

This is a classified catalogue in three parts, of books in the Asutosh Collection of the National Library. The first part relates to books which broadly fall under Class 700 of the Dewey Classification, *viz.*, Fine and Recreative Arts. A few books of the class 000 of the same classification scheme comprising rare illustrations and reproductions of illuminated books, manuscripts, and bookplates are included in the second part. Such of the biographies of the artists as the Collection has form the third part. The alphabetical index covers all the three sections of the classified catalogue. The third summary of the Dewey Schedules (14th ed.) pertinent to this catalogue is given on p. (ii).
