### THE ISSUE UNDER REVIEW

The prevailing note of discontent and disenchantment ceases to haunt the sylvan scene premises of the National Library with the advent of the year 1997. This is the glorious year when the nation was engrossed with chalking out colourful programmes to celebrate 50 years of India's Independence. The employees of the National Library were not lagging behind. They were found enthusiastic to carry on on eventful long list of programmes. A group of young, enthusiastic, energetic and devoted professional and non professional staff involved themselves in the meaninglful programmes. This reawakened flamboyant spirit gave a thrust to the heitherto dormant zeal of a vast working force of the Library. The fresh thinking and indomitable spirit of young guards appear to contribute to the revival of the institution. Let us help them to save the premier institution.

#### GIFT AND EXCHANGE DIVISION

This division was an integral part of the Acquisition Division of the National Library, Calcutta. Consequent upon expansion of its sphere of activities and importance, the Gift and Exchange Division was bifurcated from the Acquisition Division in 1973 and since then it received the status of a full fledged Division and has significantly contributed to enrich the Library collection.

The Division acquires reading materials for the National Library, Calcutta as gifts from individuals and institutions, and on exchange from libraries abroad. The National Library received sanction of the Government of India for purchasing Indian publications for exchange from 1st April 1961. Since then the gift and exchange programme expanded manifolds. However, the Cultural Exahange Programme is being finalised from the Department of Culture, Ministry of Human Resource Development, New Delhi. The Cultural Exchange Programme has two aspects:

- I. Exchange of Publications, and
- II. Exchange of library personnel
- (I) The National Library maintains book exchange relation with 211 institutions of 86 countries. It was receiving over 1200 books per year from libraries of erstwhile U.S.S.R. The number has sharply fallen after the collapse of Soviet Union. Nevertheless, from Bibliotheque Nationale, Paris the National Library receives over 200 books, over 60 to 70 books from other countries.

In exchange the National Library sends publications on Indian art, culture, Indian National Bibliography and other publications as requested for by the exchange partners abroad.

The National Library receives nearly 1000 books and 700 journals every year as gift mainly from the United States of America and partly from other countries. The Library has received manuscripts and very rare publications as gifts from distinguished personalities.

#### Some notable gifts received in the past are, namely:

- Sir Asutosh Mukherjee collection most splendid bequest, personal collection of Sir Asutosh Mukhopadhyay, came into the Library in 1949. Presently about 85,000 volumes cover the whole range of Humanities and the Sciences. The major portion of the collection consists of books on Law, European literature, Education, History and books and periodicals on Pure Sciences.
- J. N. Sarkar collection received in 1959 from the heirs of Late Sir Jadu Nath Sarkar. This rich collection consists of about 2500 items including printed books, journals, pamphlets and off-prints from journals, mss. and maps. It contains also some unpublished writings of Sir Jadu Nath.
- Buhar collection received in 1904 from the Jamindar of Buhar. It contains manuscripts and books in Arabic, Persian and Urdu.
- Vaiyapuri Pillai manuscripts collection received in 1960. The total number of its collection comprises 2943 books and manuscripts of which 265 are in palm leaves.

- Surendranath Sen collection received in 1960, consisting of 2,736 titles. Among these 2,307 items are in European languages and the rest in Indian languages covering almost all the major branches of Humanities.
- Sapru papers In 1952 the National Library received from the sons
  of Sir Tej Bahadur Sapru the magnificient gift of a dossier of their
  father's correspondence consisting of several thousand letters and
  other papers.
- Jibanananda Das collection received in 1979 and consisting of manusacripts of Late poet Jibananda Das with a file containing 14 poems.
- Kshiti Mohan Sen collection received from his son Shri Khemendra Mohan Sen. The collection consists of 326 books, mainly in Bengali by and on Rabindranath Tagore.
  - In addition there are several other collections available in the holdings of the National Library.
- (II) The National Library, Calcutta maintains exchange of library experts on reciprocal basis with the aim to promote exchange of library expertise and to strengthen cultural relations. There are 20 such countries with whom the National Library, Calcutta maintains exchange of experts. The records speak that quite a number of librarians and professional staff from this library have visited libraries and institutions abroad, had exchanged expertise through meetings with their counterparts from abroad under the Cultural Exchange Programme over the years.

#### LIBRARY CONFERENCES / SEMINARS

A workshop/training course on 'Preservation and conservation with communication channel' was held in the B.E. College, Botanical Garden, Howrah during May-June 1997. Smt. Malabika Ghosh, A.L.I.O./Chemist participated in the said course and presented papers on 6th May and 27 June 1997.

### HINDI WORKSHOP

A two day Hindi workshop was organised by the Hindi Cell of the National Library, Calcutta on 19th and 20th February, 1997 to remove hesitation in implementing Hindi in official work. The Director, National Library, Calcutta inaugurated the workshop. 18 members of staff were imparted training in the workshop.

### Mahasweta Devi — Commemoration

Mahasweta Debi, a celebrated Bengali writer, a recipient of Padmashree in 1986 and this year's Ramon Magsaysay award for excellence in literature and creative communication arts, was again honoured with Jnanpith Award earlier this year. The Library held an exhibition of books, journals and press clippings from 8 January 1997 to commemorate awards of Mahasweta Devi.

## Birth Centenary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose

The National Library, Calcutta observed the birth centenary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose on 20th January 1997. An exhibition of books and other documents in various Indian and foreign languages displaying life long achievements of Netaji was organised. The exhibition was inaugurated by Hon'ble Minister for Human Resource Development, Dr. S. R. Bommai in the presence of many distinguished personalities, readers and staff of the National Library, Calcutta.

In an extensive drive to collect books under the D.B. Act, Shri Safalya Nandi, incharge, Oriya Language Division, visited publishers in Cuttack, Bhubaneswar and Puri. In this drive one thousand seven hundred thirty books were collected for the National Library, Calcutta.
