

SANGEET NATAK AKADEMI ANNUAL REPORT 1994-95



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ORGANIZATIONAL SET-UP

Sangeet Natak Akademi — the National Academy of Music, Dance and Drama — was founded in 1953 for the furtherance of the performing arts of India, a task in which it cooperates with counterparts in the States and voluntary organizations all over the country. By arranging free performances in various parts of the country by renowned veterans as well as by talented artists of the younger generation, through training programmes supported by scholarships, and through documentation and dissemination, the Akademi seeks an enhanced public appreciation of music, dance and drama, together with a quickened exchange of ideas and techniques for the common gain of Indian performing arts. The objectives of the Akademi are more specifically stated in its Memorandum of Association (excerpts: Appendix I)

The Akademi is registered under the Societies' Registration Act of 1860 and functions as an autonomous organization. It is funded by the Department of Culture, Government of India.

The management of the Akademi vests in its General Council. The Executive Board exercises superintendence, direction and control of the affairs of the Akademi. The Executive Board is assisted by the Finance, Grants, Publication and other advisory committees (Appendix II).

The Chairman of the Akademi is appointed by the President of India and holds office for a term of five years. The Vice-Chairman is elected by the General Council of the Akademi from among its

members and also holds office for five years. During 1994-95 Jamshed J. Bhabha was Chairman of the Akademi and the Vice-Chairman was Prem Lata Sharma.

The Principal Executive Officer of the Akademi is the Secretary who is assisted by a Finance and Accounts Officer, 11 Assistant Secretaries including the Directors of Kathak Kendra and Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy, a Special Officer (Documentation), a Technical Officer (Filming), and the Librarian of the Akademi. The registered office of the Akademi is Rabindra Bhavan, Delhi.

Kathak Kendra, Delhi, and Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academy, Imphal, are training institutions run by the Akademi. The management of the two institutions vests in the Executive Board of the Akademi, which is assisted by the Advisory Committees of these constituent units. Reports on the activities of these institutions are included in this Annual Report.

Meetings of the Executive Board, the General Council, and the various Committees constituted by the Executive Board (the Finance, Grants, and Publication Committees) were held during the period under report. Meetings of the Advisory Committees for Theatre, Music, Dance and Documentation and Archives were also held. The meetings held in 1994-95 are recorded at Appendix III.

The fully constituted General Council first met on 21 April 1994. At the next meeting of the General Council, which was held on 31 May 1994, 27 personalities in the field of performing arts were selected for the Akademi's Fellowships and Awards for 1993. The investiture ceremony for the

Awards was held at Rashtrapati Bhavan on 6 December 1994.

As in previous years the attempt to give an added dimension to presentations of music, dance and theatre by way of discussions and lecture-demonstrations continued. Some of the festivals were specially conceived and were recorded for the archives of the Akademi. Extensive recordings of events, interviews, workshops and performances by eminent gurus, masters and younger performers were made keeping in mind their archival value. Support was extended to individuals and organizations for recording events of value. A list of events organized by the Akademi is at Appendix IV.

AKADEMI AWARDS AND FELLOWSHIPS 1993

The General Council of Sangeet Natak Akademi met on 31 May 1994 in Delhi and elected 27 artists for the Fellowships and Annual Awards of the Akademi for 1993. These honours, which carry a purse of Rs 25,000, a shawl and a Tamrapatra, were conferred on the artists by the President of India, Dr Shanker Dayal Sharma, at an investiture ceremony at Rashtrapati Bhavan, Delhi, on 6 December 1994. Among the artists honoured, two received the Fellowships of the Akademi for their contributions to dance and drama. Out of the 25 Awards, nine were in music, six for dance, and nine in the field of theatre. (One of the Awards was a joint award.)



WORKSHOPS & FESTIVALS

Marionette Workshop & Festival: Karnataka

A workshop and festival focussing on the string puppetry of southern India was held at Udupi 24-29 October 1994. The event was organized by the Akademi in collaboration with the Regional Resources Centre for Folk Performing Arts, Udupi, and the Karnataka Janapada and Yakshagana Academy, Bangalore. It was part of a larger programme designed for the purpose of studying the marionette theatre of India. The earlier workshops and festivals, focussed on the marionette traditions of western and eastern India, were held at Udaipur and Guwahati respectively.

The objective of the workshop and festival was to give an opportunity to the puppeteers of the region to share their expertise and to interact with their counterparts from the rest of the country. The event thus made it possible for puppeteers from other parts to get to know the various techniques, including manipulation, used in the region. The visiting groups of puppeteers performed at Udupi and also gave additional performances at Ambalapady, Kundapur, Kodavoor, Perdoor, Kunjal, Hiriyadka and Karkala.

Nrityotsava: Hyderabad

A festival of classical dance traditions of Andhra Pradesh with lecture-demonstrations by masters was organized in Hyderabad 27-31 January 1995 with a view to exploring, documenting and supporting the classical dance heritage of Andhra Pradesh. Conceived as the first in a series of events, the focus of the festival was on demonstrations by gurus in the morning sessions and solo presentations by younger dancers in the evenings. Playwrights' Workshop: Tamil

This week-long workshop, held in January 1995, was supported by a new scheme for playwrights' workshops in Indian languages. The scheme is designed to provide opportunities to new playwrights as well as fiction writers and poets to write new plays in Indian languages.

Five plays — first drafts — had been shortlisted for the Tamil drama workshop (the first in the languagewise series of workshops) from 25 scripts submitted to the Akademi. The five writers were invited for a day each to interact with directors and actors from the Department of Drama of Thanjavur and Pondicherry Universities. The plays were read out and a few scenes enacted and on the basis of this exercise, the play 'Muni' by S. Malaichemy, a short-story writer, and 'Moonravathu Vila Elumbum Vizhuthuhalara Alamramum' by Devibharati were selected for production. The productions were supported by the Akademi.

The final drafts of the selected plays were worked out under the guidance of the directors of the plays, Ramaswamy and R. Raju.

Kutiyattam Mahotsavam: Delhi

This six-day festival of Kutiyattam and Nangiar Kuttu was organized 24-29 March 1995 as an extension of the Akademi's project of Support to Kutiyattam. The festival featured almost all the leading artists of Kutiyattam and Nangiar Kuttu including Akademi Awardees Guru Ammannur Madhava Chakyar and Guru Kochukuttan Chakyar, and the

The festival was inaugurated by the renowned Sanskrit scholar K.P. Narayana Pisharoti of Trichur in the presence of a distinguished gathering of scholars, artists, experts and critics.

All the performances and lecture-demonstrations were recorded by the Akademi for its archives. In addition, special recordings of interviews, demonstrations and performances were also carried out during the festival.

On the occasion of the festival, the Akademi brought out a special issue of its quarterly journal *Sangeet Natak* devoted to Kutiyattam. A brochure giving details of the authors, texts and plays presented during the festival was also made available to the audience. A display of photographs of Kutiyattam performances and masters was mounted at the principal venue (Rabindra Bhavan).









ASSISTANCE TO YOUNG THEATRE WORKERS

The scheme 'Assistance to Young Theatre Workers', drawn up by the Akademi in 1983, completed ten years in 1993-94. Forty zonal and 10 all-India theatre festivals were organized during these ten years in various parts of the country, in which almost 200 young directors participated and presented their new productions.

While evaluating the outcome of the scheme it was observed that a large number of participating young directors were graduates of the National School of Drama. At the same time some of the participants belonged to small towns where they did not get any opportunity for formal training. It was felt that most of those in the latter category were talented and could do better if given exposure to various concepts, methodologies and dramatic trends prevailing in the country and outside. A scheme for workshops for young theatre directors was therefore formulated and approved by the General Council last year. Meanwhile, the scheme for zonal and national theatre festivals was kept in abeyance for two years.

The first workshop for young directors selected from participants in the zonal and national theatre festivals held by the Akademi in earlier years was held 27 February to 25 March 1995. Four eminent directors, Vijaya Mehta, Habib Tanvir, K.N. Paniker and Anamika Haksar conducted the workshop. N.C. Jain was the coordinating Director-in-Charge and B.V. Karanth the Associate Director. Each director worked with the group for six days on a play of his

or her choice.

Besides providing opportunities of interaction with eminent actors and playwrights, the young directors were given exposure to allied arts through discussions, demonstrations and lectures on poetry, dance, music, painting, film, etc. The workshop was held at the Sanskriti Kendra, Anandgram, which provided a suitable environment where the 13 visiting young directors stayed and worked together for the entire period.

PROMOTION AND PRESERVATION OF RARE FORMS OF TRADITIONAL PERFORMING ARTS

The scheme supports advanced taining in forms of music, dance and theatre which are threatened. Honorariums to reputed teachers and stipends to students are paid by the Akademi by way of incentive, the effort being to sustain these arts through the traditional teaching-learning process. Details of training are regularly reported and the progress of trainees annually assessed by the Akademi.

The following training programmes were operative in 1994-95: Pakhawaj under Guru Ramshankardas Pagaldas; Sarangi under Ustad Sabri Khan and Guru Inder Lal Dhandra; Nagaswaram under Guru T.S. Latchappa Pillai; Naqqara under Ustad Attan Khan; Thavil under Guru P. Chinnappa

Pillai; Murli and Satara (wind instruments of Rajasthan) under Pempa Khan Manganiyar and Meherdeen Langa.

Two training programmes were added during the year:
Panchamukha Vadya under Guru
T. Sankaramurthy of Tiruvarur and Nagaswardam under Guru
Periapapa of Vedaranya.

On the recommendations of the Advisory Committee for Music the Executive Board approved that the scope of the scheme be extended and the scheme be titled 'Training and Preservation of Traditional Performing Arts'. The scheme now envisages encouragement to young members of traditional practising families and support to such forms, styles, traditions, Gharanas, etc. which do not otherwise receive support. The financial provisions for the gurus and trainees have been enhanced and provision has been made for purchase of musical instruments, costumes, etc.

SUPPORT TO KUTIYATTAM AND CHHAU

Support to Kutiyattam and Chhau is being extended by the Akademi under a Plan scheme for the development of National Centres for Specialized Training in Dance and Music.

Kutiyattam

The Akademi launched in 1991 a total-care programme for support to Kutiyattam, the classical theatre tradition of Kerala. The programme includes training in Kutiyattam and Nangiar Kuttu under the guidance of Guru Ammanur Mahdava Chakyar at Irinjalakuda; training in Mizhavuplaying under Guru P.K. Narayanan Nambiar, and performance support to the institution Margi, in Thiruvananthapuram, for developing it as a centre for regular performance.

During 1994 the programme completed three years and a detailed review was undertaken under the Chairmanship of Dr Prem Lata Sharma with K. Ayyappa Paniker, K.P. Narayana Pisharody, K. Vasudevan Namboodiripad, S. Ganesha Aiyer and Secretary, Sangeet Natak Akademi. After visiting different centres of Kutiyattam in August 1994 and several meetings and discussions the Committee made specific recommendations about the enhancement of the rate of remuneration to gurus and students at the Ammannur Chachu Chakvar Smaraka Gurukulam at Irinjalakuda and Lakkidi and enhancement of performance subsidy to Margi.

In addition several recommendations relating to support to Kerala Kalamandalam, Cheruthuruthy, for Kutiyattam performances, documentation and reprinting of books, training and performance support to Nangiar Kuttu, and organizing an annual Kutiyattam festival in Kerala with the support of the Akademi were approved by the Executive Board in Demember 1994. The recommendations are at various stages of implementation.

Chhau

After discussions with experts, artists and various institutions, a survey of 26 villages (in addition to Baripada), was conducted and a training project for Mayurbhani Chhau was launched on 1 February 1994. An Expert Committee consisting of Jiwan Pani, D.N. Patnaik, local Mayurbhani gurus and others selected the gurus and students for the training programme. The programme was implemented with the cooperation and support of Mayurbhani Chhau Nrutya Pratishthan, Baripada, and the district administration. It provided for remuneration to teachers and accompanists in Baripada and neighbouring villages besides scholarships to students and a refresher course in Chhau music.

In October 1994 a review of the pilot project was undertaken by D.N. Patnaik, Jiwan Pani and J.P. Kastuar, Assistant Secretary (Dance) in the Akademi. The committee recommended continuation of the project on a regular basis as they found the result of the first nine months of the project encouraging. They also recommended increase in the stipends to trainees and a few modifications relating to holding of refresher and training courses for dance teachers, scholarships to music students, training in Dhol, etc. The recommendations are being implemented.

The Akademi provided financial subsidy to the Mayurbhanj Chhau Nrutya Pratishthan, Baripada, to organize the annual Chaitra Parva in Baripada in April 1994.

INTER-STATE CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME

The programme promotes exchange of performing troupes and individual artists, with the object of creating an integrative awareness of our performing-arts tradition. While implementation of the programme is the responsibility of State Governments, the Akademi plays a pivotal role in the exchange by advising the governments concerned and subsidizing and coordinating the tours sponsored.

The exchange programme is chalked out annually in consultation with representatives of the State and Union Territories. The 18th annual conference of State/Union Territory representatives in 1994 was held in Shimla.

The following 27 tours took place during the period on the basis of the schedule finalized at the conference.

CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMME BETWEEN INDIA AND OTHER COUNTRIES

The Akademi as a specialist performing-arts body is responsible for some of the tasks envisaged in the Cultural Exchange Programme agreements between India and other countries. The Akademi acts here mainly as a clearing house for material and information on the performing arts of India, exchanging books, tapes and other published or archival material with institutions in various countries. On occasion, the Akademi also sponsors experts and performing artists abroad under specific programme provisions, and invites foreign experts and artists to India.

During this period the Akademi sent or presented select audio and video cassettes, publications, and photographs on Indian performing arts to institutions and individuals from Pakistan, Greece, U.S.A., France and Australia. Books from Spain, received under the programme, have been distributed among institutions imparting training in Western music

PUBLICATIONS

The publication programme of the Akademi, initiated soon after its innception in 1953, consists of books and monographs on the performing arts, the quarterly journal *Sangeet Natak*, and the *Sangeet Natak* Akademi News Bulletin. Besides, to promote publication on music, dance and drama, the Akademi helps authors and publishers with grants for books and journals in English and Indian languages. A list of Akademi publications is at Appendix VI.

A special number of Sangeet Natak devoted to Kutiyattam, edited by Prof. K. Ayyappa Paniker, was published in March 1995. This issue (nos. 111-114), consisting of papers on various aspects of Kutiyattam by eminent Kutiyattam gurus and other practitioners, was released on the occasion of the Kutiyattam Mahotsavam organized by the

Akademi in Delhi 24-29 March 1995.

During the period under report, financial assistance was provided for the publication of the following performing arts periodicals: Boburupee, Calcutta (Rs.20,000); the Journal of the Indian Musicological Society, Baroda (Rs.15,000); Shanmukha, Bombay (Rs.10,000); Sudrak, Calcutta (Rs.12,000); Journal of the Music Academy, Madras (Rs. 10,000); Sruti, Madras (Rs.25,000); Parikara (10,000); Grants for the following books were also released during the period: Mukta Sangeet Samvad ed. Shriram Sangoram (Rs.25,000); Bhangi in Manipuri Ras Dance by G. Surchand Sharma (Rs. 5,000); and Sastriya Sangita and Musical Culture of Bengal Through the Ages by Chhava Chatterjee (Rs. 12,500, first instalment).

DOCUMENTATION & DISSEMINATION

Over the years Sangeet Natak Akademi has built up a large archive of audio-tapes, photographs and films on the performing arts; since 1981, it has also added video-tapes to its holdings. The material is disseminated through audio and video listening and viewing facilities, music dubbing and film projection. Material from the Akademi's archives has been extensively used in publications, films, television and research on the performing arts of India.

During 1994-95 about 8300 photographs, 2000 transparencies, 160 hours of audio recordings and 360 hours of video recordings were added to the archives of the Akademi which now hold a total of over 1.44 lakh feet of 16-mm film, 97,350 photographs, 28,600 transparencies, 5,865 hours of audio recordings and 2,215 hours of video recording, mainly of Indian music, dance and theatre. Audio and video recordings made during the period under report are listed in Appendix VIII. The more important of these are mentioned in the following paragraphs.

The full cycle of Krishnattam plays at Guruvayoor temple in Kerala was video-filmed, including the episodes Avatharam, Kaliyamardanam, Rasakreeda, Kamsavadham, Swayamvaram, Banayudham, Vividavadha and Swargarohanam.

The Kalachakra ceremony conducted by His Holiness the Dalai Lama at Jispa in Lahaul and Spiti district of Himachal Pradesh was video-filmed. The recording included the ritual of making the sand Mandala, the chants, and the music and dance performed on the occasion.

Recordings of the dance traditions of Andhra Pradesh during the year include lecturedemonstrations by 12 gurus of Kuchipudi including Vempati Chinna Satyam, C.R. Acharyulu, Vedantam Satyanarayana Sharma, Pasumarthy Venu Gopal Sarma, etc. Demonstrations by eminent women temple dancers of Andhra were also recorded during a seminar organized in Hyderabad with financial support from the Akademi. Tribal dances of the Araku valley in Vishakhapatnam and Parvateepuram districts in Andhra Pradesh were videofilmed on location.

Documentation of musical instruments from Rajasthan, Goa, Maharashtra and Gujarat was carried out under the guidance of Komal Kothari at a Festival of Folk Musical Instruments at Goa.

Lecture-demonstrations and performances by Birju Maharaj, Kelucharan Mahapatra and M.K. Saroja were video-filmed in Delhi.

The performances, lecturedemonstrations and interviews with Kutiyattam gurus on the occasion of Kutiyattam Mahotsavam were video-filmed. Special recordings of a few plays and demonstrations were also made.

Three video-films have been compiled from the recordings available in the archives of the Akademi: Kanglai Haroba (a version of Lai Haraoba of Manipur), and two films on Mani Madhava Chakyar including excerpts from interviews and his performance of Parvativiraham. The film on Mani Madhava Chakyar — Master at Work was shown during the Kutiyattam festival. A 15-minute video-film on the Behdeinkhlam Festival of the Jaintiya tribe of Meghalaya, compiled from recordings made in 1992, won a Sony Contest Award (1994) in Japan.

MUSEUM

Musical instruments, masks and headgears, puppets and other objects have been collected in the Akademi since its inception. Methodical collection, however, began in 1968, when the Akademi organized a major exhibition of folk and tribal musical instruments. Regular acquisitions have been made since then. supplemented by gifts from musicians and visiting troupes. The Museum houses about 1300 objects, of which about 250 are on view in the gallery — chiefly folk, tribal and classical musical instruments. Its holdings of masks, puppets, costumes and other artifacts are also substantial.

Systematic numbering, accessioning, cataloguing and indexing of the collection was taken up about two years ago. Work on this continued in 1994-95.

Special exhibitions were mounted on the occasion of various festivals organized by the Akademi, including Kutiyattam Mahotsavam, Paramparik Natyotsava, etc.

LIBRARY

The Akademi Library has, over the years, acquired a specialized collection of books on the performing arts, many of them rare and out of print. Catering chiefly to students and researchers in the performing arts, the Library receives about a hundred Indian and foreign periodicals and has a total collection of 20,124 books.

During the year a review of periodicals in the library was undertaken and orders placed for 47 periodicals from India and abroad. A microfilm reader was purchased and some microfilmed material on theatre was acquired for the Library.

The newly designed Audio/Video Library with facilities for simultaneous listening and viewing was further equipped with a compact-disc player. The collection now stands at 9,667 discs, 1051 pre-recorded cassettes and over 763 copies of audio casettes from the archives of the Akademi, classified and

catalogued. The collection, which includes 59 video-cassettes of dance, music and theatre, has now over 50 compact discs of Indian music.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO CULTURAL INSTITUTIONS AND INDIVIDUALS

Since its inception, the Akademi has rendered financial assistance to music, dance, and theatre institutions. The Grants Committee, which considers applications from institutions all over the country, recommended grants amounting to Rs. 29,15,500 to 211 cultural institutions during the financial year 1994-95 (Appendix VIII).
Rs. 1,14,500 was sanctioned from discretionary grants at the disposal of the Chairman (Appendix IX).

Rs. 2,41,000 was sanctioned to eight scholars and performers under the scheme 'Project Grants to Individuals for Research in Performing Arts', introduced in 1992-93 (Appendix X). Grants amounting to Rs. 2,30,000 were also sanctioned to 12 institutions under the scheme 'National & Regional Festivals in Music, Dance. (Appendix XI).

The Akademi also supported the following workshops by partially funding them:
(a) 'Contribution of Guru Deba Prasad Das to Odissi Dance' organized by the Jawaharlal Nehru Youth Centre, Delhi;
(b) 'Temple Dance Traditions of Andhra' organized by Nataraja Ramakrishna at Hyderabad; and (c) a workshop by Guru Kelucharan Mohapatra organized by the Gandharva Mahavidyalaya, Delhi.

BUDGET AND ACCOUNTS

The Akademi receives a grant inaid from the Department of Culture, Government of India, to meet the expenditure on its activities. The budget of the Akademi for Non-Plan and Plan expenditure in the financial year 1994-95 was as follows:

PROGRESSIVE USE OF HINDI

An Official Language Implementation Committee has been constituted in the Akademi to ensure compliance with the Official Language Policy in the Akademi. The work is looked after by the Hindi Cell, set up in 1993.

According to the instructions of the Government of India, publicity material for various festivals and programmes was printed both in Hindi and English. The Annual Reports of the Akademi for 1992-93 and 1993-94 were translated into Hindi. Steps are being taken to correspond in Hindi wherever possible.

IN MEMORIAM

During the period under report, the Akademi mourned the passing of several eminent personalities in the performing arts, including Awardees of past years:

N. Zahiruddin Dagar,

Dhrupad singer, passed away on 7 May 1994. He received the Akademi Award in 1991.

Saraju Bala Devi, noted actress of the Bengali stage, expired on 22 July 1994. She received the Akademi Award in 1970.

M.G. Rangnekar, noted Marathi playwright, died on 1 February 1995. He received the Akademi Award in 1982.

Nikhil Ghosh, Tabla player and teacher, expired on 3 March 1995.

KATHAK KENDRA: DELHI

A constituent unit of Sangeet Natak Akademi, Kathak Kendra is one of the leading dance-teaching institutions in the country. Established in 1964, it offers several courses in Kathak dance as well as allied subjects like vocal music and Pakhawaj. The elementary courses are: a parttime five-year Foundation Course in dance for the age-group 7-17 and a three-year diploma (Pass) course, also part-time, for the age group 13-22. The advanced fulltime courses in dance are a Diploma (Hons) course of three years (age 16-24) and a two-year Post-Diploma course (age 19-26). There are special courses of three years each in Hindustani vocal music and in Pakhawai-plaving. There is also a refresher course of up to a year for dance teachers and for students of the Kendra who, having completed the Diploma (Hons) or Post-Diploma course, desire to teach Kathak.

The Kathak Kendra has a Production Unit which strives to enrich the repertoire and technique of Kathak through experimental work. The Kendra has on its staff teachers of eminence in various disciplines.

The management of the Kendra vests in the Executive Board of Sangeet Natak Akademi which is assisted by an Advisory Committee. The Chairman of the Advisory Committee is the Vice-Chairman of the Sangeet Natak Akademi.

The Kendra as a Service Organization

The Kendra continues to render useful service to other institutions by letting them draw upon its

dance talent for performance, teaching etc. within and outside the country.

Production Unit

The production unit of the Kathak Kendra is a well known repertory of Kathak dance and music. Headed by Pandit Birju Maharaj, the unit has contributed towards expansion of the repertoire of the Kathak dance style. During the year the unit presented *Meera Hari Rang Raachi*, a dance-drama based on the life and lyrics of Meera Bai in Delhi on 10 and 11 November 1995.

Festivals

Dikshantotsava

As part of the annual examination, Diskshantotsava was held at the Triveni Kala Sangam, Delhi, from 1 to 6 May 1994 in which 25 final-year students of various courses were featured. The programme presented at this festival is a method of evaluating the quality of the Kendra's students as solo performers.

Chhatrotsava

To give the students of the Kendra stage experience, the Kendra has been holding Chhatrotsava since 1990. Students at various levels of training are featured in the festival. Solo recitals and group numbers choreographed by the staff are also presented. The following items were presented in Chhatrotsava, organized 7-8 September 1994: Umang Tarang, a group number choreographed by Guru Bharati Gupta; Raag Vistaar, choreographed by Guru Rajendra Kumar Gangani; Kathakaayan, choreographed by

Guru Munna Shukla; *Taateel*, choreographed by Guru Vaswati Misra; *Nrityollaas*, choreographed by Guru Urmila Nagar; *Ganesh Vandana*, a Pakhawaj-ensemble composition by Guru Ram Kishore Dass; *Samanvay*, a Tablaensemble composition by Guru Govind Prasad Chakraborty; and solo recitals by Deepak Maharaj, Harish Gangani, Pallavi Pawar, Gya Shin.

Saraccandrika

Since 1984, the Kendra has been holding the Saraccandrika festival every year. In this festival promising young dancers get an opportunity to dance with more experienced dancers from all over the country. During the period under report the festival was held 20-22 October 1994 in Delhi and featured 17 Kathak dancers. On 20 October Atrevee Roy performed first, followed by Nilangi Doshi; Manju Wazir and Parwati Dutta, existudents of the Kendra, performed next, followed by Prerna Shrimali. On 21 October Bireshwar Gautam, Nandini Singh, Kanika Ghosh (an ex-student), Munmun Ahmed of Bangladesh (also an ex-student), and Rajendra Kumar Gangani, Varistha Kathak Prashikshak at the Kendra, presented solo recitals. On 22 October there were two duets: by Archana Tiwari and Gunian Khare and Ram Mohan Misra and Parul Misra of Surinam. Solo performances by Tokiko Kihara of Australia, Alaknanda Dasgupta and Isarat Jahan Tabassum, an ex-student from Bangladesh, concluded the festival.

Kathak Mahotsava 1995

This annual event was held 25-28 February 1995 in Delhi.

Aavartani Festival

This festival was organized at Kamani Auditorium 20-21 December 1994 and featured eight short group numbers and two compositions for percussion ensembles composed earlier by the Gurus of the Kendra.

Sponsored Programmes

Performances by the Production Unit of the Kendra are sponsored in and outside Delhi by various cultural organisations, professional bodies, business houses and other agencies. These were at Sultanpur on 2 April 1994; at Bangalore on 15 & 16 April 1994; at Calcutta on 19,20,21 April 1994; at Jammu on 29 April 1994; at Vrindavan on 11 and 12 September 1994; at Kulu on 16 October 1994; at Hyderabad on 18 October; at Chittorgarh on 21 October 1994; at Puttaparthi on 19 November 1994; at Lucknow on 8 December 1994, 4 March 1995 and 27 March 1995.

In addition to these, the Production Unit also presented the following performances in Delhi: at Raj Niwas on 26 April; at Miranda House on 28 September; at Holiday Inn on 1 October; at Andhra Bhawan on 10 October; at Qutab Minar on 12 November; at Air Force Auditorium on 23 November; at Kamani Auditorium on 21 February.

Students on Roll

At the beginning of the academic year, 16 July 1994, the Kendra had 194 students on its rolls in various courses. On 31 March 1995 the number of students was 166. The annual examinations were conducted 1-11 May 1994. A total of 107 students were declared

successful in the various courses. There were 25 foreign students during this period, distributed as follows: U.S.A., 2; Bangladesh, 13; Japan, 1; France, 1; Korea, 2; China, 2; and Russia, 4.

JAWAHARLAL NEHRU MANIPUR DANCE ACADEMY: IMPHAL

A constituent unit of Sangeet Natak Akademi, JNMDA has its origin in the Manipur Dance college established by the Government of India in January 1954. The institution was run with financial support from the Academy up to 1957. In that year it became part of Sangeet Natak Akademi and was renamed Jawaharlal Nehru Manipur Dance Academi. JNMDA has an Advisory Committee, headed (ex-officio) by the Governor of Manipur, which formulates the programmes and schemes of the institution. A consultative body with recommendatory powers, the Advisory Committee assists the Executive Board of the Akademi in the management of JNMDA.

JNMDA is the leading institution in the country for the teaching of Manipuri dance, and offers several comprehensive courses in Manipuri dance, music, and allied subjects like Lai Haraoba and Thang-ta. The courses are designed as a foundation for professional artists. The institution has teachers of eminence on its staff. It also has a Production Unit.

The various courses offered by JNMDA are as follows: a Foundation Course (part-time) of three years for students of the age-group 10-14; a full-time Diploma Course of three years for students of the age-group 10-14; a full-time Diploma Course of three years for the age-group 14-18; and a Post-Diploma Course (part-time) of three years. Training in dance and Sankirtana is imparted in the Foundation and Diploma courses. The Post-diploma Course

provides specialization in Lai-Haraoba, Nat-Eshei, Nat Cholom, Nat-Pung and Ras.

Students/ Examinations

The Academy had 397 students on roll this year. The annual examination for all courses were held 7-16 November 1994. The annual function of the Academy was held on 31 August 1994 at the Academy's auditorium. Lt General V.K. Nayar (Retd.), Governor of Manipur and Chairman, JNMDA, inaugurated the function and presented gold medals to the four best students of the Academy and certificates to the other successful students. The gold medalists presented solo performances. A programme of traditional Manipuri dance and music was also performed by the students on the occasion.

A three-day study-tour was undertaken by the final-year students of the Diploma Course (Dance) and Post-Diploma Course (Lai-Haraoba) at the shrine of Kondon Lairembi at Moreh (109 kms from Imphal) from 20 to 22 May 1994 during the Lai-Haraoba festival connected with the deity. The students studied the different aspects of the particular variety of Lai-Haroaba. A study-tour was also undertaken by the students of the Diploma Course (Dance) and Post-Diploma Course (Ras) to various places of cultural importance in Manipur 25-26 December 1994. Teacher's Day was observed by the students of the Academy on 5 September 1994.

Production Unit

The INMDA Production Unit is a

well-known repertory of Manipuri dance and music. It has produced a number of dance-dramas on various themes. It has been featured in all important festivals in India and abroad for the past several years. The Unit has about 21 productions to its credit.

The artists of the Unit participated in the Soorya Dance and Music Festival at Trivandrum from 1-10 October 1994. The troupe presented traditional Manipuri dance and music on 7 October. A 25-member troupe presented Keibul Lamjao, a dance-drama, on the inaugural day (11 November) of the fourth Indian Ballet Festival at Bombay organised by the Sachin Shanker Ballet Unit in collaboration with the Directorate of Cultural Affairs. Maharashtra. The Production Unit presented four other dancedramas in the monthly programmes of the Academy during the period under report: Moirang Sha on 8 May; Madan Bhasma on 23 June; Nongdol Leima on 26 August; and Kabuikei-oiba on 20 June 1995.

A 15-member troupe led by Kh. Prakash Singh, Director, JNMDA, presented traditional Manipuri dance and music at Yangon in Mynamar from 15 to 28 February 1995. The programme was sponsored by the Indian Council for Cultural Relations, Delhi.

Lai-Haraoba Programme

A three-day programme based on Lai-Haraoba was presented at the shrine of Ibudhou Chakaba on the premises of the Academy from 3 to 5 May 1994. Gurus, artists and students participated in the programme.

Festival of Classical Manipuri Solo Dance

A five-day Festival of Classical Manipuri Solo Dance was presented by the Academy in collaboration with the Manipur State Kala Academy, Imphal, from 20 to 24 December at the Academy's auditorium. Nine women dancers, including two dancers from the Academy - A. Lakshmi Devi and K.Binakumari Devi — participated in the festival. A discussion session was also held on 25 December 1995.

Sponsored Programme in Imphal

The artists of the Production Unit and students presented programmes of traditional Manipuri dance and music on four occasions during the year. These programmes were sponsored by various departments of the State government as well as other agencies.

Documentation

Moirang Sha, a dance-drama from the repertoire of the Academy, was video-filmed during the year. So far the Academy has videofilmed eleven dance-dramas.

APPENDIX I

SANGEET NATAK AKADEMI: MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION (EXCERPTS)

The objects for which the Society is set up are:

i. to co-ordinate the activities of regional or State Academies of music, dance and drama:

ii. to promote research in the fields of Indian music, dance and drama and, for this purpose, to establish a library and museum, etc.;

iii. to cooperate with such similar Academies as there may be and other institutions and associations for the furtherance of its objects and for the enrichment of Indian culture as a whole;

iv. to encourage the exchange of ideas and enrichment of techniques between the different regions in regard to the arts of music, dance and drama;

y. to encourage the establishment of theatre centres, on the basis of regional languages, and cooperation among different theatre centres;

vi. to encourage the setting up of institutions providing training in the art of theatre, including instruction in actor's training, study of stage-craft and production of plays;

vii. to encourage and assist production of new plays by awarding prizes and distinctions;

viii. to publish literature on Indian music, dance and drama including reference works such as an illustrated dictionary or handbook of technical terms;

ix. to give recognition to and otherwise assist meritorious theatrical organisations;

x. to encourage the development of amateur dramatic activity, children's theatre, the open-air theatre and the rural theatre in its various forms;

xi. to revive and preserve folk music, folk dance and folk drama in different regions of the country and to encourage the development of community music, martial music and other types of music.

xii. to sponsor music, dance and drama

festivals, seminars, conferences on an all-India basis and to encourage such regional festivals;

xiii. to award prizes and distinctions and to give recognition to individual artistes for outstanding achievement in the fields of music, dance and drama;

xiv. to take suitable steps for the maintenance of proper and adequate standards of education in music, dance and drama and with that object to organize research in the teaching of the said subjects;

xv. to foster cultural contacts between the different regions of the country and also with other countries in the fields of music, dance and drama.
