Test they are exempt also from examination in Revenue Law and Procedure. Civil Judicial Officers are exempt from passing in the Local Fund Accounts group of questions in the Accounts paper. Tahsildars and Naib-Tahsildars are exempt from the liability to pass in Civil Law and Procedure, and Munsiffs in Criminal Law and Procedure. There will be for Cantonment Magistrates a special examination in Cantonment Law and Procedure, in which one paper only, to be answered without books, will be set. They will not be examined in Revenue Law or Procedure; they must pass by the Higher Standard in the Treasury Procedure and Civil Account Code portion of the Accounts Examination; but they are exempt from appearance in the Local Fund Accounts group. The examination of Cantonment Magistrates in Criminal and Civil Law and Procedure, by both standards, is to be the same as that prescribed for Assistant Commissioners.

Assistant Commissioners and Extra-Assistant Commissioners must pass the full test in (1) Hindi and (2) Marathi or Uriya. Provided that an officer whose vernacular is Hindi, Marathi or Uriya need pass in only one other language (of these three). He is deemed to have passed in his own vernacular. Cantonment Magistrates must pass the full test either in Hindi or in Marathi.

HOME DEPARTMENT.

Calcutta, the 10th February 1899.

NOTIFICATION.

In supersession of Home Department Notification No. 2032, dated the 1st November 1877, the following new Warrant of Precedence for India, which has been approved by Her Majesty the Queen Empress of India, and which has received Her Royal Sign Manual, as also the revised graded list of civil offices not reserved for Members of the Indian Civil Service, supplementary to the Warrant of Precedence, which has been prepared under the orders of the Governor-General in Council, are published for general information:—

1.—Warrant of Precedence approved by the Queen, Empress of India.

VICTORIA, by the Grace of God, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen; Defender of the Faith, Empress of India,—

To all to whom these Presents shall come,—

Whereas it hath been represented unto Us that it is advisable that the rank and precedence of persons holding appointments in the East Indies as regulated by Our Royal Warrant, dated the 18th day of October 1876, should be altered. We do therefore hereby declare that it is Our will and pleasure that in lieu of the table laid down in Our said recited Warrant the following table be henceforth observed with respect to the rank and precedence of the persons hereinafter named, *viz.* :—

1. Governor-General and Viceroy of India.
2. Governors of Madras and Bombay.
3. President of the Council of the Governor-General.
4. Lieutenant-Governor when in his own territories.
5. Commander-in-Chief in India.

All ladies to take place according to the rank herein assigned to their respective husbands, with the exception of wives of Peers, and of ladies having precedence in England independently of their husbands, and who are not in rank below the daughters of Barons; such ladies to take place according to their several ranks, with reference to such precedence in England, immediately after the wives of Members of the Council of the Governor-General.
