It began in London at Eight of the Clock, fix Minutes, thirteeen Seconds, and ended at Ten of the Clock, twenty Minutes, fifteen Seconds: It was almost Central; for the whole Difficus of the Sun was totally immerfed or hid from Sight by the Difess of the Moon, for the Space of three Minutes, twenty-three Seconds; that is, from Nine of the Clock, nine Minutes, feventeen Secoulds, to Nine of the Clock, twelve Minutes forey Seconds. During the total Emersion, or Darkness, there appear'd a luminous Circle, round the Difess of the Moon, caus'd, as the Mathematicians agreed, by the Atmosphere of the Sun. Some Minutes before and after the total Darkness, not only the Planets, Supiter, Mercury, and Vemm, were feen Westward, of and about the same Height above the Horizon with the Sun; but feveral fix'd Stars were likewise discover'd. Before and during the total Dark-

Darkness, a prodigious damp Cold was felt, and the Light that then remain'd, had a bluish Cast, like that of Brandy burning in the Dark, and, like that too, made People look ghaftly: But in a few Minutes after the Emerfion of the Sun, from the total Dakness, which happen'd by a pert Flish of Light, than which nothing more glorious tan be imagin'd; the Air grew warns and as foon as the Echpie was ended, the Sky was overcast with Clouds. it was observed in the County what the Birds, and the cocky dow'd, and the Poultry went to rooft: And in Landon, Polerons and other Birds, were feen flutt'ring near the Tops of Houses, and even close to the Ground. This Eclipfe was feen at Edinburgh, but began and ended feven or eight Minutes fooner than at London; neither was it total there, not above ten Digits of the Difest of the Sun being darken'd at the Time of the greatest Obscuration.
