Mr. Manship then declared, that he was actuated in his Opposition by no other Motive than an inward Dictator—gave his Reasons for not communicating his Dissent at last Court—observed, that he had wrote several Letters on the 19th, 20th, and 21st September—that the Cash Account he meant was drawn out by the Treasurer, and had on the Debit Side 8 Blanks, which he wished to have filled up by the proper Officers—the Credit Side was for September, October, and November—that a Cash and an Annual Account should always direct his Judgment—that he wanted an Account made up by the proper Officers—declared himself no Stock-jobber, and called upon the Proprietors to accuse him—he took Notice, that Mr. Boulton said, a Cash Account should

direct, and that Lord Chancellor had also said such Account should direct

The Dissent of Mr. Manship was called for by Mr. Boulton, and seconded by Sir George Colebrooke.

Mr. Manship's Letter of the 19th September was read.

Mr. Manship disavows Part of the Minute*, never saw it till 8th October.

Treasury Minute of 19th September was read.

Mr. Manship declared his Sentiments were not in the Minute.

Chairman said he took his own Minutes.

Mr. Manship denied that the Chairman's Minutes were taken at the Committee.

Mr. Manship denied the Minutes being shewn him.

Dissent of Mr. Manship then read.

Chairman observed, that the Annual Account Balance was considerably more this than the last Year; and that he thought no Gentlemen need be alarmed at the general State of Affairs.

Mr. Manship denied saying that he was satisfied, at any Court, that his Letters should not be recorded.

But Sir J. Cockburn observed, that he understood Mr. Manship said he was satisfied.

The Chairman entered into a particular Statement of the Company's Affairs, as they stood then, and at the

last Agreement with Government—he observed there were Goods in Warehouse, amounting to £. 2,900,000, exclusive of September Sale—he said, that after paying several Simple Contract Debts, and an old Debt of £. 250,000, there would then be a Deficiency only of £. 162,000—he observed, that the Company could not be worse by the 1st of August, when they should have paid all the Bills due to that Period, which were 3.5ths of the whole drawn, payable in that Year—he said, that although Opinions without Doors were various, the

Proprietors should confide in Directors in Matters of Dividend.

Mr. *Crichton* questioned Mr. *Tookey*, as to the Account.

Mr. *Sullivan* took Notice, that the Accounts were made up in the truest and most faithful Manner.

Chairman denied that the whole Revenues of *India* have been absorbed in the Charges there, and read the Letter last received from *Bengal*, dated 12th February 1771.
