Was present at the skirmishes at Madrook, near Agra, about the 1st July, 1857; at the battles fought in and around Agra on the 5th July and 10th October following; and lastly, when Adjutant of the Military Police, at the several small actions in Bundelkhand, from August, 1858 to the close of 1861. (Indian Mutiny Medal.)

1859. JOHN SALISBURY HANNAGAN.—(Born 30th September, 1838.)—Joined the service as third clerk in the office of the Commissioner of Saugor and Nerbudda territories at Jabalpur on a salary of Rs. 130 per mensem,* 18th November, 1859; *leave on medical certificate from 1st May, 1861 to 18th October, 1861*; promoted to be Superintendent of Commissioner's office, Jabalpur Division, on Rs. 300 per mensem, 9th January, 1862; *privilege leave from 1st to 28th February, 1863*; from 15th December, 1864 to 14th January, 1865, and from 18th September to 17th October, 1866; *furlough in India from 1st May, 1871 to 12th April, 1872*; appointed Registrar of the Court of the Judicial Commissioner, Oudh, on Rs. 450 per mensem, 13th April, 1872; *privilege leave from 1st September to 31st October, 1875*; salary increased to Rs. 500 per mensem, 1st January, 1876; *subsidiary leave from 13th to 19th May, 1878*; *leave to Europe on medical certificate from 20th May, 1878 to 19th February, 1879*; *subsidiary leave from 20th to 24th February, 1879*; resumed charge of his office as Registrar, Judicial Commissioner's Court, Oudh, 25th February, 1879; appointed to be a Sub-Judge, 3rd grade, but continuing to act as Registrar, Judicial Commissioner's Court, Lucknow, 11th May, 1880; promoted to be Sub-Judge, 2nd grade, *sub. pro tem.*, from 13th July, 1881, and posted to Lucknow, where he received charge on the 18th July, 1881; confirmed as a Sub-Judge, 2nd grade, from 5th December, 1881; *privilege leave (including Christmas holidays) from 24th December, 1882 to 31st January, 1883*.

WAR SERVICES.—On outbreak of the mutiny, joined the troop of Civil Volunteers at Agra, which relieved certain Europeans beleagured in an indigo factory, and subsequently held Aligarh against mutineers; then he joined the Agra Militia Cavalry and served in the battle of the 5th July, 1857, at Agra against the Neemuch and Nasirabad Brigades, and the Kotah Contingent, in the action on the 24th August, 1857, with Ghazis and Oudh Irregular Cavalry near Aligarh, in the skirmish with rebels at Fatehpur Sikri in September or October, and on every other occasion in which the cavalry was engaged in the Agra, Muttra, and Aligarh districts. When the corps was broken up he joined the Meerut Light Horse and served in the Meerut and Bijnor districts till ill health compelled him to resign.—Received the mutiny medal.
