## The Chakyar Families

## PAINKULAM RAMA CHAKYAR

- n the old days, there were eighteen Chakyar families. Their names are given below:

  1. Kuttancherry (near Nelluvay): This family did not have relation with any of the other families.
- Ammannur: Originally belonged to Pattambi; they shifted to Muzhikulam and then to Irinjalakkuda.
- 3. Paravur: Belonged to Paravur, but subsequently was merged with Ammannur family.
  - 4. Koypa: Originally from Vanneri region, but now settled in Painkulam.
- 5. Pantallur: The original station is Eranad, but now settled in Perumanam. They merged with Koypa.
  - 6. Mekkad: Originally belonged to Annamanada.
  - 7. Valia Parisha: Ancestral family was Kidangur.
  - 8. Ambalappuzha: From Ambalappuzha itself.
  - 9. Kazhakkuttam: From Kazhakkuttam itself.

The families of Mekkad, Valia Parisha, Ambalappuzha and Kazhakkuttam merged, and now the descendent stay in Kazhakkuttam.

- 10. Karttikamattam: Original family hails from the south-east of Perumbavur.
- Cheriya Parisha: Ancestral family from Kidangur. Karttikamattam and Cheriya Parisha became one, and was settled in Kidangur.
  - 12. Potiyil: Ancestral family belonged to the southern side of the Aluva river.
  - 13. Tottam: Originally from the north-eastern side of Trippunithura.
  - 14. Manganam: From the east of Kottayam.
  - 15. Evur: Near the Evur temple.

The families of Potivil, Tottam, Manganam and Evur became one.

- 16. Manalikkara (near Padmanabhapuram): Now the family is extinct. They used to possess the rights for temples like Tiruvattar. Now the properties and rights belong to Eramallur.
- 17. Perunchallur (near Talipparambu): Their properties and rights went to Mani Chakyar.
- 18. Taliyil (now extinct): Their performance rights were sustained once by Koypa and later by Mani.
