Pope Cament X. made him a Cardinal on the 2d of Fibruary, 1672. He was at the Time of his Election, Sub-Dean of the Sacred College, Bishop of Porto, Archbishop of Benevento, and Protector of the Order of the Canons Regular of St. Salomer. He was descended from a very ancient Family, which had given to the Church's Popes, and 34 Cardinals and to the State, a great Number or illustrious Men.

In 1706, her Majerry appointal him one of the Commissioners for treating of a further Union with Scotland; and in 1708, he was made Cuftos Rotulorum of the Shire of Radnor; in 1710, her Majerty made him one of the Commissioners of the Treasury, one of her Cabinet-Gouncil, and Chancellor,

and Under-Treasurer of the Exchanger. On the 8th of March, 1710-11, a Frenchman, wto went by the Name of Marquel's de Guiscard, attempted his Life by stab-bing him at the Council-Board, with a Penknife. In May following, the Queen created him a Peer of Grette Britain, by the Name, Style, and Title abovemention'd; and on the 29th of that Month, constituted him Lord High Treasurer of Great Britain. On the 26th of Ctrober, 1712, he was elected Knight Companion of the most noble Order of the Garter, install'd is August following at Windsor, and the same Year was chosen Governor of the South-Sea Company, of which he had been the chief Founder or Regulator: About the same Time he was also chosen one of Governors of the Charter-House. Soon after King George's Accession to the Throne, he was impeach'd by the House of Commons of His Treafon, and other High Crimes and Mildemeanors, and thereupon was fent to the Tower, where he con-tinu'd about 2 Years, when being brought to Try 1 by his Peers, he was acquitted of that Impeachment. During the Time he was Prime Minister, he was easy and difengag'd in private Conversation, with such a Weight of Affars upon his Shoulders. He was a Man of great Learning, and as great a Favourer and Protector of it. Intrepid by Nature, as well as by the Conscioutness of his own Integrity, and would have chosen rather to fall by an Impeachment, than to be fav'd by an Act of Grace: Sugacious to view onto the remotest Consequences of Things, by which an Difficulties fled before him. He was a courteous Neighbours a firm and affectionate Friend, and a kind, generous, and placable Enemy, facrificing his just Refentments not only to publick Good, but to common Intercession and Acknowledgement. He was a Despifer of Money, and what is yet most rare, an uncorrupt Minister of State. Howas twice marry'd: His first Wife was E'izabeth.
