Juring the year the world of music mourned the loss of two eminent artists. On Lay 11, 1976 of Shri Jehangir han and on warch 18, 1977 of Sat. Siddeshwari Jevi. On each occasion the Akademi held a condolence meeting and conveyed its sympathies to the bereaved family.

Shri Jehangir Lhan was born in Varanesi in 1869. He began his training under his illustrious father Shri Ahmed Lhan. His later ustads were Shri Muberak Ahan, of Patha, and Ahalifa Abid husein Lhan, of Lucknow. He perfected the styles of Purab, lilli and Ajrada Baj he was appointed Court Lusician at Indore in 1911. He received the Akademi Award for Hindustani Lusic in 1959.

Smt. Sindeshwari Levi was trained by Shri Biyaji Maharaj, Ustand Enayat Lhan and Pandit Bade Ramdasji Maharaj and she was one of the foremost exponents of Thumri singing. She was adually renowned for her rendering of Ladra, Tappa Lajri and Chaiti. For several years she taught at the Mathak Landra, New Lelhi. She was honoured with the Amademi Award for hindustani Vocal Music in 1966.

The grademi pays homage to these stalwarts who contributed so richly to the field of music.

ORGANITATION - STRUCTURE LA. UBJECTIVES

The sangert Natar Axademi is a national institution set up by the Govt. of India in 1953 for the promotion of the performing arts. It is registered under the Societies Registration Act 1860 and functions as an autonomous organisation.

The management of the Akademi is vested in the General Council. The general superintendence, direction and control of the affairs of the Akademi vest in the Executive Board which is in fact the governing body of the Akademi. The Chairman of the Akademi is the administrative head of the Akademi. Its principal executive officer is the Secretary, who is assisted by a Finance & Accounts Officer, four assistant Secretaries and other officers and staff. The Finance Committee, of which the Financial Adviser is ex-officio Chairman, assists the Executive Board in financial matters. The Akademi runs and fully finances with funds gain by the Government, two institutions, Jawanarlal Nehru Jance Akademy, Imphal and Kathak Kendra, New Delhi.

The objectives of the Akademi, the powers and functions of the General Council, the Executive Board and the Finance Committee are set out in the Aemorandum of Association. The Akademi acts at the national level for the fostering and promotion of Indian music, dance and drama in all their richness and variety, maintenance of standards of training in the field of the performing arts, giving recognition to outstanding artistes, and for reviving and preserving struggling forms of music, dance and drama.

on January 27, 1977. Inila taking note of the fact that the Council had to be re-constituted during the course of the year, it considered the practical difficulties involved in this stemming as they did from the existing Tules and Regulations. The Council therefore recommend to the Government that the tenure of the Members irrespective of the date on which each was nominated/elected/co-opted, be made effective from the date of the first Meeting of the Council in Lecember 1972. The Government however declined to accept the recommendation, for the Constitution of the Akademi as it stood did not have any provision for possible extension of the tenure of Members.

- 2. The Execution Board met twice during the year, once at Bengalore on July 15 & 16, 1976 and at New Jelhi on January 24 & 25, 1977.
- 3. The Finance Committee met on October 6, 1976. .
- 4. The Meeting of the Secretaries of State Akademis was held on the May 15 & 16, 1976, at Trichur, in Kerala.

The General Council of the Sangeet Natak Akademi at its meeting on January 27, 1977 selected 15 eminent artistes for Akademi Awards in the Fields of music, dance and drama. Two eminent persons were chosen for the Fellowship of the Akademi. In break-up, 7 artistes received the Award for music, 4 for dance and 4 for drame. And for the first time, the Akademi gave two posthumous Awards, one to Shri Gopal Misra, outstanding exponent of Sarangi, and the other to Shri C.T. Lhanolkar, clinent playwright in Marathi. Also, for the first time, a single Award was given to a husband-and-wife team, namely to Shri Ragmunath Panigrani and Smt. Sanjukta Panigrahi.

graphies on each subject of study. A special section on the study of Science and music is being built up.

A part of the reading room in the Library has been set aside for research scholars. This has proved of great use to serious students, both Indian and foreign.

The Lisc Library has proved to be popular with musicians, research scholars and lovers of music. It is constantly in use by visitors. 302 discs have been added on music of India and of other countries.

More rack pace has been made available so that the stacking and display of discs is much improved.

A discoraphy of Hindustani music has been brought out in cyclostyle form. This has proved of great help. It is intended to bring out more such discographies to cover Karnatak and other forms of music available in the Library.

ALL SENT MUSEUM AND GRADERY

Luring the year, Aseveri, the Museum of Musical Instruments, and Yavanika, the Gallery of Masks, Puppets and Costumes, continued to attract several visitors. Assearch scholars and students of Music and theatre visit these galleries regularly. Groups of school-children have also been brought to see the exhibits. Guided tours are arranged for all such visitors. Liscussion sessions for Musicologists and scholars from abroad were also held in the course of the year.

The Museums loaned objects to several institutions and performing groups for temporary display in Exhibition or for use in their productions.

The Akademi presented 3 Shadow Puppets (Karnataka) from its collection to the Smithsonian Institute, Washington, through the I.C.C.A. in connection with the U.S. Bicentenial Celebrations. The Prime Minister of India gifted two Indonesian musical instruments to the Asavari museum.

Efforts are being made to provide more space to increase the display of objects in the akademi collection.

FINANCIAL AGGISTANCE TO INSTITUTIONS

The Akademi continued to give financial assistance to institutions working in the fields of music, dance &

drama, during the year 1976-77. The total amount released to such institutions including the State Akademis by way of grant in aid was As. 5,76,430. ... list of the institutions to which grants were sanctioned during the year together with the amount and purpose for which these were sanctioned is at Appendix II.

apart from the above, a sum of As. 23,550 senctioned and disbursed out of the discretionary Grants placed at the disposal of the Vice-Chairman to experts/select organisations for meeting specific items of expenditure as per list at appendix III.

PUBLICATIONS

Publication of literature on music, dance and drame with a view to disseminate knowledge about these arts is one of the important activities of the Akademi. Apart from bringing out books on its own, the Akademi also provides financial assistance to institutions and individuals in bringing out deserving publications.

Financial assistance for publications is given on the basis of prescribed rules. Applications for publication grants, which are required to be accompanied by the manuscripts, are scrutinised in the first instance by the Publications Committee of the Akademi, a body of experts in the field. Special Projects in Music

The 300th Anniversary of the Great South Indian Composer, Shri Muthuswami likshitar, was celebrated throughout India. Besides covering select concerts, recordings of Shri likshitar's songs by eminent musicians like Smt. Pottomial, Shri Balamurali hrishna, India Grinivasa dao and Shri dajam Iyer have been made. An Anthology of 31 songs of the Composer in Hindustani notation is underspreparation.

2. The Haridase tradition of Karnataka is considered one of the most import fountainheads of Karnataka music. Luminaries like Purandaradasa, called the father of Karnataka Music, Kanakadasa have contributed richly to this tradition, which is about five centuries old. A number of such songs are sung not only in concerts but in temples, in ritual worship, and at homes. The Akademi has taken up a sohemeof recording these composers in as authentic a version as possible. A special Committee including some of our eminent Fellows and Awardees. is

cirecting this work, which is being carried out by the Karnatak Gana Kala Parishad of Bangalore with financial aid from the Akademi.

3) The Koln University, West Germany, sponsored in February 1976 a project of collecting common folk music forms of Andhra, Karnetak and Maharashtra. _r. B.C. Lav Asstt. Secretary (Music) of the Akademi assisted the visiting German scholar in this project. He was later invited by the Koln University, to conduct a Seminar for a Semester at the University.

FESTIVAL OF CONTARPO LAY IN IAN HALLET

Vith a view to determine the overall situation in respect of contemporary work in Indian ballet in the free dance style and stemming from the imposing success of the Festival of Contemorary Indian Ballet held by the Akalemi in 1975-76, the Akalemi presented this year a 4-day Festival of contemporary Indian Ballet in free Bance Style. This took place at the Lamani auditorium, New Jelni, from March 2 to 5, 1977. This offered representive works of 8 leading choreographers groups professing the free dance style.

FETTIVAL OF FOLL PETFORMING ARTS

With a view to make forms of the Indian traditional theatre wider known to the country, the Akademi
sponsored a Pestival of Folk Performing Arts covering
12 States of India. This was scheduled to be presented
at the Valluvar Lottam, Madras, from February 11 to 14,
1977. An exhibition of photographs on the Performing
Arts was also arranged for the occasion. The event had
been widely publicised and Madras was eagerly looking
forward to it. Unfortunately, however, on the morning
of the inaugural day of the Pestival Ashtrapati Ari
Fakhruddin Ali Ahmed passed away, with the result that
the whole Festival had to be cancelled. The Akademi
is however considering whether it could organise the
Festival again, at Madra, during 1977-78.

SECRETARIES OF STATE ANALESIS MINTING

The 7th meeting of the Excretaries of State

Akademis was held in Frichur in Lerala on the 15th &

16th May, 1976. The Kerala Sangeetha Nataka Akademi

The projects of the State akademis were discussed at the Meeting. The nature and content of the different Plan Schemes now being operated by the Central Akademi were also explained to the delegates. The assistance of the State Anademis was sought for the successful implementation of the Scheme whereever possible. The Scheme relating to the Promotion and Preservation of Hare Forms was specifically brought to their notice and the representatives of the State Akademis were requested to identify such of those forms facing extinction so that necessary assistance could be extended to them. Similarly, the Scheme relating to the award of Fellowships which was open to performers or teachers in the performing arts was also mentioned and the delegates were requested to make suitable suggestions for implementation of the Scheme.

PLAN 3CHEMES

the schemes in operation during the Fifth Five Year Plan.

1. Jocumentation, lesearch and Building up of Archives

This scheme operative in the Fifth Five Year Plan is in fact a continuation of two Plan Schemes implemented during the Fourth Five Year Plan period. The scope of the Johanne has been extended to bring under its fold the dissemination of cultural knowledge amongst the general public by producing audio-visual material like discs, slides-kits, photographic albums, monographs, etc.

Juring the period under report the Locumentation, Unit of the Akademi covered the following forms of folk and traditional performing arts. These forms were documented as 16 m.m. movie film, recording on audio-tapes and still photographs:

- 1) Pranled Nateka and Bherat Leala, two rare forms of folk theatre of Orissa;
- 2) Lairik Thiba Haiba of Manipur
- 3) Chandayani, a rare form of balled of Madhya Parlesh.
- 4) Folk Music of Himachal Pracesh
- 5) Lai Heroaba, a traditional dance of Manipur
- 6) Bhisma-Vijaya, Yakshagana
- 7) Interview with Prof. J. Ranade on Voice Culture

Besides documenting the above, the Unit was engaged in the preparation of wo shot filsm, namely, Chhaya Natak and Tribal and Folk Vances of India Part I, using erchival material in the Akademi:

2) desearch Unit in the Science of Lusic

The Major objective of the Scheme during the 4th Plan period was to initiate studies in the areas of

musical scales and psychological response to ragas. Further research is to be continued on tonal characteristics of musical instruments such as the flute, sarange Nagaswaram, Mridangam and Tabla. Mesearch is also to continue in the Physics, Physiology and Psychology of Music.

Juring the period under report, the deport on the Psychology of Music resulting from the Seminar organised in collaboration with the Poona University was brought out.

A Symposium on Musical Scales was arranged in cellaboration with the Karnataka Gana kala Parishad, Bangalore, on January 5th and 6th, 1977. The akademi deputes were in Lalmani Mishra of Banaras, in S. Ramanathan of Madurai, Shri S. Asmanathan of Tiruchi, Shri B.V. Krishnamoorthy, in Aaghavandrao dao and Shri Rajani Kant Rao, all of Bangalore. The Esstt. Becretary for Music also attended the Symposium.

3) Fellowship for specialised training in Music, ance and Jrama.

The Scheme was originally started during the 4th Five Year Plan on behalf of the Ministry of Education. It has now been continued in the 5th Five Year Plan as one of the "kedemi's Schemes. Under the Scheme, Fellos ships are offered to outstanding students in the fields of performing arts for advanced training under eminent gurus/institutions, to acquire a high degree of proficiency. The value of the Fellowship is As. 500 per month. The Guru also gets an equal amount. Each Fellow is also allowed a maximum amount of As. 1,000/-

per year for equipment.

Turing the year 1976-77, Fellowship were awarded for likshitar's compositions and Moodiyattam, and Scholarships for Loodiyattam and Mizhava.

Fellowships granted during 1976-77 will continue in 1977-78 in addition to those which may be identified in the course of the year.

4) Promotion and Preservation of dare Forms of Traditional Performing arts.

This is a new Scheme. The Scheme intends to put the ballet activity of the kendra on a sound professional footing and its objectives are to produce ballets and bring out randbooks for use by students of kathak. Juring the year two new ballets were produced.

6) Eallet Unit and publication of handbooks - Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Jance . kademy, Imphal

This is yet another new Scheme. The scheme envisages setting up of a small performing unit and

attaching it to the academy. Juring the year two new ballets were produced.

Karida addad - Institute of Kathak

The kathak Kendra is housed in the Bahavalpur House. It also runs a hostel which is located in the same premises. The hostel had 13 inmates during the year.

There were 38 new admissions during the year:
13 in the Elementary Course, 11 in the Three-year
siploma Course, 6 in the Special Course for dance, 5 in
music and 3 in Pakhawaj.

As on march 31, 1977, the Kendra had 54 students on its rolls; 19 in Elementary, 19 in the 3 year iploma, 9 in Special/dance, 4 in Thumri and 3 in Pakhawaj
There were 7 foreign students; two from United States,
one from France, one from mauritius and three from LatiAmerica. One of these students was on an ICCA scholarship.

There were 1? students in receipt of the kendra's Scholarship and 2 Government of India Scholars under the Young Workers Scheme. The amount of the kendra's Scholarship which used to be is. 100/- per month for the first two years and is. 200/- for the third year was raised to is. 300/- per month for residential students and is. 200/- per month for non-residential students.

4 students were in receipt of Freeship; two each in the Elementary and the Jiploma Courses.

4 students successfully completed the Liploma Course during the year. For the annual examinations there were two External Examiners for dance (Jr. S.K. Saxena of Lelhi University and Smt. Achini Bhate of Nritya Bharati, Poona) and one for Music (Smt. S. Mutatkar, Lean, Faculty of Music and Fine Arts, Lelhi University).

The Kendra organised an All-India Seminar on Presontation in Kathek at relai on Merch 10, 11, and 12. It was held under the Chairmanship of ir. Smt. Kapila Vatsyayan, and aminent Kathak artistes and scholars from different parts of the country attended it. They include Shri Gauri Shankar, Miss Sits Pooviah, Lumari Jamyanti Joshi, Smt. Sunayana Hazarilal and Shri Sun I Kothari from Bombay Smt. Achini Bhate from Poone, Smt. Lumudini Lakhie from Ahmedabal and Sari Birju Maharaj, Shri Kundaa Lal Gangani, Shri 3.4.3gxeng, 3mt. Rani Larna, Jr. Suresh Awasthi, Shri Munna Dal Shukla and Smt. Reba Vidyarthi from Selhi. There yere a number of observers from Bombay, Lucknow and Jelhi. Many promising young Kathak dencers and foreigners interested in or learning Kathak and the staff and the students of the Kendra also attended.

The Seminar discussed the following subjects in respect of Presentation in Asthek:

- 1. Sequence and arrangement of items
- 2. Costume
- Musical accompaniment

Papers were read by Ir. S.L. Saxena and Smt. Kumudini Lakhia. An exhibition of photographs was arranged on the occasion.

After the Jeminar a detailed deport was prepared.

Following a recommendation by the Workshop on Kathak held in March 1976, which was also endorsed by its advisory Committee, the Kendra started observing Bindadin Jayanti from this year. The Jayanti is celabrated on Basant Panchami day.

BALLET UNIT.

The Ballet Unit presented a new three-and-a-half hour ballet, Katha Anghunath Ki, based on Anmacharit manas and other writings of Tulsidas and a new composit programme, Jekho and Binda Sham, based on the compositions of Bindadin Makaraj.
