The good government of the country depends entirely on the efficiency of the officers selected to fill administrative posts, and His Excellency cannot consent to nominate to superjoir positions men who are untried in that particular branch of the service, however conspicuous their conduct may have been in other respects.

"The Governor-General directs me, therefore, to inform you that should you like to accept the opening which His Excellency is prepared to offer you in the executive branch, it will be necessary for you to enter it in the first instance as an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 3rd class."

[†]The salary of the Civil-Judge, Lucknow, was fixed at Rs. 1,200 per mensem, rising to Rs. 1,500 by addition of Rs. 100 a monhte after intervals of two years. Mr. Lincoln was permitted to count the period of his officiating incumbency of Civil Judge as service towards annual increment.
