inaugurated the upgraded Next Generation Sequencing facility at the Southern Regional Centre's DNA laboratory, in presence of NAC members. This facility will not only fasten the pace of its output, but to take up a study of the Anthropologically significant communities to understand the still enigmatic peopling of India.

Over the past few decades, many developments have changed the way Anthropology is practiced. There is a paradigm shift in Physical / Biological Anthropology by adopting methods of Molecular Biology. Some important publications by the An.S.I. on the "New Genetics" have been brought out in peer reviewed journals.

Field studies as part of 'Village Study' are in full swing. One day demonstration-cum-workshop, on "Tribal Ways of Environment Management", a four day in-house Orientation Course-cum-Workshop on Genetic sequencing for fifteen young researchers and initiation of the Rann of Kutch Biosphere reserve study are highlights of this quarter. In addition to observing World Environment Day, International Museum day and World Indigenous Day, documentation activities and a Tribal Dance Festival of the western & central India organized by the Central Regional Centre were part of An.S.I.'s out reach activities.

With more news on our activities, we would bring out another edition of our Newsletter shortly.

RESEARCH UPDATE

Bio-cultural Diversity, Environment and Sustainable Development

Envisaging the main objectives and expected target for the project, the second phase of fieldwork was continued at all the selected locations, including Sardi of Chhattisgarh, Kapileswar of Odisha, Chowra Island, Central Nicobar and Jaurasi of Gwalior district, Madhya Pradesh.

Reconnoitre study was undertaken in the villages of Sultanpur, Madhopura (Senapur) and Lakhamandal (North West Region), Radhvanaj, Kheda district, Kasandra, Ahmedabad district and Jambur, Gir Somnath district (Western Region) and Ghagra, Jharkhand (Eastern Region).

Reports on Kuotala of Birbhum district (West Bengal), Anjan of Jharkhand, Idukki village of Kerala, Lingthen village of North Sikkim and Parsa, a Mithila village of Bihar (reconnoitre study) have been submitted while the report on Rampura, Mysore district is in progress.

An Ethnographic Study of Shompen

Fieldwork for the regional project "An Ethnographic Study of Shompen" in the Great Nicobar Island has been undertaken by a team of research personnel.

Man and Environment

Fifteen day reconnoitre tour to the Rann of Kutch villages, Gujarat was completed in pursuance of the 'Rann of Kutch Biosphere Reserve Study' by a team of research personnel.

Bio-cultural Adaptation: Community Health & Lifestyle Diseases

A science awareness camp and exhibition was organized under the project, 'Bio-cultural Adaptation: Community Health & Lifestyle Diseases like Diabetes, Obesity & Hypertension' by a team of research personnel of the An.S.I. after a popular lecture at the Rishra Institute, Rishra of Hooghly district, West Bengal on 5th June.

Standardization of Rsa-Rsa-D, B-Hinf is being continued and the dilutions of Nihal, Abhujmaria and Korku community samples are in progress under the 'Community Genetics and Health: Human Genetics Extension Programme.

Editing of Mt-DNA analysis of Bidar case/control sequenced data is in progress under the Community Genetics & Health: Bio-cultural Adaptation.

Andaman and Nicobar Regional Centre, Port Blair of the Survey has organized an awareness programme on the haemoglobinopathies among local students and Ashram school boarders.

Physical Growth and Development of Children in North East India

Fieldwork was undertaken in the Ri-Bhoi district of Meghalaya covering three Garo villages, Philiang Kata, Nongspung and Behenadi.

DNA Polymorphism of the Contemporary Indian Populations

Massive screening of mt-DNA sequencing work for 24 primer

sets is in progress in the DNA laboratory of the SRC, Mysore. So far, 25 communities have been covered for wet lab analysis. More than 250 plates from about ten communities were made ready and sequencing of these plates is in progress. Editing of sequences has also been taken up for some communities. PCR work on Konda Reddy, Naika and Jaunsari community samples is also in progress.

Work related to ALU insertion primers in the DNA laboratory of the NWRC, Dehradun is under progress while DNA isolation, quantification, serum isolation, Haematology analysis, ALU insertion polymorphism through PCR are being continued.

Traditional Craft of Tamta

Fieldwork has been undertaken in Almora district to collect information on the traditional craft work of Tamta of Uttarakhand, for organizing a workshop in Dehradun.

Documentation & Dissemination

A reconnoitre tour was undertaken to Kala Nabagram village of Burdwan district (West Bengal) for the visual coverage of Kora tribal group in connection with a photographic exhibition to be organized during the 'International Day of World's Indigenous People'.

A team of researchers from the An.S.I. Head Office has proceeded on tour to the Mon district of Nagaland, for audio-visual documentation of Konyak community culture, as a TSP programme.

Tribal Ways of Environment Management

One day training-cum-demonstration programme was organised on 'Tribal Ways of Environment Management' in collaboration with the Indian Institute of Bio-Social Research & Development, Kolkata on 6th June.
