From that date till 1956 the Co28-97 has met on thirty-two occasions including the current one It is, hence, evident that a large volume of papers has accumu the credit of the Commission during these long years. With to help scholars interested in the period under review, and also to vent duplication of papers which might be read at the sessions of Commission, I as the Secretary of the Commission, thought it advisable that we should prepare an author-subject index volume covering the period from 1920 to 1956.
