INTRODUCTION

The publication in hand, is the ninth issue of the Statistical Abstract of Rajasthan. It contains statistical informations in detail relating to various socio-economic activities in the State. In this issue, tables relating to New Series of Consumers Price Index Number at Ajmer and Jaipur centres, have been newly incorporated and the data on Rajasthan Government Employees by Departments and Monthly Estimated Emoluments of Rajasthan Government Employees has also been brought out in uniformity with the reference period.

The reference period for the data contained is either the calendar year, 1965 or financial/agriculture year 1965-66. In most of the tables, the data published gives information for preceding five years at the State level and districtwise breakups for the reference year.

The data being published in this issue has been processed in the Directorate, after being obtained from various Departments. It is an outcome of unceasing co-operation and assistance of all the Government Departments, to which we offer our sincerest thanks. Every year efforts are made to increase the utility of the publication and we shall be thankful if suggestions are communicated to us for further improvement.

CLIMATE

Temperature.—Observations of temperature of air in shed are recorded at most of the observatories twice a day at 08.30 and 17.30 hours IST. For this purpose thermometers are installed at a height of 4 feet above the ground in Stevenson Screens which provide free access to the air but, at the same time protect the thermometers from direct rays of the sun.

Humidity.—Relative humidity is the measure of water vapours present in the atmosphere relative to the corresponding amount for saturation. It is recorded at the principal observatories by standard record at 08.30 and 17.30 hours IST.

The temperature and humidity data has been compiled from the daily bulletin issued by the Meteorological Department, Government of India.

Rain fall.—Actual rainfall is recorded at the stations at 08.30 IST. every day. The amount measured gives the rainfall of the previous 24 hours and the data is tabulated by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan. To arrive at the figures in inches, the given figures (in Cms.) may be divided by 2.54.

Normal Annual rainfall is the average of rainfall data for the past 10 years and was last worked out for each district headquarter in the year 1950.

AGRICULTURE

Land Utilisation:—The main purpose of the table of Land Utilisation is to indicate broadly the ways in which the land of the State is utilised. The classification of area was formerly available under five classes, which have been amplified to fall in line with standard classification as laid down by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Government of India.

Geographical Area:—Area according to Surveyor General of India (professional survey) is calculated in the office of the Surveyor General of India and area according to village papers is based on the returns of area estimates prepared by the Revenue Staff of the State. There is a slight difference between these two sets of figures as pointed out in the note to section 2 (Area and Population) because of the different methods by which they are collected and also because some areas are unsurveyed.

Forests:—The area shown under forests in the table on Land Utilisation may not tally with that given by the Forest Department because (i) the Forest Department reports forests worked out by the Forest Department while the table on Agricultural Statistics includes in addition, forest area administered by district officers and (ii) certain villages and other lands not covered by forest but worked out by Forest Department are not treated as forests in the returns of Agricultural Statistics.

Area not available for Cultivation:—This stands for all land which is absolutely barren or un-cultivable covered by buildings, water or roads or otherwise appropriated for non-agricultural purposes. Under sub-head "Land put to non-agricultural use" is included land occupied by buildings, roads, railways or under water and other lands put to uses other than agriculture while under the sub-head "Barren and unculturable land" come mountains, deserts etc.

Other Uncultivated Land excluding Fallow Land:—This denotes land available for cultivation but not taken up and includes culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing land and land under miscellaneous tree crops and groves. The last one is that type of culturable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use.

Fallow Land:—It includes current fallow i.e. land which is left fallow during the current year only and others fallow lands i.e. lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

Net Area Sown, Area Sown more than once and Total Cropped Area:—In computing the net area sown, areas sown more than once have been counted only once. Under the head "Area sown more than once" area sown with two and more than two crops in same year is counted as many times as the crop is sown. The total cropped area is the total of net area sown and area sown more than once.

Area and Production of Crops:—The figures of area and production are given for principal cereals and pulses commercial crops. The area figures are compiled by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan, from the Agricultural Statistics returns prepared by the revenue staff. While the production figures for the State as a whole are estimated on the basis of crop-cutting experiment results for Bajra, Jowar, Maize, Wheat, Barley, Gram, Linseed, Sesamum, Rape & Mustard and Cotton. For other crops, it is calculated on the basis of average normal yield of past 10 years. For estimating the production at the district level, yield is worked out separately for each of the Major districts, depending upon different crops and for the remaining districts the estimates are only tentative. The total of the districts tallies with the production for the State as a whole.

The figures as given are those based on final forecast, as well as those based on revised estimates as issued from time to time along with the final forecast for the following year. The data relate to the agricultural year ending June.

Average Yield of Principal Crops:—It has been calculated by dividing production figures by area.

Agricultural Implements and Machinery:—The figures relate to the agricultural implements and machinery in actual use are reported by the Revenue Staff in the Agricultural Statistics Returns as recorded in the Quinquennial Livestock Census. The data in compiled form is supplied to this Directorate by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan.

INDEX NUMBERS :—

Coverage:—The present series of Index Numbers of Agricultural production in Rajasthan covers 22 principal crops for which forecasts are issued by the Board of Revenue from time to time. These crops occupy about 90 per cent of the gross area sown in the State. These 22 crops are further sub-divided into two main groups, namely, food-Crops and non-food-Crops and five sub-groups, namely, cereals, pulses, oil seeds, fibres and miscellaneous.

Subject to the availability of reliable data, the scope will be extended to other crops and livestock products not covered at present. The data about the crops included in the present series pertains to the reorganised State of Rajasthan. As the area under the crops included for the preparation of the Index cover about 90 per cent of the gross area sown, the trends, in their production are fairly representative of the trend of the entire agricultural production in the State.

Base Period:—Although the year 1949-50 has been adopted as the base year in the case of All India Index, the political and economic backgrounds of formation of Rajasthan State completely ruled out the possibility of adoption of the same year as the base in the case of this State. An examination of the acreage and yield figures revealed that variation in them from year to year were so marked as to give the feeling that no single year could be adopted as the base year and that instead, an average of a number of years should be taken as the base. An examination of the annual rainfall and production data further revealed that agricultural production in Rajasthan is subject to cyclical fluctuations each cycle extending over a period of four years. Since 1952-53 was observed to be a normal year in respect of both production and prices as also in respect of the changes in the extent of reporting area, the four years period commencing from 1952-53 to 1955-56 was adopted as the base period.

Method of Construction of Index Numbers:—To make year to year figures production of as published in the "Crop Estimate" comparable the adjustment for changes in coverage has been effected with the help of the area figures reported in the Annual Agricultural Statistics Returns and the yield figures reported in the "revised estimates". Since the reporting area will be increasing with the resumption of Jagir in the State, one assumption has been made uniformly that the variation in production in the non-reporting area is the same as that in the reporting areas in the 'aggregate'. To provide for the changes in the area and yield figures due to consequent extension in geographical coverage, the index numbers have been constructed by the chain base method.

For each crop, the estimated production during a year has been expressed as a production relative with the corresponding estimated production in the preceding year as base. These production relatives for each crop have been linked with that of the year through intervening chain relatives to give the production indices for that crop. The weighted arithmetic average of these production indices has been taken to represent the sub-group, the group and all commodity index numbers.

Weights:—Weights have been assigned to the different commodities in the same proportion, which the average value of its production bears to the total average value of production of all commodities during the base period. The production has been valued at the annual harvest prices of the commodities prevailing each year during the base period.

The concept of production utilised in the construction of index numbers is that of gross production of crops. Revised estimates of yield for each year have further been processed as indicated in Section III above to get the estimated yield for which figures have been used for construction of the index numbers.

IRRIGATION

Net Irrigated Area.—The total area irrigated from different sources represents net irrigated area. If two or more crops are irrigated in the same year from the same source, the area is counted only once.

Gross Irrigated Area.—Total area irrigated under different crops represents gross irrigated area and includes area irrigated under more than one crop during the same year. Area irrigated more than once in a single harvest is counted only once.

The data on irrigation by sources and crops is compiled by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan from the data contained in the Annual Agricultural Statistics Returns prepared by the Revenue Staff. The information on works under Third Five Year Plan is supplied by the Irrigation Department, Rajasthan. The data contained in Table No. 4.1 relates only to plan works in progress.

MINING

The mineral statistics are collected and compiled by the Directorate of Mines and Geology, Rajasthan. To supply the data in case of major and minor minerals is a statutory obligation on the part of the lessees, but in case of certain minor minerals and specially building materials, where rent-cum-royalty leases are granted, the production, sale value and average number of persons employed per day are estimated on the basis of royalty collected through royalty collection contractors. The data in tables has been compiled for the administrative divisions/districts of the Directorate of Mines and Geology, which vary from the revenue districts.

INDUSTRIES

Annual Survey of Industries.—Till the year 1960 the data with regard to industrial statistics were collected under the Census of Manufacturing Industries. Since 1961 it has been started to be collected under the Annual Survey of Industries under Collection of Statistics Act, 1953. The coverage of this survey extends to the entire factories sector, factories being those registered under section 2(M) of the Factories Act, 1948. The data so collected relates to a calendar year except in the case of sugar industry for which the year ending 30th June falling within the calendar year under Survey is adopted. Factories engaged in cotton ginning, cleaning and pressing and electric light and power (generation, transmission and distribution of electric energy) are as a special case permitted to submit returns for the year ending 31st August falling within the calendar year and 31st March following calendar year under survey respectively. The following are the important definitions and concepts used for this survey:—

Productive Capital.—It includes both fixed and working capital. Fixed capital comprises of land, buildings including those under construction, improvement to land and other construction; plant, machinery, tools (including uninstalled), transport equipment, other fixed assets such as furniture, fixture etc. and intangible assets. Working capital consists of stock of materials, stores, semi-finished goods including work in progress, finished products and by-products, cash in hand and at the bank and the algebraic sum of sundry creditors as represented by (a) outstanding factory payments e. g. rent, wages, interest and dividend, (b) purchase of goods and services, (c) short term service loans and advances and sundry debtors comprising amount due to the factory on account of sale of goods and services and advances towards purchase and tax-payment.

Worker.—As defined under section 2(M) of the Indian Factories Act, 1948, a worker means a person employed, directly or through any agency, whether for wages or not, in any manufacturing process or in cleaning any part of the machinery or premises used for a manufacturing process, or any other kind of work, incidental to or connected with the manufacturing process, or the subject of the manufacturing process.

Persons other than workers.—This head includes persons employed in administrative and clerical jobs within factory area and all those engaged in effecting delivery of the output.

Number of persons employed.—The average number of persons employed by each factory has been computed by taking the total attendance of persons in all the shifts on all working days and dividing it by the number of days worked. These averages are aggregated for all factories in the State or industry, as the case may be and the aggregate is taken as the number of persons employed in the State or industry respectively. It includes persons attending and on leave with pay, such as sick leave, casual leave or paid vacation and also those engaged in welfare activities.

Wages.—The term wages is used in the same sense as defined in section 2 (vi) of the Payment of Wages Act, 1936 and denotes all remunerations capable of being expressed in terms of money which would if the terms of contract of employment express or implied, were fulfilled, be payable whether conditionally upon the regular attendance, good work or conduct or behaviour of the persons employed or otherwise to a person employed in respect of his employment or of work done in such employment and includes any bonus or other additional remuneration of the nature aforesaid which would be so payable, and any sum payable to such person by reason of the termination of his employment, but does not include—

- (a) the value of any house, accommodation, supply of light, water, medical attendance or other amenity for any services specifically excluded by general or special order of the State Government,
- (b) any contribution paid by the employer to any pension fund or provident fund,
- (c) any travelling allowance or the value of any travelling concession,
- (d) any sum paid to the person employed to defray special expenses entailed on him by the nature of his employment,
- (e) any gratuity payable on discharge.

Other benefits.—These include various benefits over and above wages such as free or subsidised housing, food-grains at concessional rates etc.

Purchase value of fuels and raw materials consumed.—This is the purchase value of fuels and raw materials consumed in the factory and includes the purchase price. The value of fuel or materials manufactured within the factory and consumed for further processing has not been accounted. Formerly, under the Census of Manufacturing Industries it also included its transportation charges and other incidental cost like payment of commission to agents etc.

Other expenses.—Under this head, are included transportation charges, directors and managing agents fees and interest paid, etc.

Depreciation.—Depreciation on fixed assets is calculated at the rates allowed by the Income Tax authorities for assessing taxable income.

Ex-factory selling value of products and by-products.—This represents the value of products and by-products of the factory and is exclusive of transport charges from the factory, commission to selling agents etc. This term includes all products made during the year for sale (whether actually sold during the year or not).

Value of work done for others.—This means value of work done by the factory for others on payment when the materials are supplied by them.

Output.—It is the aggregate value of products and by-products manufactured for sale and of work done for customers and adjusted for the difference in value of stocks or semi-finished goods at the beginning and the end of the survey year.

Value added by manufacture.—This represents that part of the value of product which is created in the factory and is computed by deducting from the gross ex-factory value of output, the value of input comprising cost of materials, fuels, amount paid for work done by the concerns, other expenses (which includes cost of transport, fees of directors and managing agents, interest charges etc. and depreciation of fixed assets).

TRADE

The trade statistics give quantity (generally net weight i.e. exclusive of packing) of certain commodities exported from the State of Rajasthan to other States and imported from other States into Rajasthan. Data relate to river and rail borne trade only and are presented for the financial year (April to March). The figures are compiled by the Director General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, Calcutta and are published in the 'Accounts Relating to the Inland (Rail and River borne) Trade of India.'

These statistics are recorded on 'Import basis'. According to the arrangements in force, each of Railways register such traffic en-route to a destination on a different railway station on the same or to a station on the same system but located outside the trade blocks. The imports into the station on the minor railways are recorded by the major railway connecting them. The traffic carried partly by rail and partly by river, when booked through and carried by steamers running in connection with railways, is to be recorded generally by the railway administration concerned.

PRICES

Consumer's Price Index Numbers for Working Classes (Ajmer and Beawar).—These indices relate only to working class families of Ajmer and Beawar. These represent change in the cost of a given basket of goods and services consumed by an average working class household. The items in the list of articles are grouped under five heads viz., food, fuel and lighting, clothing, bedding and footwear, house rent and miscellaneous and separate indices are worked out for individual groups. These are worked out and supplied by the Director, Labour Bureau, Government of India, Simla. The prices of certain prescribed commodities for this purpose are collected by the Labour Bureau, Simla for these centres of Rajasthan through the agency of this Directorate.

Consumer Price Index Numbers for Jaipur (Interim Series).—These indices relate to working class families of Jaipur city. Other details of the indices are the same as those for Ajmer and Beawar centres given above except that both the collection of the prices as well as the compilation of the index numbers is done by the Directorate and the series are based on the family budget inquiry conducted by the State Government in the year 1955-56.

Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices in Rajasthan.—The Directorate of Economics and Statistics has compiled index numbers of wholesale prices for measuring the variations in the price level in the State. It is a general purpose index with the year 1952-53 as base. The index is divided into four major groups viz., food articles, industrial raw materials, fuel, power and lubricants and manufactured articles. In all it covers 59 items for which 98 quotations are collected from 22 centres in the State by the Directorate on every Friday.

Farm Harvest Prices.—The farm harvest price is the average wholesale price at which the commodity is sold by the producer to the trader at the village site during the harvest period. The average farm price of a commodity for the State as a whole is arrived at by the method of weighted average, with the district production figures for the current years as weights.

Spot Quotations of Bullion.—The prices relate to the spot quotations at Jaipur City. These are collected on every Friday by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. The average price is the simple average of the highest and lowest prices. Like-wise the monthly averages are also simple arithmetic averages of weekly prices.

New Series of Consumer Price Index Numbers for Jaipur and Ajmer centres.

Introductory.—Jaipur and Ajmer were among the 50 centres selected for conducting fresh Family Living Surveys among industrial workers under the Government of India's scheme during the Second Five Year Plan. Accordingly, Family Living Surveys were conducted by the Labour Bureau, Government of India, Simla, at these two centres during the period September 1958 to August 1959 in the course of which data were collected from 359 families for Ajmer centre and 239 families for Jaipur centre. Both single member families and multi-member families were covered in the course of survey and an average budget giving a combined expenditure pattern of both types of families was tabulated.

Weighing Diagram.—On the basis of expenditure of above families an average budget for each centre was prepared. The weights to various commodities/sub-group/group, being their respective share of expenditure in an average budget. The following items of non-consumption expenditure and non-priceable expenditure were excluded from the average budget.

- (a) All items under the sub-group "Subscription etc".
- (b) All items under the sub-group "Taxes"
- (c) All items under the sub-group "Interest, Litigation and Remittances".

(d) All items under the sub-group 'Savings and Investments' and

(e) Debts Repaid.

The rest of the items in the average budget have been classified in the various sub-groups and groups. Suitable imputations were also done for the unpriced items and those having insignificant expenditure. The weighing diagram for both the centres is given below:—

The special feature of the Series is the varying monthly weights for the components of sub-group "Fruits and Vegetables" which has a highly seasonal character and introduction of half-yearly varying index for House Rent.

Base Year.—Calendar year 1960 has been taken as the base period. For each month a pooled average of all the quotations from all the four markets in each centre has been taken as the average monthly price. A simple average of the monthly average prices for 1960 has been taken as the base price for each item.

Collection of prices.—Price Collection work at each centre is being done by four price collectors under the supervision of the District Statistician at the respective centre. The localities selected for price collection at the two centres are as follows:—

Jaipur Centre

1. Chandpole
2. Johri Bazar
3. Ramganj
4. Station Road

Ajmer Centre

1. Kaisarganj
2. Nagra
3. Ramganj
4. Srinagar

Prices for each item for which detailed specifications etc. have been given are collected weekly on every Sunday at Ajmer and Friday at Jaipur from selected shops. The price returns are subjected to a close scrutiny at both Labour Bureau, Simla and the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan, Jaipur, before the price quotations are utilised for preparation of Consumer Price Index Numbers.

Method of computation.—The Index for each centre has been calculated by Laspeyres's formula as a weighted average of price relatives the weights being proportion of expenditure as determined from the Family Living Survey. Price relatives for the items for a current month are obtained by expressing the average monthly price of an item for the current month as a percentage of the corresponding base price. In case where more than one variety are being priced for an item the price relative is calculated separately for each variety and then a simple average of these price relatives is taken to be the price relative of this item.

The price relative of each item is multiplied by its weight in the sub-group/group and the sum of those products for all items in a sub-group/group is divided by the sum of the weights of the item, i.e. 100, and the resultant figure is the sub-group/group index. The sub-group index numbers in the "Food and Miscellaneous" groups are multiplied by their respective sub group weights and the sum of the products when divided by the sum of the weights, i.e. 100 yields the "Food and Miscellaneous" Group Index respectively. For determining the general consumer price index numbers for a month, the group index numbers are again multiplied by the total weight of the different groups and the total product is divided by the sum of the group weights.

The group-wise and general indices from 1961 to 1965 and monthly indices for 1965 for both Jaipur and Ajmer centres have been given in the Tables. 10.6 and 10.7, respectively.

PUBLIC FINANCE

Receipts and expenditure of the State Government have been shown in this section. The data for these tables have been culled out the annual budget volume published by the Finance Department of the Government of Rajasthan. The figures represent actuals for the past 4 years, revised budget estimates for the preceding year and budget estimates for the current financial year. All figures relate to financial year from April to March. The tables have been classified on the basis of independent economically significant categories. For instance, the receipts have been classified into tax revenue, non-tax revenue and the like. Similarly, the expenditure has been classified into revenue, capital, development and non-development. Development expenditure includes expenditure for Economic Development and on Social Services.

The tax revenue of the State has been classified into two important heads viz. the State Tax Revenue and the Receipts from Centrally levied taxes and total tax revenue has also been represented under Direct and Indirect taxes in a separate table. The important sources of State Tax Revenues are Land Revenue, State Excise Duties, Sales Tax, Tax on Motor Vehicles and Stamps and Registration. The receipts from centrally levied taxes represent the share of Rajasthan Government from the divisible pool of Income Tax, Union Excise Duties, Tax on Railway fares and Estate Duty, which are on the basis of recommendations of the Third Finance Commission and amount to 3.97, 5.93, 0.85 and 4.67 percent respectively of the total divisible pool allotted to the States. The non-tax Revenue largely consists of receipts from Forests, Irrigation, Multi-purpose river valley project, Civil Works and receipts from Civil Administration etc. The total revenue expenditure has been broadly classified into development and non-development expenditure. The development expenditure has been further classified into expenditure on economic development and expenditure on social services with a view to present in a concise and consolidated form the progress of development expenditure on revenue account into the broad categories which represent the basic objective of the plans.

Under the head expenditure on non-development services, the items included under direct demands on revenue, comprises establishment charges for the collection of Land Revenue, State Excise Duties, Sales Tax and other important sources of the revenue. Debt services include the amount of interest paid on public debt.

The total capital expenditure has also been classified into development and non-developmental categories. The items included in Government trading under capital expenditure relate to the charges incurred for grain supply schemes, distribution of seeds, fertilisers and implements etc.

The amount shown in the permanent debt represents the receipts on account of public loans floated during the years 1956, 1958, 1959, 1960 and 1961 which are repayable in 1968, 1969, 1970, 1971 and 1972 respectively.

The public account transactions have been given in a consolidated form showing the total of receipts and disbursements in table 13.14 under the head 'Debt, Deposit and Remittance transactions'.

Index numbers have also been given in most of the tables under this section with the year 1951-52 as base to facilitate a ready comparison of the financial transactions of the State Government from the beginning of the first five year plan over the years. The indices are simple arithmetic averages;

Income Tax.—Income tax Statistics, relate to the assessment on account of income-tax, super-tax and surcharge made by the Income-tax Department, Government of India. The figures refer to assessment made under the Income-tax Act and do not include demands raised for advanced payment, provisional assessment and miscellaneous

demands like penalties, warrant of fees etc. Figures of taxes represent the demand raised and not the collection actually made against these demands. These tables analyse the demand for income tax, supertax and surcharge, according to the class assesses viz., (1) Individual, (2) Hindu Undivided Families, (3) Registered Firms, (4) Unregistered Firms and other associations of persons and (5) Company and other concern assessable at company rate. The statements are designed to show the total tax demand payable by assesses and net income in their hands after the payment of tax. The number of assesses shown are in respect of each source of income and an assessee having more than one source is included under each of the source from which he derived his income. The data have been supplied by the Central Board of Revenue, Government of India.

LABOUR

Trade Unions:—Data in the table 14.1 relate to trade unions registered and cancelled under the Indian Trade Unions Act, 1926. The statistics in table 14.1 relate to only those trade unions which have submitted returns.

Industrial Complaints:—Only the number of complaints by causes received in the Labour Department, have been reported.

Industrial Disputes:—Industrial disputes relate to strikes and lock-outs resulting in stoppage of work involving ten or more workers in all sectors of employment including factories, transport, municipal services etc. sympathetic strikes and certain other types of stoppages which do not strictly come under the definition of Industrial disputes as laid down in the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947, are not covered.

Factory Accidents:—Under this head are covered only the accidents occurring in factories (enquired into) which result into either death or injury to a worker necessitating his absence from work for 48 hours or more. This information is collected under the Indian Factories Act, 1948. The data has been compiled in this Directorate from the monthly reports on labour situation issued by the Labour Department, Rajasthan and its Annual Administration Reports.

Manshifts Worked:—Number of manshifts worked during the month is obtained by adding together the number of workers who worked on each shift on each day of the month i. e. the total presence of all the workers in the month.

Manshifts Lost:—Number of manshifts lost during the month on account of absence is obtained by adding together the number of workers absent on each shift on each day during the month. Manshifts lost by absence due to strikes, lock-out or employer order lay off are to be excluded.

Manshifts Scheduled to work:—This is total of manshifts worked and lost.

Absenteeism in Factories:—It is the percentage of manshifts lost to manshifts scheduled to work and has been worked out as under:—

$$\frac{\text{Manshifts-lost}}{\text{Total Manshifts worked+lost}} \times 100$$

Till the year 1960 the Directorate of Economics and Statistics was collecting quarterly labour returns on voluntary basis from all the factories registered under section 2m (i) and (ii) of the Indian Factories Act, 1948. Since the year 1961 this data has been collected on annual basis with monthly and quarterly breakdowns under the Annual Survey of Industries.

EMPLOYMENT

This section deals with mandays worked by industrial workers and their earnings. Statistics relating to mandays worked by industries and average daily cash earnings of industrial workers have been compiled in the Directorate of Economics & Statistics on the basis of returns collected under Annual Survey of Industries from the factories registered under section 2 (M) of the Indian Factories Act, 1948. The returns from individual factories are treated as confidential and no figures for any individual factory are presented unless there are atleast three units in the same Industry or the concerned factories have so consented. The average daily cash earnings have been obtained by dividing the gross earnings of the workers by the mandays paid for.

Employment in Mining.—The supply of such data to the Directorate of Mines and Geology, Rajasthan is a statutory obligation on the part of the lessors. But in case of certain minor minerals and especially building materials where rent-cum-royalty leases are granted average number of persons employed per day are just estimated on the basis of royalty collected through royalty collection contracts. In case of certain minerals where data for any particular year were not available, these have been estimated on the basis of production during the last year. The figures given in this table represent the daily labour employed both above-ground and under ground.

Rajasthan Government Employees.—The Directorate of Economics and Statistics is conducting a regular Census of Rajasthan Government Employees on half-yearly basis. The first census was conducted for the employees as on 31-12-56. The data are collected separately for gazetted and non-gazetted staff under various pay ranges. The non-gazetted staff has been further sub-divided into permanent, temporary, part-time, piece rate etc; while the gazetted staff has been sub-divided into permanent and temporary. The data in the prescribed form are supplied by the Drawing and Disbursing Officers to the respective Heads of the Departments and they in turn compile the data for their departments and pass on to the Directorate of Economics and Statistics for compilation at State level. Employment represents the actuals as on the date of census while the monthly emoluments are estimated by multiplying the total employees with the value of the respective ranges.

Employment Exchanges.—Statistics under this section show the working of the employment exchanges in Rajasthan. The nature of works undertaken by the employment exchanges consists of registering people who are seeking employment and securing employment for them. The data are supplied regularly by the Directorate of Employment, Rajasthan.

Roads.—The data contained in the table relates to the roads maintained by Public Works Department only and does not include roads maintained by Local Bodies and others. They also include national highways though they are under the direct control of the C.P.W.D., Government of India.

Transport.—Data on Motor Vehicles and Road Accidents are collected directly by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan from the office of the Director of Transport and Superintendent of Police, C.I.D., Rajasthan, respectively. Motor Vehicles on road represent all vehicles actually plying while the new registrations are given under the head 'Motor Vehicles Registration'.

Posts and Telegraphs.—This section presents data relating to the different branches of the Posts and Telegraph Department and supplied by the Directorate of Posts and Telegraph, Rajasthan Circle.

EDUCATION

This section presents data on literacy as available from the 1961 Census and other educational statistics supplied by the Director of Primary and Secondary Education, Rajasthan who, in turn, collects from the educational institutions of all standards for submission to the Ministry of Education, Government of India, in form 'A'. The data on examination results are based on the information supplied by the University of Rajasthan, Board of Higher Secondary Education, Rajasthan and the Directorate of Primary and Secondary Education, Rajasthan for the portions covered by them. For the purpose of these tables all statistics refer to recognised institutions only except for primary schools where unrecognised institutions have also been included.

Literate and Educated Persons.— A Literate person has been defined as one who can both read and write while an Educated person can both read and write and has also passed a written examination or examinations as proof and educational standard attained.

Schools/Colleges of Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering, Law, Medicine, Physical Education, Teachers' Training, Veterinary Science etc., come under Professional Education while those for Music, Dancing, Fine Arts, Oriental Studies, Social Education etc., under Special Education. All other types of studies come under General Education. Co-educational institutions are covered under institutions for boys.

Scholar means a student admitted and getting education in any of the above referred institutions as regular student on roll as on the 31st March of the reporting year.

Teacher means a whole time person appointed by the management for teaching as on the 31st March of the reporting year.

Expenditure means the amount actually spent on education including recurring and non-recurring charges up to 31st March of the reporting year. Indirect expenditure represents the amount incurred on direction, buildings, furniture, scholarships and other miscellaneous items. Its nature is such that it can not be apportioned to each type of institution.

Examination results relate to those students who were educated in any of the above referred institutions during the reporting year as well as those appeared as private candidates. The data in respect of candidates passed are inclusive of supplementary examination results.

MEDICAL AND HEALTH

1. *Government Medical Institutions.*—The distinction between a hospital and a dispensary has been made on the basis of provision of in-patient beds. A hospital has beds where as a dispensary has none. Accordingly T. B. clinics without beds have been grouped under dispensaries. The term general hospital here signifies those hospitals where patients of all nature may find treatment and as such the Zanana Hospital have been grouped under general hospitals.

The Primary Health Centre is a composite institution providing facilities of in-door and out-door treatment, maternity and preventive health work. The information contained in this issue relates to those primary health centres which are actually functioning at the end of the year.

2. *In-patient Beds.*—The classification of in-patient beds is made according to diseases. As such the general beds here signify all those beds which are not meant for any particular disease and therefore include the beds available in primary health centres as well. The beds shown under maternity head include beds available in State run maternity and child welfare centres.

3. *Medical and Health.*—The number of medical personnel is based on the sanctioned strength of State public hospitals, dispensaries, primary health centres, family planning centres, maternity and child welfare centres clinics health workers etc.

4. *Patients treated.*—The increase in number of patients treated from year to year reflects the increased number of patients who came to State-run medical institutions instead of remaining without treatment or going to private practitioners. Patients classified by diseases do not tally with the total patients due to administrative difficulties in registration system at different stages.

5. *Registered Deaths by Causes.*—The data are based on the reports received from health staff by the Directorate of Medical and Health Services, Rajasthan. Cent-percent cases of deaths occurring in remote areas are not reported to the local health authorities. Consequently there is omission to this extent. The fluctuation in the number of death may perhaps be due to better report in some of the years.

6. *Birth and Death rates and infant and Maternal Mortality rates.*—The birth and death rates relate to towns having mid year estimated population of 30,000 and above. The rates have been worked out per 1000 of population. In case of infant and maternal mortality rates the registration area is changing from year to year and as such the actual number of towns and Panchayat Samities under registration area for each year has been given. The infant mortality and maternal mortality rates were calculated on 1000 live births and 1000 total births (including still births) respectively. The birth and death rates and infant and mortality rates are showing fluctuations from year to year mainly due to the defect in registration. There was to a certain extent under registration as well as mis-registration.

The statistics in respect of modern medicine and birth and death rates and infant and maternal mortality rates have been made available by the Director of Medical and Health Services, Rajasthan and in respect of Ayurvedic and Unani system by the Director of Ayurved, Rajasthan.

HOUSING

In Rajasthan, 5 types of housing schemes viz., (i) Low income group housing, (ii) Middle income group housing, (iii) Subsidised industrial housing, (iv) Rural housing and (v) Slum clearance and sweepers' housing are in operation. Of these, information relating to first three categories are presented in Table No. 19.1.

Low Income Group Housing.—This is a plan scheme and is controlled by the Local Self-Government Department (now known as Town Planning Department), Government of Rajasthan. Under this scheme loans up to Rs. 8,000/- are disbursed by the Collector, to the persons having an annual income up to Rs. 6,000/- for the construction of residential buildings. The loanee has to contribute at least 20 per cent of the cost of construction. During the year 1957-58 the scheme was in operation at Ajmer, Alwar, Bharatpur, Bhilwara, Bikaner, Chittorgarh, Dungarpur, Ganganagar, Jaipur, Jodhpur, Kota, Nagaur, Pali, Sikar and Udaipur district headquarters while since 1958-59 it is in operation at all the district head-quarters.

Middle Income Group Housing.—This is a non-plan scheme and is also controlled by Local Self-Government Department (now known as Town Planning Department), Government of Rajasthan. Under this scheme, loans up to Rs. 16,000/- (Rs. 20,000/- in case of those who do not possess a plot of land) are disbursed by the Collectors to the persons having an annual income between Rs. 6,000/- to Rs. 12,000/- for residential buildings at district headquarters except Bundi, Chittorgarh, Churu, Dungarpur, Jaisalmer, Jhalawar, Sikar and Tonk. During the year 1961-62 while Jhalawar was newly covered, no loans were disbursed at Jalore, Nagaur and Sirohi.

Subsidised Industrial Housing.—This is a plan scheme for the benefit of industrial workers and is being controlled by the Labour Commissioner, Rajasthan and executed by the Public Works Department (Buildings & Roads). The scheme was in operation at Bhilwara, Jaipur and Pali towns during 1957-58. It was extended to Ganganagar in 1958-59 and to Zawar mines (Udaipur), Beawar, Sawai-Madhopur and Alwar (Private Sector) in 1960-61 and to Kota in 1961-62.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The arrangement of sectors during the Third Five Year Plan has been somewhat different than that adopted during first two plans and is more exhaustive. As in the case of Second Plan, the data for the Year 1963-64 have also been collected from the various plan executing authorities on monthly, quarterly and annual basis and processed in the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. The expenditure reported in this table is only that spent against State plan ceiling. The figures of expenditure presented are here for the year 1965-66. The figures for 1961-62, and 1962-63, and 1963-64 and 1964-65 are reconciled/revised as far as possible.

While the original Third Five Year Plan of the State remains unchanged, in the second quarter of the year 1962-63 the State Government decided to start first these schemes which it considered essential and for which funds were to be provided under all circumstances and subsequently those schemes which are not of such consequence and for which fund will be provided depending upon the preference and the resources of the State Govt. during the Third Plan. During 1965-66 Rs. 46.90 crores of the total Third Five Year Plan outlay were earmarked for the execution of various development schemes. Towards the later part of the year 1965-66 the need for readjustment of allocation was felt to achieve at least the essential physical targets and as such the annual plan of the State had to be modified and the revised outlay was placed at Rs. 53.61 crores.

The scheme-wise details of allotment and expenditure and physical targets and achievement for the year 1965-66 are given in Table 20.3 and 20.4 respectively.

The district-wise expenditure, given in table 20.1 presents the break-up of total expenditure in the State in two categories viz (a) Schemes operating in district, (b) Headquarter scheme and others. Category (a) includes schemes which are operated in the districts. In case where a particular scheme which is beneficial to more than one district, the apportionment of the expenditure to individual district is based on the proportion of benefit derived by each district therefrom. Cases where the scheme is beneficial to the State as a whole like technical institutes are classified in this category and the expenditure is showed in the district where the institute is located. Expenditure under category (b) generally covers provision of staff at Headquarters for supervision and implementation of various plan schemes. Expenditure incurred on tools and plants which cannot be appropriated to individual schemes is also included under this category. Further expenditure on schemes for which district-wise break up is neither available nor can be worked out for want of basis for apportionment is also included under category (b).

Community Development.—The Block is treated as a unit of administration for the purpose of Planning and Development. According to the stage of development the blocks have been divided into following three categories—

(i) **Pre-extension Block.**—Which is declared as such as a fore-runner to these intensive phase of development. Its life is generally one year. Now there is no pre-extension block in the State.

(ii) **First Stage Block.**—Declared as such after completion of pre-extension stage for intensive development. It works for 5 years subject to further extension.

(iii) **Second Stage Block.**—Declared as such after it has completed its operational period of intensive development. Its life is 5 years.

In Table 20.5, year of opening stage of block as at the end of 1962, villages covered and their area and rural population served by each block has been given while table 20.6 gives the principal physical achievements of the blocks functioning at the end of financial year. The physical achievements represent the physical output within the block area and are not necessarily the results of financial inputs made out of community development funds only.

LOCAL BODIES

This section deals with the information pertaining to the constitution and administration of local bodies viz., Municipalities & Village Panchayats.
