Served afterwards in the American war, and was present at the battle of Bladensburg and capture of Washington. Slightly wounded in the head and very severely in the groin at Bladensburg. He received the war medal with seven clasps. Commanded the Light Division throughout the Eastern campaign of 1854-5, including the battles of the Alma (horse shot under him), Balaklava, and Inkerman (severely wounded—shot through the arm), and siege of Sebastopol (medal and four clasps, G.C.B., Grand Cross of the Legion of Honour, 1st class of the Medjidie, Sardinian and Turkish medals); appointed Commander of the Forces in Ireland, March, 1860; in 1863 he became Colonel-in-Chief of the Rifle Brigade; died at Linkwood, 27th Aug., 1865.

He continued in command of the 52nd Regt. till 1839, when he retired on h.-p.; General Lord Hill, then commanding the army, remarking that, "after commanding Regts. for more than a quarter of a century, he was at liberty to do what he thought proper." He became Major-General in 1841, and Lieutenant-General in 1851, and was appointed to the command of the troops at Malta in 1852, where he was stationed during the early part of the Crimean war, his inability from the diseased state of his lungs, caused by a former wound, alone preventing him from again volunteering his services in the field. He received the thanks of the Duke of Newcastle for the manner in which he provided for the troops in Malta, in which he was so zealously and ably assisted by the Governor, Sir William Reid, and Admiral Sir Houston Stuart. He was Governor and Commander-in-Chief at Gibraltar, where he remained until 1859, when his increasing infirmity obliged him to apply to be relieved. Appointed Colonel of the 43rd, 26th March, 1850; he became General on the 21st of Feb., 1860. He received the gold medal for Badajoz as senior surviving Officer of the Light Division storming party; he also received the silver war medal with eight clasps; died at Bath, 4th Sept., 1865.

In 1816 proceeded to Van Diemen's Land as governor, and during the period of eight years, in which he conducted the affairs of that rising Colony, he secured the full approbation of the Government at home. The following extracts from Mr. Montgomery Martin's work, 'Van Diemen's Land, Moral, Physical, and Political,' will shew how highly his character was appreciated in his public capacity by the colonists themselves:—"Courteous and affable, he won 'golden opinions' from all sorts of people; secured the universal affection and esteem; whilst his readiness to correct abuse or error—which his clear and comprehensive mind easily traced to its source—rendered his popularity as unbounded as it was merited. Prior to his embarkation for England, an address expressive of the most affectionate attachment, and recapitulating the numerous benefits he had secured for the land he had for several years ruled, was presented, to which a suitable and earnest reply was returned. Each colonist seemed as if he were losing a cherished personal friend. The people followed him <i>en masse</i> to the shore, all eager to manifest their regard." Died 4th June, 1848.
