George II.* The deceased Prince was in the Year 1716 elected Protestant, or Secular Bishop of *Osnabrug*, in the Room of the late Roman Catholick Bishop *Charles-Joseph* Prince of *Lorrain*, Elector of *Triers*, who dy'd the 4th of December 1715, pursuant to the XIIIth Article of the Treaty of *Osnabrug*, concluded at the same Time with, and confirm'd by the Treaty of *Munster*, wherein it was stipulated, ' That the said Bishoprick should be alternately possess'd by a Roman Catholick and a Protestant; in such a Manner, that when it should be the Turn of a Protestant, he should always be postulated, or chosen in the most Serene House of Duke *George* of *Brunswick-Lunenbourg*, at that Time (in the Year 1648) General of the Swedish Army; and that in Case the Male Issue of that Branch of the *Brunswick* Family should become extinct, the alternate Right to that Bishoprick should go to the Line of *Augustus* Duke

'Duke of *Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel*.' His Clemency, Beneficent Nature, Charity, and other Moral and Christian Virtues, made him equally beloved by his Roman Catholick, as well as Protestant Subjects, so that his Death was universally lamented. During his Government he settled a Salt Manufacture, which has been a great Advantage to the Country, and begun to erect a Ducal Palace, or Castle, call'd *Augustus-Burg*, which, however, is not yet wholly finish'd. His Revenues were not very considerable, but were manag'd with so good Economy, that 'tis reckon'd he dy'd worth 400,000 Crowns, the fourth Part of which he left to the Poor, and to each of his Servants a yearly Pension for their Lives. By his Death, our Regency saves 30,000 Crowns a-year, which he received as younger Brother of the most illustrious House of *Hanover*.

The Bill of Mortality for the Year 1728.

BY the General Bill of all the Burials in this City and Suburbs, from the 1st of December, 1727, to the 10th of December, 1728, it appears that in the 97 Parishes within the Walls were bury'd 2793.
