





Marefchaf de Tourville did indeed once venture out to Sea, hoping to flip away by the English; but Admiral Ruffel had to watchful en Eye upon him, that Tourville was forc'd to return into Port, leaving all this while, all the Coafts of France exposed to the Infults of the Two Maritime Powers. Nothing is more remarkabre in the whole Course of King William's Reign, than his Fleet riding triumphants and uncontroull'd in the Mediterranean; for thereby not only a Stop was put-to the conquering Arms of France in Chtalonia but all the Italian Princes were kept in Awe; and the caurious Venetians began-now to think of fending a folemn Embaffy into England, to court his Majesty's Friendshipe In 1697, he was created Baron of Shingey in the County of Cambridge, Vifcount Bargeur in the Dutchy of Normandy, and Earl of Orford in the County of Suffolk.
