KEIR, Archibald. Captain. Infantry. Lieut. 1756. Capt. 4 Oct. 1757. Resigned Aug. 1758. Readmitted as Capt. 18 May 1766. Resigned 1 Sept. 1768.

Services: Came out to India as Surgeon of the Godolphin in 1752, and served for about three yrs. in the Madras Presdy. After the capture of Calcutta in 1756 he accompanied the relieving force under Major Kilpatrick, sent from Madras to Fulta, as Surgeon. Whilst at Fulta he also acted as Sec. to the Council, and accepted a Commission as Lieut., being shortly afterwards apptd. Qmr. to the force. Probably present at battle of Plassey. Resigned his Commission in 1758 owing to supercession by John Gowen, q.v. He went home, but afterwards returned to India as a free merchant, settled at Patna, and engaged in transactions in salt. At the time of the Batta mutiny he rejoined the army as Capt. in Sir Robert Barker's Bde. at Patna. Purchased the mines of Ramgarh from the Rajah of that district in 1769. In 1785 he unsuccessfully sought to re-enter the Medical Dept. Author of a pamphlet "Thoughts on the Affairs of Bengal," London, 1772.
