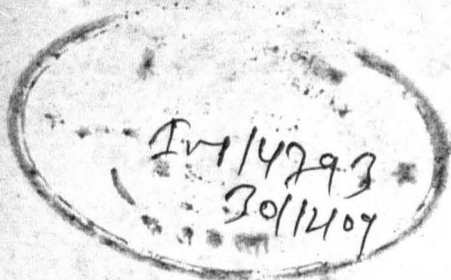

PREFACE TO THE 1ST EDITION.

It brings the narrative of services up to 1st of January, 1880. A few officers (Deputy Collectors, Extra Assistant Commissioners, Forest Officers, and others) have been unavoidably omitted, as the necessary details were not forthcoming in time. These will follow, as a first *addendum*, in due course. It is probable that in a work of this kind some mistakes have crept in; and the undersigned will be glad to be informed of any errors of omission or commission that may have occurred. The history will be continued from time to time as occasion offers.
