And confidering (as they have before observed, in their last Report relative to the Bills of Exchange drawn upon the Company by their Servants in India) that the great Expence incurred under the foregoing Heads is an Object of Enquiry highly important, and has been very detrimental to the Affairs of the Company at Home;—they proceeded, in consequence, to take these several Articles of Expence under their Confideration, and shall now report the same:

THEY shall lay before the House the Civil Charges of the several Settlements of the Company, the Returns of the Forces on their Establishments, the Expences of the several different Military Corps, the Military Regulations, the Conduct of the Company's Servants when their Troops were paid, in part or in the whole, by the Nabob; together with Narratives of the most important Alterations which have been made upon these Heads; the Number of Civil and Military Servants appointed by the Company in India, the Method they have followed in recruiting their Troops, and the Orders and Correspondence relative to the Fortifications undertaken and carried on in the several Settlements.

And Your Committee called for the several States of the Salaries, Allowances, and Gratuities, held by the Company's Servants at their Settlements in India; which were presented by Mr. Wilks and Mr. Hoole, and which are as follow; viz.
