## FIRST GRADE.

COLONEL FRANCOIS EDWARD ARCHIBALD CHAMIER, BENGAL STAFF CORPS (Born 13th May, 1833).—Joined the service as Ensign, 20th February, 1850; arrived in India, 7th April, 1850; posted to 26th Native Infantry, August, 1850; posted to 34th Native Infantry, January, 1854; Interpreter and Quartermaster, 34th Native Infantry, March, 1854; Lieutenant, 8th April, 1857; selected to disarm native guards in Calcutta, June, 1857; Adjutant, Calcutta Volunteer Guards, June, 1857; Aide-de-Camp and Interpreter to Sir James Outram, Bart., G.C.B., August, 1857; services placed at the disposal of the Government of India, Foreign Department, for employment in the Oudh Commission, March, 1858; appointed Assistant Commissioner, 2nd class, Oudh, April, 1858; reported arrival at Lucknow, 1st April, 1858; placed in political charge of Kapurthala Contingent, May, 1858; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Dariabad (Bara Banki), 7th December, 1858; confirmed as Assistant Commissioner, 1st class, 18th June, 1859, continuing to officiate as Deputy Commissioner; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Parthagarh, 8th August, 1859; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, Dariabad, 1st October, 1859; confirmed as Deputy Commissioner, 3rd class, Oudh, 4th October, 1861; preparatory leave from 6th to 24th February, 1862; Captain, Staff Corps, 20th February, 1862; Brevet Major (Army), 21st February, 1862; leave to Europe on medical certificate from 25th February, 1862 to 29th March, 1863; subsidiary leave from 30th March to 6th April, 1863; Deputy Commissioner, 3rd class, Dariabad, 7th April, 1863; promoted to the 2nd class, 9th December, 1863; was in charge of settlement work, Dariabad, from 18th to 30th June, 1864; resumed charge as Deputy Commissioner, 2nd class, Dariabad, 1st July, 1864; placed in charge of settlement work, Dariabad, 23rd July, 1864; privilege leave from 29th August to 28th October, 1865; also held the administrative charge of the Dariabad district from 14th November to 3rd December, 1865; and again from 6th to 15th October, 1866; resumed charge of settlement work, Dariabad, 16th October, 1866; in the latter work he remained till the 27th April, 1867; when he resumed charge of his substantive appointment as Deputy Commissioner, 2nd class, Dariabad, on the 28th April, 1867; privilege leave from 7th September to 6th October, 1867; Officiating Commissioner, Lucknow Division, 26th June, 1868; on being relieved of the office of Commissioner, Lucknow Division, on the 31st July, 1868, promoted to act as Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, and appointed to officiate as Settlement Officer, Lucknow, 1st August, 1868; Officiating Commissioner, Lucknow Division, 8th September, 1868; reverted to Acting Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, from 2nd November, 1868; and assumed charge as Officiating Settlement Officer, Bara Banki, 5th November, 1868; reverted to Deputy Commissioner, 2nd grade, and to district work from 24th December, 1868; and posted to Sitapur, where he joined on the 1st January, 1869; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Sitapur, 6th February, 1869; Deputy Commissioner, 2nd grade, Sitapur, 20th February, 1869; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Sitapur, 4th March, 1869; officiated as Commissioner, Sitapur Division, from 1st to 27th October, 1869; reverted to Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, from 28th October, 1869, and transferred to Unao, where he joined on the 1st November, 1869; Lieutenant-Colonel (Army), 11th January, 1870; Major (Staff Corps), 20th February, 1870; subsidiary leave from 23rd to 31st March, 1871; furlough to Europe from 1st April, 1871 to 31st October, 1872; subsidiary leave from 1st to 5th November, 1872; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Bara Banki, 6th November, 1872; confirmed as Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Bara Banki, 22nd April, 1873; officiated as Commissioner, Rae Bareilly Division, from 4th August to 31st October, 1873; resumed charge as Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Bara Banki, 3rd November, 1873; privilege leave from 2nd March to 8th April, 1875; transferred to Lucknow, 9th April, 1875; subsidiary leave from 19th to 31st October, 1875; furlough to Europe from 1st November, 1875 to 7th November, 1876; subsidiary leave from 8th to 15th November, 1876; Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Hardoi, 16th November, 1876; transferred to Bara Banki, 21st February, 1877; Officiating Commissioner, Lucknow Division, 16th November, 1878; reverted to Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, from 16th February, 1879, and resumed charge at Bara Banki on the 21st idem; Officiating Commissioner, Lucknow Division, 25th April, 1879; reverted to Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, from 11th July, 1879, and resumed charge at Bara Banki on the 14th idem; subsidiary leave from 27th to 30th April, 1880; furlough to Europe on private affairs from 1st May, 1880 to 16th November, 1881; subsidiary leave from 17th to 26th November, 1881; posted as Deputy Commissioner to Hardoi, 27th November, 1881; appointed to be a District Judge, 1st grade, and posted to Rae Bareilly, 15th February, 1882; transferred in the same capacity to Fyzabad, 27th March, 1882.

WAR SERVICES.—Served as Aide-de-Camp to General Outram, Bart., G.C.B., throughout the Oudh campaign, commencing with first relief of the Bailey Guards, and terminating with the capture of Lucknow; commanded the Kapurthala Contingent during its service in Oudh in 1858—Medal, two clasps, and Brevet Majority.

1857. HERBERT BERING HARINGTON, M.A., Uncovenanted (Born 18th November, 1831).—Arrived in India on the 2nd February, 1857, as an Assistant in the Electric Telegraph Department, under three years' covenant with the Hon'ble East India Company; appointed to officiate as Deputy Superintendent, Electric Telegraph Department, North-Western Provinces and Oudh, 22nd August, 1858 (medal and clasp for relief of Lucknow, specially commended by Secretary of State); resigned his appointment on the 2nd February, 1860, and was forthwith appointed Assistant Commissioner of the 3rd class in Oudh, and posted to Unao; *subsidiary leave from 1st to 20th May, 1860; leave on medical certificate to Europe from 21st May, 1860 to 31st October, 1861; subsidiary leave from 1st to 30th November, 1861*; Assistant Commissioner, 3rd class, Unao, 1st December, 1861; transferred to Gonda, 17th December, 1861; transferred to Hardoi, 23rd April, 1862; promoted to Assistant Commissioner, 2nd class, 11th July, 1862; appointed Assistant in the Settlement Department, and posted to Dariahad, 1st January, 1863; *privilege leave from 30th June to 29th July, 1863; and from 19th May to 18th June, 1865*; officiated as Settlement Officer of Dariahad from 29th August to 29th October, 1865, and from 19th March, 1866 to 8th November, 1867; Assistant Settlement Officer, Bara Banki, 21st November, 1867 (salary increased to Rs. 900 from 17th December, 1867, under sanction of the Secretary of State); Officiating Settlement Officer, Lucknow, 3rd January, 1868; *privilege leave from 1st August to 19th October, 1868*; Officiating Secretary to Chief Commissioner, Oudh, 13th August, 1869; *privilege leave from 12th to 22nd November, 1869*; resumed charge as Officiating Secretary to Chief Commissioner, Oudh, 23rd November, 1869; reverted to Officiating Settlement Officer, Lucknow, 24th February, 1870; Officiating Secretary to Chief Commissioner, Oudh, 25th February, 1870; officiated also as Director of Public Instruction, Oudh (in addition to his own duties), from 30th April to 25th July, 1870; reverted to Officiating Settlement Officer, Lucknow, 16th January, 1871; Officiating Secretary to Chief Commissioner, Oudh, 27th January, 1871; *privilege leave from 14th August to 13th November, 1872*; appointed to officiate as Deputy Commissioner from 10th February, 1873, and posted to Rae Bareilly, where he assumed charge on the 14th idem; confirmed as Assistant Commissioner, 1st grade, from 27th June, 1873 (continuing to officiate as Deputy Commissioner); *preparatory leave from 1st to 13th November, 1873; leave to Europe on medical certificate from 14th November, 1873 to 5th November, 1875*; appointed (while on leave) Deputy Commissioner, 3rd grade, 1st July, 1875; *subsidiary leave from 6th to 29th November, 1875*; posted to Unao, 30th November, 1875; Commissioner, Sitapur Division, from 15th August to 18th November, 1876; reverted to Deputy Commissioner from 19th November, 1876, and rejoined at Unao, 2nd December, 1876; confirmed as Deputy Commissioner, 2nd grade, from 19th November, 1877; *privilege leave from 27th September to 26th December, 1878*; transferred to Lucknow, 29th July, 1879; appointed a District Judge of the 2nd grade, officiating in the 1st grade, and posted to Lucknow, 1st August, 1879; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Sultanpur, 5th April, 1880; Officiating Commissioner, Rae Bareilly Division, 11th April, 1881; reverted to Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, from 3rd July, 1881; *privilege leave from 3rd July to 5th October, 1881*; Officiating Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade, Sultanpur, 6th October, 1881; confirmed as Deputy Commissioner, 1st grade (Sultanpur), 5th December, 1881.

JOHN DYSON, Uncovenanted (Born 8th March, 1836).—Joined the service as a Deputy Magistrate and Deputy Collector, Bengal, 8th June, 1858; posted to Sarun, 11th July, 1858; transferred to Shahabad, 1st September, 1859; transferred to Behar, 16th November, 1858; transferred to Murshidabad, 13th August, 1861; services placed at the disposal of the Government of India, Foreign Department, for employment in Oudh, from 10th December, 1861; appointed Assistant Commissioner of the 3rd class, Oudh, December, 1861; posted to Lucknow, 4th January, 1862; transferred to Sultanpur, 30th January, 1862; *privilege leave from 1st to 31st December, 1862; leave on medical certificate to the sea from 14th August, 1863 to 24th March, 1864*; returned to Lucknow on the 25th March, 1864, and posted to Fyzabad, where he assumed charge on the 28th idem; promoted to Assistant Commissioner, 2nd grade, 28th March, 1864; transferred to Partabgarh, 24th April, 1864; transferred to Rae Bareilly, 23rd April, 1866; under the revised scale of salaries, selected to be an Assistant Commissioner, 2nd class, on Rs. 700, from 1st May,

1857. HENRY WILLIAM GIBSON (*Barrister-at-Law*). Uncovenanted (Born 15th October, 1838).—Joined the service as a volunteer in the Meerut Light Horse, during the rebellion of 1857-58; appointed Cornet by election, and subsequently promoted to Lieutenant (dates unknown); appointed Officiating Adjutant of the Moradabad Police Battalion, on probation, 21st November, 1858; Adjutant, Baitoul Military Police, 6th May, 1859; service dispensed with from 1st February,\* 1861; on the abolition of the appointment remained without employ from 1st February to 6th June, 1861; appointed Assistant District Superintendent of Police, Oudh, 7th June, 1861; posted to Lucknow, 11th June, 1881; transferred to Gonda, 19th December, 1861; posted to Fyzabad, 14th March, 1862; transferred to Unao, 19th April, 1862; Officiating District Superintendent of Police, 2nd grade, Sultanpur, 14th June, 1862; confirmed as District Superintendent of Police, 4th grade, from 1st April, 1863 (continuing to act in the 2nd grade); *privilege leave from 14th September to 13th November, 1863*; allowed to exchange his appointment with Captain (now Colonel) W. T. McGregor, Assistant Commissioner, 3rd class, Oudh, and posted to Sultanpur, 1st July, 1864; promoted to Assistant Commissioner, 2nd grade, February, 1865; transferred (temporarily) to the Settlement Department as Officiating Assistant Settlement Officer, Sultanpur, 10th February, 1865; (on the new scale of salaries was appointed an Assistant Commissioner of the 3rd grade on Rs. 500, the excess Rs. 100 drawn by him as Assistant Commissioner, 2nd grade, being passed as personal allowance from the 1st May, 1866); *privilege leave from 4th to 23rd July, 1866*; on being relieved of settlement work, remained at Sultanpur as Assistant Commissioner, 3rd grade, from 1st December, 1866; transferred to Fyzabad, where he took charge on the 13th February, 1867, from which date was promoted to Assistant Commissioner, 2nd grade; held charge of the office of Deputy Commissioner, Fyzabad, from 23rd to 28th February, 1867; *subsidiary leave from 1st March to 9th April, 1867*; *furlough to Europe on medical certificate from 10th April, 1867 to 9th April, 1869*; *leave without pay from 10th April to 21st September, 1869*; reported return at Lucknow on the 22nd September, 1869, and posted to Sitapur where he joined on the 27th idem; officiated as Deputy Commissioner of Sitapur, from 1st October to 14th November, 1869; from 16th March to 13th May, 1870; and from 6th June to 10th July, 1870; *subsidiary leave from 8th to 13th September, 1870*; *leave to Europe on private affairs from 14th September, 1870 to*

## DEPUTY COLLECTORS AND EXTRA ASSISTANT COMMISSIONERS.

### NORTH-WESTERN PROVINCES AND OUDH.

[NOTE.—Under Resolution No. 1711, dated 17th May, 1882, General Department, the whole uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners of the united provinces was re-organized with effect from the 1st April, 1882. Formerly there were four distinct divisions of the upper class of uncovenanted officers: the Deputy Collectors of the North-Western Provinces proper and the Extra Assistant Commissioners attached to the Oudh, Jhānsi and Kumaun Commissions under the scheme above sanctioned, this arrangement was modified. The Deputy Collectors and the Extra Assistant Commissioners are now graded in one amalgamated list, and their promotion, with due advertence to special circumstances and claims, is made throughout the entire list. They are divided into seven grades, but the order of the grades is reversed. Formerly, the first grade was the highest, now it is the lowest. Under Notifications Nos. 1617-18, dated 8th May, 1883, the official designation of the Extra Assistant Commissioners was also modified. They are now styled "Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners" and all persons holding the office of Extra Assistant Commissioners are also Deputy Collectors.]

1847. RAJA LACHHMAN SINGH.—(Born 9th October, 1826.)—Joined the service as a Translator in the Government Secretariat, North-Western Provinces, on a salary of Rs. 100 per mensem, 1st July, 1847; appointed Translator in the office of the Sudder Board of Revenue, North-Western Provinces, on Rs. 130 per mensem, 12th September, 1853; gradually rose to be Tahsildar of Etáwah on Rs. 180 per mensem, 15th April, 1855; appointed to officiate as a Deputy Collector, and posted to Bānda, 14th February, 1857; during the mutiny remained at Bānda till the

close of 1857, when he received orders to accompany Mr. A. O. Hume, C.S., to Etáwah; promoted to the 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors on Rs. 400 per mensem from 11th March, 1858, and posted to Etáwah, where he received charge on the 12th idem; *privilege leave from 17th March to 15th April, 1859, and from 24th April to 23rd May, 1860*; transferred in the same capacity to Bulandshahr, 6th April, 1863; *privilege leave from 9th November, 1865 to 7th February, 1866*; promoted to the then 1st grade of Deputy Collectors on Rs. 600 per mensem with effect from 3rd August, 1863; transferred to Bijnor, 22nd March, 1864; *privilege leave from 15th April to 11th June, 1866*; transferred to Bulandshahr, 24th April, 1867; promoted to be a Deputy Collector of the new 1st grade on Rs. 800 per mensem, 26th August, 1868; *privilege leave from 19th October to 17th December, 1869*; placed in charge of Settlement office at Bulandshahr, 3rd May, 1870; reverted to the regular line, 31st October, 1870; *privilege leave from 1st March to 26th May, 1872*; appointed to be an Assistant Settlement Officer in the Bulandshahr district, and invested with the powers described in section 238 of Act XIX. of 1873, 17th January, 1874; *privilege leave from 4th April to 1st June, 1874*; invested specially with the powers of a Collector under the Land Acquisition Act X. of 1870, except for the purposes of making awards in the Bulandshahr district, 8th September, 1875; *privilege leave from 1st to 10th March, 1877*; on the re-organization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed a Deputy Collector of the new 7th grade, on a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882.

1840. GEORGE GODFREY BILLINGS.—(Born 16th February, 1827.)—Joined the service as a clerk in the office of Political Agent at Dehra Dún on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem; gradually rose to be Head Assistant in the Meerut Commissioner's office on Rs. 300 per mensem, 1st January, 1853; appointed to officiate as a Deputy Collector on probation and posted to Aligarh, 23rd February, 1858; confirmed as a Deputy Collector of the then 3rd grade, 7th September, 1858; officiated as Assistant to Secretary to Government, North-Western Provinces, from 17th May to 5th July, 1860; resumed charge of his appointment at Aligarh on the 7th July, 1860; *privilege leave from 11th July to 14th October, 1860\**; transferred to Meerut, 24th February, 1862; promoted to the then 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors on Rs. 400 per mensem from 3rd August, 1863; on special duty to Calcutta, to give evidence in a case committed for trial, in September, 1863; appointed to officiate as Assistant Secretary to the Board of Revenue, North-Western Provinces, 21st May, 1865; promoted to be a Deputy Collector of the then 1st grade on Rs. 600 per mensem, continuing to officiate as Assistant Secretary, Board of Revenue, North-Western Provinces, 7th August, 1866; having been relieved of the latter office on the afternoon of 20th November, 1866, resumed charge of his appointment as Deputy Collector at Meerut on the 1st December, 1866; appointed a Deputy Collector of the 1st grade on a revised salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, 26th August, 1868; appointed to be a Justice of the Peace for the North-Western Provinces, under section 3, Act II. of 1869, 3rd August, 1869; *subsidiary leave from 30th to 31st March, 1872*; *furlough to Europe on private affairs from 1st April to 5th October, 1872*; *subsidiary leave from 6th to 8th October, 1872*; resumed charge of his office as Deputy Collector at Meerut, 9th October, 1872; officiated as Superintendent of Central and District Jails at Meerut from 18th October, 1872 to 5th January, 1873; officiated also as Cantonment Magistrate of Meerut, in addition to his other duties, from 1st August to 31st October, 1874; from 1st January to 23rd February, 1875, and from 9th September to 14th October, 1877; *privilege leave from 7th January to 19th March, 1879*; invested with the powers of a Collector under the Land Acquisition Act (X. of 1870), 20th December, 1879; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed a Deputy Collector of the new 7th grade, on a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882.

1846. RAE NANAK CHAND.—(Born 22nd July, 1828.)—Joined the service as a roznámcha navis (diarist) in the Deputy Commissioner's office at Hoshiarpur on a salary of Rs. 15 per mensem, 8th September, 1846; served afterwards in various ministerial capacities in the several districts of the then newly-acquired territory of the Panjáb till he rose to be acting Tahsildar of Kadipur, zila Jhung, on a salary of Rs. 150 per mensem early in 1854; resigned his appointment in the Panjáb under the orders of the Board of Revenue, North-Western Provinces, on the 19th July, 1854, and on arrival in the North-Western Provinces, was appointed an Extra Deputy Collector on special work in connection with the revision of settlement in the Aligarh district, 18th October, 1854; confirmed as a Deputy Collector of the then 3rd grade, on Rs. 250 per mensem, from 21st May, 1856; continued to conduct the

special duties at Aligarh till the 15th June, 1856, after which date he was posted on district work to Bulandshahr, where he joined on the 17th June following; transferred to Muzaffarnagar, on settlement duty, 8th April, 1860; promoted to the then 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors on Rs. 400 per mensem, 5th May, 1862; transferred to Bijnor, on Settlement duty, 20th May, 1864; appointed to be Deputy Collector of the new 2nd grade on Rs. 600 per mensem, 26th August, 1868; transferred from the Settlement Department, and posted on district work to Bijnor, 21st March, 1874; promoted to the 1st grade of Deputy Collectors with effect from 8th October, 1875; *privilege leave from 10th July to 23rd August, 1876, and from 1st November, 1879 to 31st January, 1880*; transferred to Pilibhit, 9th February, 1880; on the re-organization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed a Deputy Collector of the new 7th grade on a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882.

1840. EDWARD BICKERS, *Barrister-at-Law*.—(Born 1st May, 1829).—Joined the service as 3rd Clerk and Accountant, 1st Division, Army Clothing Agency at Fatehgarh on a salary of Rs. 40 per mensem, May, 1840; served afterwards in other superior ministerial capacities in the districts of Farukhabad and Mainpuri, in the North-Western Provinces, till the 6th March, 1856, when he was appointed Head Assistant in the Sitapur Commissioner's office. On the 3rd June, 1857, when the mutiny broke out, he was obliged to fly from Sitapur and come to Lucknow, where he remained throughout the siege, and served as a volunteer. On the 10th December, 1857, he obtained *six months' leave on half pay, and before his leave could expire*, he was appointed an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the then 3rd class in Oudh, on Rs. 250 per month, and posted to Lucknow, where he received charge on the 17th May, 1858; appointed a Justice of the Peace within the Bengal Presidency, 1st September, 1860; promoted to the then 2nd class of Extra Assistant Commissioners on Rs. 400 per mensem, 2nd September, 1860; *privilege leave from 13th August to 12th November, 1861*; transferred to Fyzabad, 17th June, 1863; transferred to Lucknow, 25th November, 1864; *privilege leave from 10th March to 8th April, 1865*; allowed to draw a personal allowance of Rs. 200 per month, subject to the proviso that it should merge in any regular increase of salary he might obtain on promotion, from 8th August, 1866; *subsidiary leave from 20th January to 13th February, 1867; furlough to Europe on medical certificate from 14th February, 1867 to 27th December, 1868*; promoted while on furlough to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner, 1st grade, from 9th January, 1868; reported his return to India on the 28th October, 1868; *subsidiary leave from 28th October to 17th November, 1868*; resumed charge of his office as Extra Assistant Commissioner at Lucknow, 18th November, 1878; *privilege leave from 20th September to 18th November, 1870*; officiated as Inspector-General of Registration and Superintendent of Excise and Stamps, Oudh, in addition to his own duties, from 22nd July to 20th October, 1872, and from 23rd July, 1874 to 2nd October, 1874; *subsidiary leave from 21st September to 3rd October, 1875*; *furlough to Europe from 4th October, 1875 to 30th March, 1877*; *subsidiary leave from 31st March to 10th April, 1877*; resumed charge of his office as Extra Assistant Commissioner at Lucknow, 11th April, 1877; appointed an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the new 1st grade on Rs. 800 per month, from 1st August, 1879; *privilege leave from 16th May to 26th June, 1880*; on the re-organization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 7th grade, on a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; *privilege leave from 25th November, 1882 to 21st February, 1883*.

WAR SERVICES.—During the mutiny, he enrolled himself as a volunteer, and remained in the Baillie Guard throughout the siege of Lucknow. On the 12th August, 1857, while defending Innespost, to which he was attached, against a violent attack by the mutineers, he was severely wounded in the face, and his upper and lower jaws were fractured, and the vision of his right eye permanently impaired. This wound was considered equal to the loss of a limb, and the Government granted him a life pension of £70 per annum; received also the usual mutiny medal.

1860. PANDIT MADHO PRASAD.—(Born 21st December, 1833).—Joined the service as an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the then 3rd grade on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, and posted on settlement work to Unao, 1st October, 1860; transferred to Sultanpur, 12th November, 1863; promoted to the 2nd grade of Extra Assistant Commissioners, 8th April, 1864; *privilege leave from 19th July to 18th August, 1865*; and from 18th December, 1867 to 1st January, 1868; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard, 21st July, 1868; *privilege leave from 4th August to 18th October, 1869*; and from 19th January to 17th February, 1871; transferred from settlement to district work, Sultanpur, 22nd April, 1872; invested with the powers of a Sub-Magistrate of the 1st class

under section 22, Act XXV., 1861, and with civil powers, 3rd May, 1872; invested with the powers of a Collector of Revenue under section 143, Act XVIII., 1872, 14th May, 1872; and with those of a Collector under section 54 of the Partition Act XIX. of 1833, 11th June, 1872; *privilege leave from 17th October to 16th December, 1873*; transferred to Bara Banki, 22nd January, 1875; *privilege leave from 11th February to 24th March, 1876*; promoted to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade, on Rs. 600 per mensem, 26th July, 1878; transferred to Lucknow, 15th July, 1879; appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the new 1st grade, on Rs. 800 per mensem, from 1st August, 1879; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 7th grade, on a salary of Rs. 800 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; placed on special duty under the orders of the Secretary to Government in the Oudh Revenue Department, 15th May, 1882; *privilege leave from 13th June to 13th August, 1882*; resumed charge of his office at Lucknow, 14th August, 1882; invested with the powers described in section 110 of Act X. of 1882 (the Criminal Procedure Code), to take security for good behaviour from habitual offenders; and with the powers described in section 133 of that Act, to make orders as to local nuisances, 6th March, 1883.

#### SIXTH GRADE.

1849. PANDIT DEBI PRASAD.—(Born 6th December, 1828.)—Joined the service as a clerk in the office of Superintendent of Embankments and Irrigation in Rohilkhand on a salary of Rs. 40 per mensem, January, 1849; after serving in this post for about 14 months, resigned it, and was out of employ for only a short time when he rejoined the service as Naib-Serishtadar at Pilibhit in the establishment of the Bareilly Collectorate on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, April, 1850; served for about two or three months in this capacity when he joined the Educational Department as a Zila Visitor of Schools in the Farukhabad district on Rs. 100 per mensem in June or July, 1850 (which was subsequently raised to Rs. 120 per mensem). In October, 1854, he was deputed especially to enquire about the state of education in Jhānsi and Jalaun districts, and having completed the work, reverted to his post of Zila Visitor sometime in April, 1855; continued to serve in the Educational Department, till the beginning of the year 1856, when he was appointed a Tahsildar, 1st grade, on Rs. 200 per mensem, in the Banda district (1st March, 1856). In October of the same year he was especially appointed Examiner of Tahsili Amlas and Patwāris in the Rohilkhand, Delhi, and Meerut Divisions on a salary of Rs. 225 per mensem. While still serving in this latter capacity, he was appointed, under orders of 9th June, 1857, as a Deputy Collector of Mandla, now in the Central Provinces, on Rs. 400 per mensem, and was on his way to that place, when, on account of the state of the country, owing to the occurrence of the mutiny, he could not proceed further than Fatehgarh, where he arrived on the 16th June following. The Officer Commanding the troops then stopped him there, and reported to Government that he should remain in that station. Here, then, he remained as an Extra Deputy Collector on Rs. 250 per mensem till the 23rd January, 1858, when he was ordered to accompany Mr. C. Raikes, of the Civil Service, with His Excellency the Commander-in-Chief's camp. On return from this special duty, he was appointed, under orders of 1st May, 1858, to be a Deputy Collector of the then 3rd grade on Rs. 250 per mensem, and posted to Azamgarh, where he joined on the 25th August following; transferred to Jaunpur in the same capacity, 21st February, 1859; deputed to Banda to aid in the work of revision of settlement, 22nd March, 1859; resumed charge at Jaunpur, 1st August, 1859; transferred to Etah, but placed on special duty at Cawnpore, 1st June, 1860; *privilege leave from 2nd September to 1st December, 1860*; joined his appointment at Etah, 2nd December, 1860; transferred to Bijnor, 5th December, 1862; invested with the duties of an Income-tax Assessor in that district, 7th February, 1863; *privilege leave from 16th December, 1863 to 15th February, 1864*; transferred in the same capacity to Mainpuri, 4th April, 1864; invested with the full powers of a Magistrate as described in section 22, Act XXV., 1861, 2nd July, 1864; promoted to the then 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors from 16th March, 1865; transferred to Ghāzipur in the Settlement Department, 26th March, 1866; reverted to district work, 25th March, 1868; appointed Deputy Collector of the new 3rd grade on Rs. 400 per mensem, 26th August, 1868; *privilege leave from 29th September to 17th December, 1868, and from 20th January to 28th February, 1870*; transferred to Muttra, 9th April, 1872; *privilege leave from 22nd October to 21st December, 1874*; promoted to the 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors from 8th March, 1875; *privilege leave from 21st February to 12th April, 1877*; transferred to Aligarh, 20th November, 1879; *privilege leave from 17th April to 15th July, 1880*; transferred to Budaun, 16th July, 1880; transferred to Muttra, 21st December, 1880; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of

Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 5th grade, on a salary of Rs. 600 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882; *privilege leave from 28th May to 1st July, 1883*; promoted to be a Deputy Collector of the 6th grade, from 1st April, 1883; *leave on private affairs for six months from 1st November, 1883.*

1847. MIRZA VIKAR ALI BEG.—(Born 2nd January, 1825.)—Joined the service as Naib-Kotwal of Meerut on a salary of Rs. 15 per mensem, 4th February, 1847; served in various ministerial capacities in the same district till he rose to be a Tahsildar of the 2nd grade, on Rs. 175 per mensem, at Agra, 19th July, 1856; appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the then 3rd grade on Rs. 250 per mensem, and posted to Agra, 9th June, 1857; *was apparently out of employ from 4th July, 1857 to 26th October, 1860*; appointed to officiate as Deputy Collector of Muzaffarnagar, 27th October, 1860; brought on the permanent list of Deputy Collectors of the then 3rd grade, 17th April, 1862; *privilege leave from 22nd August to 3rd September, 1863*; invested with the full powers of a Magistrate, 22nd June, 1864; *privilege leave from 23rd June to 9th July, 1865*; appointed to settlement duty in the Bareilly district, 9th February, 1866; promoted to the then 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors on Rs. 400 per mensem, 1st September, 1866; appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the new 3rd grade on Rs. 400 per mensem, 26th August, 1868; *privilege leave from 18th October to 24th November, 1868*; from 1st to 31st January, 1870; and from 26th July to 19th August, 1871; transferred from settlement to district work from 19th January, 1873, and posted to Saharanpur, where he joined on the 27th idem; *privilege leave from 27th November, 1874 to 9th January, 1875*; promoted to the 2nd grade of Deputy Collectors from 8th October, 1875; *privilege leave from 18th October to 17th December, 1881*; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 5th grade on a salary of Rs. 600 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; promoted to be Deputy Collector, 6th grade, 1st July, 1883; transferred to Benares, 17th July, 1883.

MUNSHI INAIAT HUSAIN KHAN.—(Born in September, 1834, date unknown).—Joined the service as Peshkar or Naib-Tahsildár of Banda, on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, 27th May, 1850; served continuously in several districts of the North-Western Provinces, in the capacity of Naib-Tahsildar, and afterwards as Tahsildár till the 8th July, 1869, when he was appointed to officiate as Deputy Collector of Bijoor, and invested with the powers of a Sub-Magistrate of the 2nd class, under section 22, Act XXV. of 1861, 15th July, 1869; invested with the powers of a Sub-Magistrate of the 1st class, 13th November, 1869; *leave on medical certificate from 8th to 15th March, 1873*; services placed at the disposal of the Government of Bengal for employment on famine duty in Behar, March, 1874; posted to Darbhan-

**SPECIAL SERVICE.**—During the Indian Mutiny of 1857, while Tahsildár of Jalaun, Munshi Inayat Husain Khan conducted himself nobly in standing by the side of the British Government; in keeping his tahsili in order, and in hospitably entertaining a party of fugitives from Cawnpore. In recognition of this excellent conduct, the Government granted him a bungalow situated at Bánda yielding a rent of Rs. 100 per mensem.

**1846. **1851. PANDIT GOPAL RAO.**—(Born, 2nd September, 1830.)—Joined the service as

a Parwana Navis in the office of the Deputy Commissioner of Saugor in the Central Provinces, then attached to the North-Western Provinces on a salary of Rs. 10 per mensem, sometime in 1851. Served afterwards in various ministerial capacities in several districts, specially in the Jhansi Division, rising gradually to the post of Judicial Serishtadar of the Deputy Commissioner's office, Jhansi, till June, 1857, when the mutiny broke out. On the restoration of peace, sometime in 1858, he was reinstated in his appointment of Judicial Serishtadar of the Deputy Commissioner's Office, Jhansi, on Rs. 80 per mensem; served again afterwards in various ministerial capacities, now and then officiating as a Tahsildar till the 27th October, 1864, when he resigned the Government service, having obtained an appointment in the Gwalior Darbar.

**SPECIAL SERVICE.**—During the disturbances of 1857, Pandit Gopal Rao proved himself very faithful; and in recognition of the loyal services rendered by him to the State, the Government was pleased to confer on him a reward of Rs. 1,000 as *khillat* and two villages, Etaura and Akbarpur, situated in the district of Jalaun, as *ubari* for life.

SHAIKH INTIZAM-UD-DIN.**—(Born 13th February, 1838.)—Joined the service as a Judicial Muharrir of the Etah district, on a salary of Rs. 10 per mensem, 19th October, 1855; gradually rose to be Peshkar of Akhrabad tahsil, zila Aligarh, 13th January, 1859; *put out of employ, 1st May, 1862*; rejoined the service as an Inspector of Police, zila Budaun, on Rs. 70 per mensem, 9th July, 1862; gradually rose to be a Tahsildar of the 2nd grade, zila Bareilly, on Rs. 175 per mensem, 23rd August, 1875; appointed to be a Supernumerary Deputy Collector, and posted to Banda for employment in the settlement work of that district, 25th October, 1876; transferred to district work and posted to Etawah, 7th December, 1879; transferred to Gorakhpur, 28th March, 1881; transferred to Basti, December, 1881; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 2nd grade, on a salary of Rs. 300 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; *privilege leave from 26th April to 25th July, 1882*; on expiry of leave, transferred to Cawnpore, 26th July, 1882; under section 23, Act XII. of 1881, invested with powers to remit or suspend rent in the villages of Akbarpur and Derapur of the Cawnpore district, the crops of which were damaged by hail on the 5th March, 1883, 5th April, 1883.

**1860. MUNSHI MANZUR AHMAD.**—(Born 5th November, 1836.)—Joined the service as Acting Serishtadar of Settlement at Lalitpur on a salary of Rs. 20 per mensem, 27th December, 1860; served in various ministerial capacities in the several districts of the North-Western Provinces till he rose to be manager of all the estates under the Court of Wards in the district of Farukhabad on a salary of Rs. 225 per mensem, 15th April, 1870; transferred as Tahsildar and Sub-Registrar to the Tahsil of Tirwa at the same time as manager of the Tirwa Estate under the Court of Wards on a salary of Rs. 275 per mensem; appointed manager of the Tirwa Estate under the Court of Wards on a salary of Rs. 300 per mensem (one-fifth of which salary was paid to Government in order to keep up the right of pension); on the estate being cleared from the care of the Court of Wards, reverted to his former appointment as Tahsildar of the first grade and Sub Registrar of Tahsil Kaimganj on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, 24th January, 1877; officiating Deputy Collector, Farukhabad, 14th March, 1877; transferred to Shāhjahānpur, 29th May, 1877; *privilege leave from 22nd May to 27th June, 1878*; and from 10th to 24th March, 1880; on the reorganization of the executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a probationary Deputy Collector of the 2nd grade, on a salary of Rs. 300 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; transferred to Gorakhpur, July, 1883; confirmed as a Deputy Collector, 2nd grade, 15th August, 1883.

BABU GOBIND CHANDAR BHATTACHARJI.**—(Born sometime at the close of January, 1829, date unknown.)—Joined the service as a Clerk in the office of Collector of Banda on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, 12th January, 1852; gradually rose to be Head-clerk of the Collector's office at Allahabad on a salary of Rs. 150 per mensem (which was raised to Rs. 200 per mensem in 1871 under Mr. Cust's scheme), 25th May, 1858; appointed to officiate as a Deputy Collector and posted to Allahabad, 8th May, 1877; reverted to his substantive appointment of Head-clerk, 8th August, 1877; Officiating Deputy Collector of Moradabad, 17th September, 1877; *privilege leave from 25th October to 24th December, 1878*; transferred to Meerut, 25th December, 1878; transferred to Cawnpore, 14th April, 1879; appointed substantively, *pro tempore*, Deputy Collector from 1st August, 1880; *privilege leave from 12th April to 11th July, 1881*; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 2nd grade, on a salary of Rs. 300 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; passed the departmental examination in Vernacular, 18th January, 1883; transferred to Mainpuri, 9th March, 1883; under Section 37, Act X. of 1882, invested with the powers described in Section 206 of that Act to commit persons for trial to the Court of Sessions for any offence triable by such Court, 8th August, 1883.

1856. MUNSHI NAGESHWAR PRASAD.—(Born sometime in 1832, date unknown.)

—Joined the service as *Sarbarikar* in the Gorakhpur Collectorate on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, 2nd April, 1856; gradually rose to be a *Tahsildar* of the 1st grade, Ballia, in the Ghazipur district, on Rs. 200 per mensem, 1st April, 1871; was in charge of the settlement of Kherowra taluqa, in the Ghazipur district, from 25th March to 16th April, 1873, and from 1st December, 1873 to 30th April, 1874; reverted to his substantive appointment of *Tahsildar* from 1st May, 1874; appointed to be a *Supernumerary Deputy Collector* for employment in settlement work in the Ghazipur district, 28th August, 1875; reverted to his substantive appointment of *Tahsildar* from 1st February, 1876; appointed to be a *supernumerary Deputy Collector* for employment in the settlement work of Ghazipur district with effect from 8th October, 1878, but actually received charge on the 4th February, 1879; *privilege leave* from 20th June to 2nd July, 1880; transferred from Ghazipur to Ballia for settlement work of the latter district, 13th August, 1880; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard in Judicial and by the lower standard in Revenue, 5th July, 1882; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 2nd grade (on probation), on a salary of Rs. 300 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard in Revenue and in Police, 18th January, 1883; confirmed as Deputy Collector, 2nd grade, 30th January, 1884.

1869. PANDIT BHAWANI DAT JOSHI.—(Born 15th October, 1847.)—Joined the

service as *Naib Serishtadar* in the Court of the Commissioner of Kumaon, on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem, 6th February, 1869; appointed *Munsarim* in the office of Senior Assistant Commissioner of Almora, on a salary of Rs. 100 per mensem, 1st November, 1871; appointed to officiate as *Sadder Amin* of Almora, 4th August, 1875; reverted to *Munsarim*, 27th August, 1875; Officiating Extra Assistant Commissioner, Garhwál, 24th April, 1876; passed the departmental examination by the lower standard in Judicial and in Police, 23rd July, 1877; invested with the powers of Assistant Commissioner, 1st class, 27th August, 1877; passed the examination by the higher standard in the Revenue and in Judicial, 3rd December, 1877; confirmed in the appointment of Extra Assistant Commissioner of Garhwál, 26th January, 1878; transferred to Almora, 21st April, 1878; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882.

1855. PANDIT GANGA DAT UPRETI.—(Born 1st December, 1834.)—Joined the

service as 4th Clerk in the Office of Senior Assistant Commissioner of Almora, on a salary of Rs. 25 per mensem, 1st July, 1855; transferred to the office of Senior Assistant Commissioner of Garhwál, on an increased pay of Rs. 50 per mensem, 11th April, 1856; gradually rose to be Head-clerk in the same office, on Rs. 80 per mensem, 1st February, 1869; appointed to be *Sudder Amin* of Garhwál, on a salary of Rs. 200 per mensem, and invested with the powers of a Sub-Magistrate of the 2nd class as described in section 22 of Act XXV. of 1861, 1st November, 1872; appointed to be Extra Assistant Commissioner of Garhwál, on Rs. 250 per mensem, 15th April, 1878; held charge of the office of Senior Assistant Commissioner, Garhwál, from 1st to 31st May, 1878; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade, on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; invested with the powers of a Magistrate of the 1st class, 5th July, 1882.

1858. MUNSHI RAGHUBAR DAYAL.—(Born 16th April, 1841.)—Joined the

service as an English clerk in the 3rd Oudh Police Infantry, on a salary of Rs. 40 per mensem, 21st May, 1858; served in two or three more districts in the same capacity, till the 21st April, 1860, when he was put out of employ; remained out of employ from 22nd April to 2nd October, 1860; appointed 3rd clerk in the Deputy Commissioner's office at Kheri, on a salary of Rs. 60 per mensem, 3rd October, 1860; served continuously in various ministerial capacities in the several districts of Oudh in the Police, Revenue, and Judicial Departments, till the 25th June, 1879, when he was appointed to officiate as Extra Assistant Commissioner, and posted to Lucknow, 26th June, 1879; Officiating *Munsif* of Malhabad (Lucknow), 1st August, 1879, Officiating Extra Assistant Commissioner, 6th grade, Rae Bareilly, 2nd September, 1879. On the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882; promoted to 2nd grade from 27th August, 1882; invested with powers to pass sentences



of whipping under section 37, Act X. of 1882; 1st August, 1883, *privilege leave from 26th October to November, 1883*; on return from leave posted to Sultanpur, where he took charge on 19th December, 1883; invested with the powers of a Magistrate, 1st class, 6th December, 1883.

**WAR SERVICE.**—Served with the 3rd Oudh Police Infantry Regiment, when engaged in the actions of Sandila, Rahimabad, and Birwa, in 1858.

**1856. MUNSHI GANPAT RAE.**—(Born 27th September, 1836.)—Joined the service as a Muharrir in Thana Khusrro in the district of Rawal Pindi in the Panjab, on a salary of Rs. 15 per mensem, February, 1856; served afterwards in various ministerial capacities both in the Civil and Military Departments in the Panjab and Oudh till the 28th September, 1860, when he was brought under reduction. **1856. MUNSHI MAHADEO PRASAD.**—(Born 25th April, 1835.)—Joined the service as acting Muharrir of the Settlement Office at Fyzabad, on a salary of Rs. 10 per mensem, 30th June, 1856; confirmed in the above appointment of Rs. 15 per mensem, 10th July, 1856; was obliged to quit his post on account of the mutiny, and remained *without employ from 9th June, 1859 to 18th October, 1858*; when he again joined the Fyzabad Settlement Office, and was forthwith admitted as a deposition writer on a salary of Rs. 15 per mensem, 19th October, 1858; served afterwards in various ministerial capacities till he rose to be a Tahsildar of the 2nd grade, on the 12th August, 1878; during this long period of ministerial employment, enjoyed the following leave on medical certificate, *viz., from 19th August to 24th October, 1858*; 14th to 20th October, 1859; from 13th February to 28th July, 1861; *two months in May and June, 1865*; and *about a week in October, 1865*; appointed to officiate as an Extra Assistant Commissioner, Unao, 2nd July, 1879; transferred to Gonda, 29th May, 1880; *leave without pay, from 9th September to 8th November, 1880*; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade, on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; transferred to Fyzabad, 26th September, 1882; transferred to Bara Banki, 10th November, 1882; promoted to 2nd grade from 24th November, 1882.

**1859. MUNSHI TAJAMMUL HUSAIN.**—(Born 1st January, 1838.)—Joined the service as acting Italiq Navis in the Deputy Commissioner's office at Partabgarh, on a salary of Rs. 15 per mensem, 30th September, 1859; rose gradually to be a Tahsildar of the 3rd grade, on Rs. 150 per mensem, 14th December, 1874; appointed to officiate as Extra Assistant Commissioner, Lucknow, 10th July, 1879; transferred to Bara Banki, 29th January, 1880; *privilege leave from 16th November, 1880 to 2nd January, 1881*; transferred to Kheri, 3rd January, 1881; transferred to Rae Bareilly, 3rd October, 1881; transferred to Unao, 17th October, 1881. On the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade, on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882; *privilege leave from 29th September to 28th November, 1882*; promoted to 2nd grade from 26th November, 1882; placed on special duty at Unao, 20th March, 1883; *leave on medical certificate for 6 months, from 6th October, 1883*.

**1867. E. P. JACOB.**—(Born 28th January, 1848.)—Joined the service as 2nd clerk in the Settlement Office, Lucknow, on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem, 1st June, 1867; served afterwards in the capacity of a clerk in two or three mere Government offices; his services, however, being never continuous and always involving a break of one or two months on each occasion till the 1st April 1871, when he was appointed to officiate as Deputy Munsarim in the Judicial Commissioner's Office on Rs. 40 per mensem; appointed Sub-Registrar of Fyzabad, 1st July, 1871; appointed District Registrar of Fyzabad, 1st April, 1872; appointed to officiate temporarily as

Extra Assistant Commissioner, Fyzabad, in addition to his own duties, 16th August, 1869; reverted to District Registrar, Fyzabad, 2nd January, 1880; Officiating Extra Assistant Commissioner, Sultanpur, 18th March, 1880; transferred in the same capacity to Partabgarh, 15th July, 1880; transferred to Sultanpur, 16th July, 1881; transferred to Partabgarh, 27th March, 1883; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the 1st grade, on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from 1st April, 1882; *privilege leave from 3rd December, 1882 to 17th February, 1883*; transferred to Fyzabad, 18th February, 1883; promoted to 2nd grade from 3rd December, 1882; transferred to Sultanpur, 19th May, 1883.

1850. MIRZA NISAR ALI BEG.—(Born 10th June, 1832.)—Joined the service as a Pargana Visitor of Schools (now designated Sub-Deputy Inspector of Schools) in the Aligarh district on a salary of Rs. 20 per mensem, 2nd May, 1850; *obtained leave on private affairs on half pay for about three or four months in 1853, the exact date of which cannot now be ascertained*; served continuously in the Educational Department, in which he gradually rose to be a Deputy Inspector of Schools, on Rs. 70 per mensem in February, 1855, until the occurrence of the mutiny, when he fled from Bulandshahr, the district to which he was posted, and took refuge in the Agra Fort. In October, 1857, he again proceeded to Bulandshahr, and took charge of his duties. In December following he was put out of employ, and remained so till June, 1858, when he was appointed as Head Munshi of the Agra College on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem. From that time he served continuously in the Educational Department in several capacities, and on salaries varying from Rs. 50 to 120 per mensem, *enjoying leave on private affairs (from 10th December, 1873 to 24th May, 1874)* till the 18th November, 1879, when he was appointed to officiate as a Deputy Collector and posted to Fatehpur, 19th November, 1879; transferred in the same capacity to Basti, 2nd January, 1880; appointed to be an Extra Deputy Collector *sub pro tempore* from 1st April, 1881; on the reorganization of the uncovenanted executive staff of Deputy Collectors and Extra Assistant Commissioners in the North-Western Provinces and Oudh, appointed to be a Deputy Collector of the 1st grade, on probation, on a salary of Rs. 250 per mensem, with effect from the 1st April, 1882; invested with the powers of a Magistrate, 1st class, 1st July, 1882; passed the departmental examination in Police, 18th January, 1883; confirmed as Deputy Collector, 1st grade, from 29th March, 1883; promoted to be Deputy Collector, 2nd grade, 1st April, 1883; transferred to Sháhjahánpur, 4th December, 1883.

KUNWAR JWALA PRASAD.—(Date of birth not known.)—Joined the service as Officiating Deputy Collector, Budaun, 2nd January, 1882; appointed to officiate as an Extra Assistant Commissioner of the lowest grade, and posted to the Jhánsi district, May, 1882; under section 7, Act XVIII. of 1867, invested with the powers of a Tahsildár of the 2nd class, 15th June, 1882; appointed to be an Extra Assistant Commissioner, 1st grade, 4th October, 1882; transferred to Partabgarh, 29th November; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard in Judicial and by the higher standard in Revenue, as also in Police and Vernacular, 18th January, 1883; invested with the powers of a Magistrate, 2nd class, 16th March, 1883; *privilege leave from 20th to 31st July, 1883*; promoted to be a Deputy Collector and Extra Assistant Commissioner, 2nd grade, from 1st July, 1883; invested with powers described in section 206 of Act X. of 1883 to

commit persons for trial to the Court of Sessions for any offences triable by such Court, 25th October, 1883.

1870. **MUNSHI BHAWANI SAHAY.**—(Born 1st October, 1850.)—Joined the service as officiating Darogah of Abkari in the Mirzapur district on a salary of Rs. 50 per mensem, 12th July, 1870; services dispensed with from 11th August, 1870; *remained without employ from 11th to 18th August, 1870*; appointed Income Tax Clerk, on a salary of Rs. 30 per mensem, 18th August, 1870; officiated as Mir Munshi, Commissioner's Office, Patna, from 22nd August, 1870 to 15th March, 1871; *remained without employ from 16th March to 12th December, 1871*; appointed Naib Tahsildár, 3rd grade, Saháranpur, 13th December, 1871; promoted to the 1st grade, 18th February, 1872; appointed officiating Tahsildár, Kírwí, in the Banda district, 22nd March, 1876; appointed Tahsildár on probation, 25th July, 1876; *privilege leave for 10 days in October, 1876*; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard in Revenue, lower standard in Judicial, in Police and Hindi in the year 1877; confirmed as Tahsildár, 3rd grade, 15th February, 1878; promoted to the 2nd grade, 1st April, 1880; promoted to the 1st grade, 14th July, 1880; appointed officiating Deputy Collector, Fatehpur, 16th October, 1880; reverted to his substantive appointment of Tahsildár, 16th November, 1880; officiating Deputy Collector, Fatehpur, 27th February, 1882; reverted to his substantive appointment of Tahsildár, 2nd April, 1882; officiating Deputy Collector, Jaunpur, 1st May, 1882; transferred to Allahabad, 24th July, 1882; placed in temporary charge of the Allahabad Treasury, 8th November, 1882; *privilege leave from 18th September to 16th October, 1882*; passed the departmental examination by the higher standard in Judicial, 18th January, 1883; invested with powers described in section 100, Act XII. of 1881; invested with the powers of a Magistrate, 1st class, 13th March, 1883; confirmed as Deputy Collector, 1st grade, 24th November, 1882; promoted to be Deputy Collector, 2nd grade, 8th July, 1883.

1865. **PANDIT JAI NARAYAN.**—(Born 24th January, 1830.)—Joined the service as an Izhar Navis in the Faujdari Court at Lucknow on a salary of Rs. 20 per mensem, 7th November, 1856; served afterwards in various ministerial capacities in the districts of Lucknow and Partabgarh, till he gradually rose to the position of Tahsildár, 3rd grade, at Salone in the latter district on a salary of Rs. 150 per mensem, 15th July, 1861; transferred to Rae Bareli, 25th June, 1872; promoted to be Tahsildár, 2nd grade, 25th October, 1873; transferred to the Sadar station of Partabgarh, and promoted to 1st grade, 16th July, 1877; transferred to Rae Bareli, 23rd April, 1879; appointed to officiate as an Extra Assistant Commissioner and posted to Sultanpur, 6th May, 1881; invested with the powers of a Magistrate, 1st class, 9th March, 1882; *privilege leave from 19th October to 14th November, 1882*; confirmed as Extra Assistant Commissioner, 1st grade, from 26th November, 1882; invested with the powers described in section 110 of Act X. of 1882 to take security for good behaviour from habitual offenders, 21st March, 1883; promoted to 2nd grade from 28th August, 1883.
