| Dogan, Captain William | (d), (k) | Bill for provisions paid, General Journal for August 1756. He had a daughter Mary, born 10th January 1753. In a letter from the Council at Fulta to Madras, dated 13th September 1756, it is stated that he left Bengal with his sloop in the month of May. |

See Public Proceedings, 4th December 1759, President and Governor † (8th August 1752—20th June 1758) and Cash-keeper. He arrived in Bengal 26th May 1737. Drake's desertion of the Fort led to <i>Holwell's</i> being chosen to the command. Drake escaped in the last boat that left the Fort. <i>Lindsay</i> in his account says it was fired on from the time it left the shore till he got on board the <i>Dodalay</i> , but he does not say who fired on it. <i>Mr. Tooke</i> implies it was some of the men whom he had deserted, his words being:—"Upon the Governor's going off, several muskets were fired at him, but none were lucky enough to take place." Drake married Mrs. Mary Coales,* 10th January 1743. She must have been a relation of John Coles (who died in the Black Hole) as he left Rs. 52,000 to Roger Drake's children, Millicent, Roger, Richard and Nathaniel. (See Public Proceedings, 12th September 1757). Millicent was christened, 21st November 1749. Two others, Mary, christened 9th June 1744, and Charlotte, christened 12th February 1747, were dead. The Parish Register records the death of Mrs. Mary Drake, wife of Roger Drake, 6th October 1749. Drake was relieved of his Governorship by the Letter from Court dated 13th November 1757. |
| Drake, Mrs. Martha ‡ | (e), (g) | Apparently second wife of Roger Drake as the Parish Register contains no mention of the births of Roger, Richard and |
