In the period reported, the Akademi mourned the passing of several eminent musicians, dancers and theatre workers, Awardees of past years.

Violinist Gajananrao Joshi passed away on 28 June 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1972. Krishna Chandra Naik, a choreographer and teacher of Mayurbhanj Chhau, died on 20 Aug. 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1975.

Vellinezhi K Nanu Nair, a noted exponent of Kathakali, died on 30 August 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1973. Guru Gopinath, an outstanding dancer and teacher of Kathakali, passed away on 9 October 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1965. Khaidem Lokeshwar Singh, an exponent of Manipuri dance, died on 27 October 1987;

he received the Akademi Award in 1985. Laxmi Narain Lal, Hindi playwright and critic, expired on 20 November 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1977. Emani Sankara Sastri, a noted vainika and orchestrator, passed away on 22 December 1987; he received the Akademi Award in 1973. S V Sahasranamam, an outstanding theatre artiste, passed away on 19 February 1988; he received the Akademi Award in 1967. M B Srinivasan, Director of the Madras Youth Choir, passed away on 9 March 1988; he received the Akademi award in 1986. S Ramanathan, a scholar and musician, died on 19 March 1988; he was elected fellow of the Akademi in 1986. Seerkazhi S Govindarajan, an eminent musician, died on 24 March 1988; he received the Akademi Award in 1980.

A constituent unit of Sangeet Natak Akademi, Kathak Kendra is among the leading dance-teaching institutions in the country. Set up in 1964, it offers several comprehensive courses in Kathak and allied subjects like vocal music and Pakhawaj. The courses are formulated as a foundation for professional artistes. The Kathak Kendra also has a Production Unit, a repertory company which through experimental work strives to enrich the repertoire and technique of Kathak. The Kendra has on its staff teachers of eminence in various disciplines.

The management of Kathak Kendra vests in the Executive Board of the Akademi which is assisted in its task by the Kendra's Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee in 1987-88 comprised Shri P V Krishnamoorthy, Chairman; members: Shri Jiwan Pani (Director, Kathak Kendra), Shri K S Kothari (Secretary, Sangeet Natak Akademi), Prof S K Saxena, Pandit Birju Maharaj, Shrimati Rohini Bhate, Shrimati Damayanti Joshi, Shrimati Kumudini Lakhia, Shrimati Maya Natarajan. During the year the Committee met twice—on 15 May and 5 December 1987.

Students/Courses

The Kendra had 176 students on roll this year (including 12 foreign students) for the seven courses it offers: a five-year Foundation Course; three-year Diploma (Pass) and Honours Courses; Specialization Courses in dance, vocal music and Pakhawaj; and a Refresher Course in Kathak.

Dikshantotsava was held 2-5 May 1988 at Triveni Kala Sangam. The programme marks the end of the Kendra session and features final-year Kathak students who perform before examiners and an invited audience. Twenty-two 'finalists' performed this year.

Teaching Faculty

The teaching faculty comprises Pandit Birju Maharaj, Pradhyapak : Durga Lal, Sahachari Pradhyapak; Mannu Lal Shukla, Kathak Guru; Reba Vidyarthi, Kathak Guru; Bharati Gupta, Varishtha Kathak Prashikshika; Geetanjali Lal, Kathak Prashikshika; Rajendra Kumar Gangani, Kathak Prashikshak; Sunil Misra, Tabla Prashikshak; Irene Roy Choudhury, Gayan Prashikshika; Ram Kishore Das, Pakhawaj Prashikshak; and Nisha Mahajan, Yoga Prashikshika.

Production Unit

The Production Unit, headed by Pandit Birju Maharaj, has a large repertoire of dance-dramas and shorter choreographic works in Kathak. Eight dancers and nine musicians are members of the repertory, which accepts professional engagements all over the country. Apprentice fellows and senior students of the Kendra often take part in productions by the Unit; this affords them experience in group dance and choreography. During the year, Gurus and Prashikshaks choreographed eight short numbers for the Repertory Unit presented in the Maharaj Kalka-Bindadin Kathak Mahotsav 23-26 February 1988. The following dancers are members of the Production Unit: Shri Krishna Mohan Misra, Shri Ashok Chakraborty, Shri Jai Kishan Maharaj, Shri Raghav Raj Bhatt, Shri Arjun Misra, Kumari Saswati Sen, Shrimati Kalyani Chakraborty, Kumari Durga Arya and Kumari Malati Rawat.

Festivals

The Fourth Saraccandrika festival was presented 4-6 October 1987 in Delhi. Eighteen Kathak dancers from all over the country participated in the festival. The annual Maharaj Kalka-Bindadin Kathak Mahotsava '88 was presented 23-26 February 1988. The Production Unit and Gurus presented several new choreographic works in the festival: Pranati and Ashtavastha choreographed by Birju Maharaj; Tarana by Durga Lal; Angamukti by Mannu Lal Shukla; Chhandalupta by Reba Vidyarthi; Rashmita Ratri by Saswati Sen & Krishna Mohan; Talatmika by Geetanjali Lal; and Srijan-Leela by Rejendra Kumar Gangani.

Apart from these Kendra productions, the following groups and individual

dancers presented their new work in the festival: Shriram Bharatiya Kala Kendra, Delhi; Shri Vijay Shankar, Calcutta (Kshudhita Pashan); Nritya Bharati, Pune. The festival also featured solo recitals by Pandit Durga Lal, Shrimati Sunayana Hazarilal, Shrimati Urmila Nagar and Pandit Birju Maharaj.

Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy : Imphal

A constituent unit of Sangeet Natak Academi, JNMDA is the premier institution in the country for Manipuri dance and allied arts. Established in 1954, it offers several comprehensive courses in Manipuri dance and related subjects like Thang-ta and Lai Haraoba. The courses are planned as foundational for training professional artistes. Many of the leading Manipuri gurus have served on the JNMDA faculty from its inception. The institution also has a Production Unit with a large repertoire of dance-dramas.

The management of JNMDA vests in the Executive Board of the Sangeet Natak Akademi, which is assisted in its task by JNMDA's local Advisory Committee. The Advisory Committee in 1987-88 comprised General K V Krishna Rao (Retd), Chairman; Shri N Khelchandra Singh, Vice-Chairman; member: Shri K S Kothari (Secretary, Sangeet Natak Akademi), Shri A H Choudhury, Th Babu Singh (Principal, JNMDA), Prof Mangthoi Thaimei, Shri S Thanil Singh (Teachers' Representative), Shri Prakash Singh (Director, JNMDA).

Students/Examinations

The Academy had 399 students on roll this year. The annual examinations for all classes were held 9-25 November 1987.

The Annual Function and Convocation of the Academy was inaugurated by General K V KrishnaRao (Retd), Governor of Manipur, on 19 February 1988. Shri W Angou Singh, Speaker, Manipur Legislative Assembly, presided over the function. General Krishna Rao gave away the diplomas and presented gold medals to the four best students.

The annual study-cum-performance tour of Diploma and Post-Graduate Course students of dance was organized in Mairang where the students performed during the Lai Haraoba festival on 30 May 1987.

Performances

i. Shree Gouranga, a new dance-drama

- choreographed by Th Chaotombi Singh of the JNMDA Production Unit, was staged 17 May 1987 by artistes of the Academy at Imphal.
- ii. A 26-member troupe from the Academy participated in the Festival of India in the USSR. The troupe performed Manipuri Ras at the inaugural concert of the festival on 4 July 1987 at the Kremlin in Moscow. It later gave performances at Kiev, Odessa, Kishninav, Astrakhan and Leningrad.
- iii. A 20-member troupe from the Academy participated in the inaugural Mela of Indian Manifestation in Sweden on 21 August 1987. It presented Lai Haraoba, Dhol Cholom and Thang-ta in various towns and cities in Sweden. The tour was sponsored by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations, Delhi.
- iv. A month-long Thang-ta workshop was conducted by Shri G Sana Sharma with the artistes of the Production Unit 8 June-13 July 1987. The artistes demonstrated some

- special Thang-ta exercises on the occasion. After the demonstration, Shri N Khelchandra Singh, an expert on Thang-ta, spoke on the 'Role of Thang-ta in Manipuri Dance'.
- v. A 45-day dance workshop was conducted by Shri R K Nabindra Singh. The concluding function was held 28 September 1987 at the Academy auditorium. About 35 students participated in the workshop.
- vi. A 20-member troupe from the Academy performed in Lok-Utsav, Delhi, presented by Sangeet Natak Akademi. Vasanta Ras and Maharas were presented by the troupe on 30 and 31 October 1987. This was the fourth occasion for Academy artistes to perform in the annual Lok-Utsav.
- vii. A group of ten artistes of the Academy took part in the inaugural ceremony of the Festival of the USSR in India inaugurated by Shri Rajiv Gandhi and Mr N I Ryzkov, Soviet Prime Minister, on 21 November 1987 at Rashtrapati Bhavan, New Delhi. The ceremony was organized by Sangeet Natak Akademi.

- viii. A nine-member martial arts troupe from the Academy participated in the Festival of Martial Arts and Dances organized by the Trade Fair Authority of India at Kadambari Theatre, Pragati Maidan, New Delhi. The troupe presented Thang-ta 22-23 March 1988.
- ix. A Nata-sankirtana group comprising visiting gurus and post-graduate students of the Academy participated in the Nata Sankirtana Festival organized by a local organization at Thoubal on 3 September 1987. This was part of the Academy's effort to propagate Manipuri music in rural areas.

Apart from these sponsored performances, the Production Unit of the Academy presented ten composite programmes of dance and music at Imphal on occasions of national importance or in honour of dignitaries visiting the State. These programmes were sponsored by various departments of the State Government as well as other agencies. Students of the Academy joined the Production Unit staff to present these performances—a regular engagement for artistes at JNMDA.



Appendix I

Sangeet Natak Akademi: Memorandum of Association (Excerpts)

The objects for which the Society is set up are :

- to coordinate the activities of regional or State Academis of music, dance and drama;
- to promote research in the fields of Indian music, dance and drama and, for this purpose, to establish a library and museum, etc.;
- iii. to cooperate with such similar Academies as there may be and other institutions and associations for the furtherance of its objects and for the enrichment of Indian culture as a whole;

- viii. to publish literature on Indian music, dance and drama including reference works such as an illustrated dictionary or handbook of technical terms;
- ix. to give recognition to and otherwise assist meritorious theatrical organizations;
- to encourage the development of amateur dramatic activity, children's theatre, the openair theatre and the rural theatre in its various forms;
- xi. to revive and preserve folk music, folk dance and folk drama in different regions of the country and to encourage the development of community music, martial music and other types of music;
- xii. to sponsor music, dance and drama festivals, seminars, conferences on an all-India basis and to encourage such regional festivals;
- xiii. to award prizes and distinctions and to give recognition to individual artistes for outstanding achievement in the fields of music, dance and drama;

- xiv. to take suitable steps for the maintenance of proper and adequate standards of education in music, dance and drama and with that object to organize research in the teaching of the said subjects;
- xv. to foster cultural contacts between the different regions of the country and also with other countries in the fields of music, dance and drama.

The Scheme and its objectives (Excerpts)

- The scheme is called "Scheme of Assistance to Young Theatre Workers". The operative periodicity of the scheme is annual.
- 2. The broad objective of the scheme is to support the endeavours of young theatre workers engaged in exploring and developing a theatre idiom indigenous in character, inspired by the folk/traditional theatre of the country. The intention, however, is not to promote derivative art based on folk/traditional models, but to catalyze the growth of a theatre idiom enriched by indigenous theatrical experience.
- 3. A necessary corollary of this objective is to help, on the one hand, the folk/traditional theatre forms grow through a process of artistic cross-fertilization with modern theatre and, on the other, to help contemporary theatre assimilate the rich heritage of the past. This assimilation is sought to be aided by encouraging creative experimental endeavours in any artistic area such as playwrighting, style of presentation, acting methodology, etc.
- 4. With such an objective in view the adoption of rigid parameters, artistic or other, is neither possible nor desirable. It is to be noted that:
- a. to be considered for assistance, a production need not be a replication of any specific folk play or confine itself to the dramatic framework of any single folk/traditional form. What is expected is a creative exploration and assimilation of the approaches, styles and usages of our folk/traditional theatre.
- b. only new productions of original plays in Indian languages and translations of such plays are acceptable, as also adaptations based on literary works of Indian origin. New plays in Indian languages not staged earlier are especially welcome. Playwrights are offered special remuneration.
- c. translations and adaptations of non-Indian plays are excluded from the purview of the scheme.
- d. only new productions are considered. Revivals of earlier productions by the same director or group are not considered unless supported by adequate justification.
