### PREFACE

The Economic and Statistical Organisation has been bringing out the Statistical Abstract of the State annually. The present issue is the 9th in the series but first issue of the reorganised State, and contains data on the various socioeconomic aspects of Punjab. The information has been given for the year 1950-51 and the last years of First and Second Five-Year Plans and of all the years of the Third Five-Year Plan so as to show the progress made in the different fields of development. A great difficulty was experienced in getting statistical information for the reorganised State, but this was over come, in most of the cases, by collecting data by deputing persons to different departments/places and adjusting the figures which were only available for the composite Punjab.

This publication has served in the past as a reference book for all the departments of the State Government for administrative and policy purposes. It also had a great demand from various Ministries of the Central Government, other State Governments, 'Universities and Research Scholars. As such, ever since its publication, it has been my endeavour to widen its scope so as to cover all important socio-economic aspects. Notes indicating the concepts and definitions used in the statistical tables have been given at the beginning of each section for the facility of the reader. Necessary foot-notes and names of sources from where the information was collected have been shown on the relevant places.

It has been possible to bring out the present edition well in time because of the co-operation of the various departments and expeditious supply of information by our District Statistical Offices. Acknowledgement is also made of the useful work done by Shri M. M. Bhardwaj (Deputy Economic and Statistical Adviser) and his associates Sarvshri M. L. Garg (Research Officer), Purushottam Dass Thakur, M. N. Rishi, S. P. Singh, Ranbir Singh, M. G. Gupta and Surjit Singh Sidhu in preparing this Abstract.

### SECTION II

### CLIMATE

Meteorological data given in this section relate to rainfall and temperature at selected stations in Punjab, average rainfall district-wise, hours and days of bright sunshine, wind speed at one selected centre and mean relative humidity.

Table No. 2.1 shows district-wise monthly rainfall figures which are averages of five years 1961-1965.

In Table No. 2.2 the data presented are about rainfall. The actual rainfall is recorded at 08.30 hours of Indian Standard Time each day at selected stations throughout the State. Rainfall data given in this table relate to 6 selected stations and have been compiled from the daily statements issued by the Regional Meteorological Centre, New Delhi. Normal rainfall figures are based on data of State rainguage stations, except for Patiala where data of observatory stations only are available. These normals are calculated from the available data collected at the respective stations up to the end of 1940, except for Patiala where the period is 1945 to 1950.

Table No. 2.3 gives information regarding temperature. These figures are also based on the daily statements issued by Regional Meteorological Centre, New Delhi, and are recorded at 08.30 hours, Indian Standard Time. Highest and lowest temperatures are the highest and lowest temperatures on a particular day in a month. Mean temperature is one-half of the average maximum plus average of minimum temperatures reported during the month.

Table No. 2.4 contains data regarding sunshine. Sunshine is the condition at the earth's surface when the sun casts a well-defined shadow. It is recorded at Amritsar by Standard Compbell Stocks recorders.

Table No. 2.5 gives information in respect of Wind speed. These data are given for Ludhiana only.

Table No. 2.6 shows mean relative humidity at 6 selected stations. Relative humidity is the measure of the amount of water vapour present in the atmosphere relative to the corresponding amount for saturation.

The figures in this section have been obtained from the Regional Meteorological Centre, New Delhi and Director of Land Records, Punjab

### SECTION III

### AGRICULTURE

Agricultural statistics for 1950-51, 1955-56 and from 1960-61 to 1965-66 regarding classification of area, area and production of principal crops, and yield per hectare of major crops for the State as a whole and district-wise for the year 1965-66 are presented in this section. The data in respect of land revenue assessment for the State as a whole and number of holdings are also given here. The source of information is the Director of Land Records, Punjab and the data relate to Agricultural year which starts from 1st July and ends on 30th June.

Area according to village papers.— It is according to village papers and is based on returns of area prepared by village staff for revenue purposes in the districts, whereas area by professional survey is worked out by the Surveyor-General of India. There is some difference in the two sets of figures because of different methods adopted by them.

Area under forests.—This includes actually forested areas on the lands classed or administered as forest under any legal enactment dealing with forests whether State owned or private except in areas not cadastrally surveyed. Area under forests given in this section does not tally with that of the Forest Department, shown in the section on forest statistics owing to the fact that certain lands though not wooded, are taken as forest by the Forest Department while these are not treated as such by the Director of Land Records, Punjab.

Land not available for cultivation.—This includes absolutely barren and unculturable land like mountains deserts etc., which cannot be brought under plough except at exhorbitant cost, or covered by buildings, roads and railways and water or otherwise appropriated for non-agricultural purposes.

Other uncultivated land excluding fallow lands.—This denotes land available for cultivation, whether not taken up for cultivation or abandoned later on for one reason or the other and includes culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing lands and lands under miscellaneous tree crops and groves.

Fallow lands.—It denotes cultivable land which after abandonment remains uncultivated over a long period called "old fallows" those kept uncultivated during the current year are called 'current fallows'.

Net area sown.—It is the net area sown under crops, the areas sown more than once during the year being counted once only.

Total cropped area.—It includes total area covered with crops during the year. In case different crops are raised on the same land during the year, the same area is counted more than once. Table No. 3.1 gives classification of area of re-organised Punjab by land use for eight years for 1950-51, 1955-56 and from 1960-61 to 1965-66.

Table Nos. 3.2 to 3.9 present district-wise classification.

Table No. 3.10 shows comparative position of various States in this regard for the year 1963-64.

Table No. 3.11 presents data regarding area under and production of principal crops in the Punjab for the years 1950-51, 1955-56 and 1960-61 to 1965-66.

Table Nos. 3.12 and 3.13 show comparative position of various States in regard to the area under and production of principal crops for the year 1965-66.

Table Nos. 3.14 to 3.31 present district-wise data regarding area, production and yield per hectare of principal crops of the Punjab State for the years, 1950-51 1955-56 and 1960-61 to 1965-66 and are based on revised estimates.

Incidence of land revenue assessment on area in Punjab for eight years—1955-56, to 1962-63 is shown in table No. 3.33. The number of holdings in the Punjab with reference to year 1961 is shown in table No. 3.34. Figures for the affected districts have been adjusted on basis of area.

Table No. 3.35 indicates the Index Numbers of Agricultural Production in Punjab for the years 1951-52, 1955-56 and 1960-61 to 1965-66. The last three tables give Fertilizers Production in Punjab—Third Five-Year Plan targets, and receipts and distribution of fertilizers in Punjab for years 1960-61 to 1965-66 and the area repartitioned in Punjab under consolidation operations for the years, 1960-61 to 1965-66.

From the year 1952-53 the yield per hectare and out-turn of wheat, gram, bajra and maize are based on the results obtained from crop cutting experiments by random sampling method for Integrated Punjab and for rice, jowar and barley for preintegrated Punjab only. From 1956-57 all these seven crops have been covered for the whole State. Crop cutting experiments consist of selection of a few villages in each tehsil of a district by random sampling method, selection of a few fields in each selected village randomly and consequently selection of a plot in each selected field at random. The yield per hectare is estimated from the crop harvested on such plots.

The data for the re-organised Punjab have been adjusted on the basis of area where the exact figures were not available and as such are provisional.

#### SECTION IV

#### **IRRIGATION**

The tables in this section contain the Irrigation Statistics of Punjab.

Table No. 4.1 shows data concerning net area under irrigation according to different modes for the State as a whole and district-wise for 1965-66.

Table Nos. 4.2, 4.3 and 4.4 present district-wise gross area irrigated, gross area of crops irrigated as percentage of total cropped area, and area under irrigation according to crop-wise distribution of Punjab respectively.

Table No. 4.5 shows data concerning principal works and results of their operations. These irrigation works include canals and their distributaries and the results of the operations include total capital outlay, gross receipts, working expenses, net revenue and interest on capital outlay, etc. Works are also classified into (i) Preductive, (ii) Unproductive. Table No. 4.6 presents area irrigated for various years. Tables No. 4.7 and 4.8 show the number of tube-wells and other wells in the Punjab.

Productive works are those which produce sufficient revenue to cover the working expenses and interest on capital charge.

Unproductive works are those which consist mostly of works not considered sufficiently remunerative but sanctioned with a view to protecting precarious tracts against famine etc.

Net area under irrigation by different sources for the year 1963-64 has been shown State-wise in the last table.

The information has been collected from the Director of Land Records and the Chief Engineer, Irrigation Works, Punjab.

The data of Rupar, a new district, have mainly been adjusted on basis of area.

### SECTION V

### FORESTS

The first two tab es in this section deal with the area under forests, the next two with the out-turn of forest produce, and table Nos. 5.5 and 5.6 give information regarding area of forests protected from fire and cattle grazing and total revenue and expenditure on forests respectively. The last table gives position of employment of labour in forestry.

Area under forests is classified according to ownership, state and private. Forests owned by corporate bodies and private individuals have been included under private forests. Area under forests is also classified according to legal status, such as "Reserved", "Protected" and "Unclassed". Reserved forests are permanently dedicated either to the production of timber or other forest produce and in them the right of grazing and cultivation is seldom allowed. In protected forests these rights are allowed subject to certain restrictions.

The area under forests shown in this section will not tally with the figures shown under the section "Agriculture" supplied by the Director of Land Records due to different definitions followed by the Forest and Land Records Departments. The Forest Department reckons entire area including non-wooded area under its control as the forest area whereas the Land Records Department calculates it on the basis of actual area under forests but excludes the forest area in non-cadastrally surveyed areas of Kangra and Lahaul and Spiti District

Forest produce is classified into major and minor produce. Under major produce are included timber and firewood, where as minor produce includes bamboos and canes, fodder and grasses, gums and resins, drugs and spices, tan-stuff, and dye-stuff etc. Figures both of quantity and value are given for major produce, but of value only in the case of minor produce.

Data upto 1964-65 are for the Erstwhile Punjab and for 1965-66 for the Re-organised Punjab except in table 5.7. In table 5.7 the figures are for Erstwhile Punjab upto the year 1963-64 and for re-organised Punjab for the year 1964-65.

Data presented in this section have been obtained from the Chief Conservator of Forests, Punjab.

### SECTION VI

### LIVE STOCK AND ANIMAL HUSBANDRY

In this section information is presented relating to livestock, veterinary institutions and their staff, poultry development centres and work done in veterinary institutions during the year, 1965-66. Some information in respect of Fisheries has also been included in this chapter. The information in respect of livestock and agricultural implements is based on quinquennial livestock census, 1961 conducted by the Director of Land Records, Punjab. In the rural areas, the primary livestock data are collected by the revenue agency and in the urban areas by the staff of local bodies. The Livestock Census for 1961 was conducted with reference dat: as 15th April, 1961.

Tables 6.1 to 6.8—In all these tables data have been given for livestock in the Punjab according to 1961 Livestock Census. For the sake of comparison the State totals for the year 1956 have also been shown in all tables.

Tables 6.9 and 6.10 give the number of cattle and poultry per square Kilometre and per thousand human population according to 1961 Census. Table No. 6.11 gives data regarding Agricultural Machinery and Implements in the State district-wise.

Tables 6.12 to 6.13—These two tables indicate the comparative position in respect of livestock and poultry and number of working cattle in various States of India. The data are according to 1961 Livestock Census.

Tables 6.14 to 6.19 —Show the activities of Animal Husbandry Department, i.e., number of veterinary institutions and their staff in Punjab, the position of Livestock Development Centres, work done in Veterinary Institutions, Mortality amongst livestock due to various contagious diseases, number of bulls kept in Artificial Insemination Centres, number of recognised slaughter houses and Veterinary Institutions regionwise, respectively.



### SECTION VIII

### MINERAL PRODUCTION

Statistics of Mineral Production are collected under the Minerals Conservation and Development Rules, 1955 (subsequently revised in 1958). Some data are also collected from mines not covered under the Act.

Information given in this section relates to the erstwhile Punjab. Data for the year 1951 have been obtained from the Geological Survey of India and for 1956 and 1961 to 1965 from the Indian Bureau of Mines as the data are now collected and compiled by the Indian Bureau of Mines.

The basis of valuation is pit's mouth value of production.

The information regarding minor minerals falling outside the purview of Minerals Conservation and Development Rules, 1958, has been obtained from the State Revenue Department/Industries Department.

### SECTION IX

### INDUSTRIES

Information given in this section has been collected from different sources as mentioned at the bottom of every table and relates to :--

- (1) Number of registered factories in Punjab,
- (2) Number of registered working factories and workers employed therein,
- (3) production and value of important industries in the State,
- (4) Industrial loans advanced,
- (5) Khadi and Village Industries, and
- (6) Industrial units.

The information relates to the Erstwhile and Re-organised Punjab. It is possible with this data to make a study of the growth of Industrial development against the background of expansion of various types of facilities and vice versa in the State.

Table 9.1.—Shows the number of factories registered in the State under sections 2m(i), 2m(i) and 85 of the Factories Act, 1948. Section 2mfactory means any premises including the precincts thereof:

- (i) wherein ten or more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months, and in any part of which manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power, or is ordinarily so carried on,
- (ii) wherein twenty or more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding twelve months, and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on without the aid of power, or is so carried on and does not include a mine subject to the operations of the Indian Mines Act, 1923, or a railway running school.

Under Section 85, the State Government is empowered to notify any factory not covered under the above two sections.

Table 9.2.—Gives the size and distribution of registered working factories. This is based on the returns submitted by the factories and does not relate to all the working factories.

Table 9.3.—This table gives detailed information about the number of all registered working factories and workers employed therein by the Standard Industrial Classification. In this table, the number of workers employed has been compiled from the returns submitted by the factories. The estimates of employment for factories not submitting returns have been worked out on the following sources of information mentioned in order of preference :—

### (i) employment data given in form No. 2 for the application of registration and grant or renewal of licences.

- (ii) recent inspections by the Inspectorate staff of the State Labour Department,
- (iii) last years employment data of the foctories.

Table 9.4 and 9.5. These tables show the district-wise and inddustry-wise break-up of registered factories and registered working factories and workers employed therein.

Table 9.6.—This table shows the production and employment of various Industries in the State.

Table 9.7.—This table shows the number of Cotton Textile Mills and spindles and looms installed therein.

Table 9.8.—This table gives the quantity of cotton pressed in the Punjab.

Tables 9.9 to 9.13.—Indicate loans to Industries advanced by the Punjab Financial Corporation from corporation funds and agency funds separately.

Tables 9.14 to 9.19. Relate to the development of Village and Khadi industries in the State.

Table 9.20.—Gives the district-wise break-up of industrial units as in 1961 census.

Table 9.21.—Indicates the extent of employment provided by various Industrial units as in 1961 census.

## SECTION X

## LABOUR

Information in respect of labour and its related activities has been given in different tables. Labour employed under Shops, Commercial Establishments, Hotels and Restaurants is shown in Table No. 10.1.

Table 10.2—The statistics in respect of wages and earnings of factory workers are collected under the Payment of Wages Act, 1936. The provisions of this Act are applicable to all factories registered in the State under Sections 2m(i) and 2m(ii) of Factories Act. Besides it covers about 9,000 industrial establishments as laid down under clauses (a), (d), (e) and (s) of Section 2m(ii) of the Act. The data are based on the returns submitted by the factories and Industrial establishments.

Table 10.3—Average per capita annual earnings of factory workers in India have been given by States.

Tables 10.4 and 10.5—Industrial disputes affect labour and production. These data are collected by State Labour Department under Industrial Disputes Act, 1947—Strikes mean work stoppages declared and organised by workers and Lock-outs refer to work stoppages declared by employers generally after a strike. The number of workers involved means the actual number of workers affected either directly or indirectly in the dispute.

Table 10.6—Shows the number of fatal and non-fatal accidents in factorics covered under Factories Act, 1948.

Table 10.7—Under Workmen's Compensation Act, 1923, compensation is payable to workers employed in scheduled employment for injuries due to accidents resulting in death and disablement (permanent or temporary) and not caused by the fault of the worker himself.

Table 10.8—Shows data regarding trade unions under the Trade Union Act, 1926.

Table 10.9 —Shows wages paid to agricultural and skilled workers (men) in certain selected villages of Punjab. These data are collected monthly and issued by the Economic and Statistical Adviser to Government, Punjab.

Table 10.10 to 10.12—Show the data maintained in Employment Exchanges of State.

Table 10.13—Shows number of applicants on the Live Register of Employment Exchanges by broad occupational groups in various States of India.

Table 10.14—Shows distribution of Government employees working in Punjab State as on the 31st March, 1965 according to basic pay ranges.

The last two tables present number of trainees in various Government Industrial and Technical Institutes and Government Industrial Schools for boys and girls respectively.

### SECTION XI

### TRADE

The three tables in this Section contain information on exports from and imports into the Punjab of the selected commodities from other States in India. The information incorporated in table Nos. 11.1 and 11.2 relates mostly to rail borne trade as there is not much of river-borne trade of the Punjab.

The data in the first two tables relate to food articles, livestock and livestock products, oilseeds and their products, industrial raw materials and semi-manufactures and manufactures. The figures are based on reports entitled 'Accounts relating to the Inland (Rail and River-borne) Trade of India, issued, by the Director-General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India'.

Table No. 11.3 gives mport into and export out of the Punjab of foodgrains by motor vehicles. The figures are based on report entitled 'Inter-State Movement of Food Grains by Motor Vehicles in the Punjab issued by Directorate of Agriculture, Punjab. The information relates to whole of erstwhile Punjab excluding districts of Kangra, Kulu, Lahaul and Spiti and Simla.

### SECTION XII

### PUBLIC HEALTH AND VITAL STATISTICS

Vital Statistics.—Registration of Vital Statistics is compulsory in the Punjab, and is governed by (i) District Board Act, (ii) Small Town Act, (iii) Municipal Act, and (iv) Cantonment Code. Rules and regulations have been framed under these Acts.

The accounting period on the subject is calender year. Deaths have been classified according to causes, seasons and age-groups.

Medical and Health.—Data regarding hospitals, dispensaries, patients treated, and staff employed and income and expenditure are displayed in tables 12.8 to 12.14. These statistics are collected by the Director of Health Services, Punjab in conformity with the regulations laid down from time to time by the Director-General of Health Services, New Delhi. Tables 12.15 and 12.16 present data on in-door and out-door patients and mental patients in the Mental Hospital in Punjab.

Tables 12.17 and 12.18 deal with special Institutions and table 12.19 shows area covered in square kilometres per medical institution and population served per medical institution in the State.

Table 12.20 gives information relating to Ayurvedic and Unani Institutions and staff working in them.

Table 12.21 presents data in respect of number of Family Planning Clinics in Punjab.

Figures of vital Statistics have been adjusted on population basis for re-organised Punjab and as such are provisional.

#### SECTION XIII

#### EDUCATION

The Section deals with data on the educational development in the State for the years 1950-51 to 1963-64.

Tables 13.1 to 13.3 classify educational institutions, both schools and colleges, according to management and nature of education imparted. Table 13.4 contains information on number of scholars, male and female, in recognised institutions maintained by Government, Local Bodies and Private Managements in rural areas of Punjab. Number of teachers in Punjab schools according to qualifications is shown in table 13.5.

Table 13.6 shows total expenditure on recognised institutions as also expenditure per scholar and table 13.7 shows total expenditure on general education.

Number of scholars in the State at different levels of schools and colleges has been shown in table 13.8.

## SECTION XVII

## RAILWAYS

### SECTION XVIII

### JUDICIAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE

This section contains information relating to the administration of civil and criminal justice, prisons and police. The data shown in the tables of this section are self-explanatory and have been compiled from the returns received from the concerned offices of the State Government.

Table Nos. 18.1 to 18.11.—Information relating to the judicial staff administering justice, both civil and ciriminal, number of officers exercising appellate or original jurisdiction, civil and criminal cases instituted and decided, number of persons tried and convicted has been given in these 11 tables. Such data are tabulated in the office of the Registrar, Punjab High Court after collecting these from all courts under the jurisdiction of the High Court, Punjab and District Magistrates. The data supplied by High Court relates to Erstwhile Punjab as it is still a common link.

Table Nos. 18.12 to 18.23.—Number of prisoners convicted and released relating to all jails, subsidiary jails and judicial lock-ups in the State of Punjab have been shown in these tables. Such information is collected and tabulated in the office of the Inspector-General of Prisons, Punjab. ### SECTION XIX

### STATE INCOME OF PUNJAB

The State Income refers to the aggregate of factor incomes originating within the boundary of the State. For estimating the State Income, the entire economic activity has been classified in twelve sectors, viz., Agriculture, Animal Husbandry, Forestry, Fishery, Mining, Factory Establishments, Small Enterprises, Organised Banking and Insurance, other Commerce and Transport, Professions, Liberal Arts and Domestic Services, Public Authorities and House Property.

The total State Income of a year divided by the population of that year gives the *per capita* income which is an index of the level of living of the people.

For detailed discussion of the subject a reference may be made to Publication No. 17 of this Organisation.

The first table in this section gives movement in the Net Output at factor cost and *per capita* Net Output of Punjab at current and constant prices (1952-53).

The second table shows the sectoral distribution of State Domestic Product.

The Third table shows the per capita income in various States of the ountry.

The fourth table gives the net output (at factor cost) and *per capita* net output of reorganised Punjab at current and constant price (1952-53). It also shows the distribution of State Domestic Product.

The estimates for the reorganised Punjab were arrived at as under :---

Districtwise estimates at current prices for the districts falling in reorganised Punjab were added together. For the districts of Sangrur, Ambala and Hoshiarpur, the contribution for the respective districts at current prices was apportioned on the basis of population falling in each of the part transferred. No adjustment was done for Gurdaspur district. Then districtwise estimates adjusted for three districts were summed up to arrive at the estimates at the current prices for reorganised Punjab.

To derive the estimates at constant prices the regionwise and sectorwise income estimates at current prices have been deflated on the basis of atio of sector-wise net income at current and constant prices available at the State level for the year 1964-65.

Scheduled Banks.—Which carry on the business of Banking in India and which (a) have paid up capital and reserves of an aggregate real or exchangeable value of not less than Rs 5 lakhs, (b) are either compenies as defined in section 3 of the Compenies Act, 1956 or corporations or Companies incorporated by as under any law in force in any place outside India or Institutions notified by Central Government on this behalf and (c) satisfy the Reserve Bank that their affairs are not being conducted in a manner detrimental to the interests of their depositors, are eligible for inclusion in the Second Schedule to the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 and when so included are known as "Scheduled Banks'.

### SECTION XXIX

### PRICES

This section consists of twelve tables containing information on harvest prices, wholesale prices, consumer price index numbers for importan<sup>t</sup> towns of Punjab and India and All-India Index numbers of wholesale pricesby groups and sub-groups.

Table 29.1—Harvest prices are the average of weekly wholesale prices in certain selected markets in each district during the periods, closely following the harvesting of various crops. The period prescribed for each crop is shown below the table.

Table 29.2—Statistics of wholesale prices given in this table are based mainly on reports received from market committees of the important market centres. Wholesale prices of 21 Agricultural Commodities during the twelve months preceding the Second World War (September, 1938 to August, 1939) and the calendar years 1939 to 1965 have been given therein.

Table 29.3—Shows the Index numbers (unweighted) of wholesaleprices of 50 commodities (both agricultural and non-agricultural) in Punjab with October—December, 1949=100 as the base: The prices are collected on each Friday. These index numbers are published weekly in the wholesale price bulletin issued by the Economic and Statistical Adviser to Government, Punjab. Annual Index numbers are the averages of the weekly index numbers.

Table 29.4.—Index numbers (weighted) of wholesale prices of 2 important agricultural commodities grown in Punjab are contained in this table. These 21 agricultural commodities together form about 87 per cent of annual value of total agricultural production of State. 120 price quotations are collected dispersed over 35 markets. The selection of markets has been made on basis of relative importance of areas from production point of view. The prices are the primary wholesale prices, i.e., mandi auction prices of the commodities and are collected on each Friday. These Index Numbers are published in the weekly wholesale price Bulletin issued by the Economic and Statistical Adviser to Government, Punjab. The annual index numbers are the averages of the weekly index numbers. Table 29.5—Index number of wholesale prices in India.—This index is compiled by the Economic and Statistical Adviser to the Government of India, Ministry of Commerce and Industry. It is general purpose Index with year 1952-53 as base. This index includes 112 commodities and 555 individual quotations divided into main groups. It is a weighted arithmetic mean of price relatives. The weights assigned to these groups have also been shown which are based on marketed values of domestic produce and value of imports inclusive of duty. Re arding the manufactures (Intermediate and finished products) weights have been fixed according to the gross value of products as obtained from Census of Manufactures, 1948, also taking into account the imports. Weight for electricity is based on energy sold by Electricity undertakings valued at average of all India rates. Weights for petroleum are based on consumption figures.

Tables 29.6 and 29.7—Give information regarding consumer price index numbers for working class at Ludhiana compiled by the Labour Bureau, Government of India and consumer price index numbers of working class for 6 important centres of Punjab, compiled by the Economic and Statistical Adviser to Government, Punjab.

Table 29.8--Consumer Price Index Numbers for Agricultural Labourers in the Punjab State as compiled by the Labour Bureau, Government of India, have been shown in this table.

Table 29.9 and 29.10.—The figures for various centres in India relate only to working class families, the heads of which are in full time and regular employment. They represent the changes in the cost of a given schedule of goods and services consumed by an average working class household in each centre as determined by periodical field enquiries. The items on the list of articles are grouped under five heads, viz., food, fuel and lighting, clothing and beddings, etc., house-rent and miscellaneous. The index for any group is the weighted arithmetic average of the price relatives of the several items of the group, the weights being proportionate to the expenditure of an average working class family on those items. To arrive at the general Index, the group indices are averaged together after being weighted by percentages of total expenditure devoted to each of these groups by an average working class family. Rent figures in all cases are obtained from enquiries held at long intervals. No account is taken of the seasonality in prices of commodities and services included. Annual indices are arithmetic means of monthly indices. The data are collected from the Reserve Bank of India Bulletins.




