On the death of Argeery, Parthenio of Corfu took up the work: subscriptions amounting to Rs. 30,000 were collected from English and Greeks; and in June 1780 the foundation of the present Church was laid.

Dioniscious George	Sacred to the memory of the Reverend Dioniscious George, who departed this life on the 23rd January 1829, after being about forty years minister of the Greek Church in this City. 246	28 Dec. 1774.	James Lillyman	To the memory of LieutCol. James Lilly-Man, Chief Engineer in the Company's Service at Bengal, who died the 28th day of Decemr. 1774. Aged 42 years.	J. L. superintended the building of the present Fort William.
247	30 Aug. 1777.	Sir John Clavering,	To the memory of Sir John Clavering, Knight of the Most Hon'ble Order of the Bath, Lieutenant-General in His Britannic Majesty's Service, and Colonel of the 52nd Regiment of Foot; Second in the Supreme Council of Fort William in Bengal: and Commander-in-Chief of all the Company's Forces in India. Died August 30th 1777, in the 55th Year of his Age, and was interred here.	Clavering played a conspicuous part in the quarrels between the Governor and the majority of the Council. He was a man of great Parliamentary influence, but extremely rash and violent.





George Bogle	In sincere attachment to the memory of Mr. George Bogle, late Ambassador to Tibet, who died the 3rd of April 1781, this monument is erected by his most affectionate friends David Anderson and Claud Alexander.	A copy of Bogle's journal was sent by Warren Hastings to Dr. Johnson. A volume of his manuscripts is now in the British Museum. From his journals, memeoranda, official and private correspondence, a narrative of his mission to Tibet was compiled by Clements R. Markham, published in 1876.
249	7 Feb. 1782.	Anne Chambers and the children of Sir Robert Chambers.	In memory of Anne Chambers, who died 7th February 1782, aged 69 years, and of two of her grandchildren Henrietta Chambers, who died 30th July, 1779, aged four months, and Edward Colin Chambers, who died 9th November 1781, aged six months, being children of Sir Robert Chambers and Frances his wife. Also in memory of Jane Marrior, an infant about 18 months old, who died 23rd November 1781. To the memory of Thomas Fitzmaurice Chambers, son of Sir Robert and Lady Chambers, born on the 28th Oct. MDCCLXXVI, who was shipwrecked in the "Grosvenor" and perished on the Coast of Africa in August 1782.	Sir Robert was one of the first bench of Judges appointed in 1774. He became Chief Justice in 1791. He was a friend of Dr. Johnson, who has immortalised Chambers by linking his name with Goldsmith. "Chambers," he wrote in 1774, "is gone far, and poor Goldsmith is gone much farther." Sir W. Hunter, noting the high proportion of graves of the young in the Calcutta cemeteries, observes that to the early fathers of Calcutta the curse on the rebuilder of Jericho came bitterly home, "He shall lay the foundation thereof in his first-born, and in his younger son shall he set up the gates of it."
250	14 April 1782.	Thomas Vate	Sacred to the memory of the Rev. Thomas Yate, many years Chaplain of this Presidency, who died on the 14th of April 1782. His amiable and cheerful Disposition procured him the Esteemand Friendship of the public in general, and his many private Virtues will ever be remembered by those of his more intimate acquaintance, who in his death lamented the loss of an honest man.	
251	17 Sept. 1782.	James Kerr	Here lieth the body of James Kerr, Surgeon in the Service of the East India Company upon the Bengal Establishment, and Distinguished as well by his Medical knowledge as by improving the Arts and enriching Science by his Discoveries in India. He departed this Life on the 17th of Septr. 1782. Æt. 44 years.

This humble stone records ye name and Fate (the latter alas how unequal to his worth!) of Richard Becher, Esqr., late member of ye Board of Trade, & once of ye Council of this Presidency. Thro a long life pass'd in the service ye Company, what his conduct was the annals of ye Company will show; On this tablet sorrowing friendship tells, that having reach'd, in a modest independence, what he deem'd the honorable reward of a life of service, to enjoy it, He return'd, in ye year 1771 to his Native Land, where private esteem and public confidence awaited, but where Misfortune also overtook, him. By Nature open, liberal, & compassionate, Unpractised in Guile himself, & not suspecting it in others, To prop ye declining Credit of a friend, He was led to put his all to hazard, and fell the Victim of his own benevolence. After a short Pause and agonizing Conflict, Roused by domestic Claims to fresh exertions in 1781, he returned to ye Scene of his earlier Efforts. But ye vigour of life was passed, and seeing, thro' yee Calamity of ye Times, his prospects darken in ye hopeless efforts to re-erect ye Fortunes of his Family, Under ye pang of Disappointment and ye Pressure of ye climate, a worn Mind and debilitated Body, Sunk to Rest. Unerring Wisdom ordained that his reward should not be of this World, and removed him to an Eternity of Happiness. 17th Novr. 1782. Ætate Suæ. 61.	See also No. 72. "Richard Becher will ever deserve honor as almost the only Englishman who, amid calamity and misrepresentation, really strove to grapple with the great famine of 1770." His two sons, Richard and John, came out to Bengal in 1781. in the Civil Service. "It was a daughter of John Becher who became the wife of Richmond Thackeray and the mother of his illustrious son I wonder if Thackeray had that sad story of his great-grandfather in his mind, when he touched off with so tender a pencil, the last days of Colonel Newcome." (Sir W. W. Hunter.)
253	28 Aug. 1783.	Thomas Poynting	At the instance of Captain Thos. Larkins, and to the memory of Thomas Poynting, Esqr., Commander of the ship Resolution, in the service of the United Company of Merchants of England, trading to the East Indies, who most bravely defended the Resolution against 13 Sail of the Mahatta Fleet. He died esteemed and honored by those who knew him, the 28th day of August 1783. Aged 53 years.	
254	12 Jan. 1784.	Augustus Cleveland	Here lie the remains of Augustus Cleveland, Esquire, late Collector of the Revenues & Judge of the Dewanny Adawlut of the districts of Bhagalpur, Monghyr, Ragemahal, &c., &c. He departed this life 12th Jany. 1784, at sea on board the "Atlas" Indiaman, Captain Cooper, proceeding to the Cape for the recovery of his health, aged 29 years. His remains, preserved in spirits, were brought up to town in the pilot sloop which attended the "Atlas" and interred herein the 30th of the same month.	"The dulce decus of the early Civil Service." It was in the Atlas that Warren Hastings sent home his wife whose fellow passenger Cleveland should have been.

To his wise and beneficent conduct the English East India Company were indebted for the subjecting to their Government the numerous inhabitants of that wild and extensive country the jungleterry. In his private station, by the amiableness of his deportment, the gentleness of his manner, and the goodness and generosity of his heart, he was universally admired, beloved, and respected by all who had the happiness of knowing him.

He married first Harriot Chichely Plowden, descended from the Plowdens of Plowden in Shropshire, by whom he had no issue. Second, Charlotte, Daughter of George Durnford, Esqr., of Winchester, by whom he had two daughters—Charlotte and Penelope, and left them both Infants. Those who had the happiness of his Friendship, saw human Nature in its most amiable form, for he was a kind and tender Husband, a fond and careful Father, the warm patron of those he protected, and the Friend of all Mankind. In his political Character, which will be best learned from the pages of History, he was an upright, just, and honest man, and as his disinterested Conduct gained the esteem of all Ranks of men, so in their Memory he is honored, beloved, lamented. In September his health began to decline, and after a few weeks' illness, he died on the 10th of October, in the year of Our Lord 1784. Aged fifty-one. 

Robert Bruce	Over the remains of Lieutenant-Colonel Robert Bruce, Commandant of the 3rd Battalion of Bengal Artillery, who, in 1771, while yet a youth, opened an honourable earser of service in the Cooch Behar expedition, led the native artillery in the memorable march across the Peninsula of India from Culpee to Surat, acquiring marked approbation in all the active Campaigns of General Goddard from 1778 to 1781. At the recommendation of Governor-General Hastings, was selected in 1782 to direct his Corps, at the reduction of the Fort of Bridge Ghar, till that time deemed impregnable. In 1786, when peace in India and in Europe allowed the enjoyments of home to a soldier, he revisited Britain, there to leave impressions of talents, honour, and domestic virtues on his friends, and on his family, permanent on their memories and its gratitude; but in 1789 when his country called on his strong sense of military honour, resumed the active duties of the field, was sent in 1793 by Lord Cornwallis to conduct the Bengal Artillery, ordered for the siege of Pondicherry, commanded in 1794 the whole artillery in the decisive battle of Beetorah in Rohilcund, with the public thanks of General Sir Robert Abercrombie, continuing in the field from this era till 4th November 1796, when at Diggah, near Dinapore, at the age of 42, a fatal disease, incident to the climate, deprived the service of an excellent officer, and society of one of its brightest ornaments. This mute memorial of the heart is inscribed.






