INTRODUCTION

Last year on the Republic Day we brought out the first issue of the Statistical Abstract, Rajasthan. In less than six months it was followed by its second issue for the year 1959. Again, this year, on this auspicious day in our national life, which marks the celebrations of the Republic Day, 1961, we are happy to release the Statistical Abstract, Rajasthan for 1960. With this quick succession of publications we have been able to cover the timelag in the release of statistical data to our consumers. The current issue of the Statistical Abstract contains data for the calendar year 1959 or the financial or Agricultural year 1958-59. Like the previous issues, the Statistical Abstract, Rajasthan for 1960 has been planned to fulfil the need of making available comprehensive and detailed information at one place relating to the economic and social life in the State. The pattern followed in presenting the tables is identical to the previous issues and we have given data for the State as a whole, for preceding 5 years and district-wise breakup has been given for the reference period of the Abstract. In the current issue, we have incorporated 11 new tables. Further in fulfilment of our earlier announcement, the current issue contains notes on concepts and methodology applicable to the data incorporated in this volume. The source of information quoted at the foot of the tables indicates either the earlier published source from which the data has been abstracted or the source of supply of information if the data has not been published earlier. In the current issue we have introduced metric units for almost all the tables and alongwith it published the data in the old units to facilitate understanding. Gradually, we shall be publishing the data in metric units only.

We, once again wish to record our warm appreciation of the active cooperation of the various Departments of the Government which has enabled us to bring out this publication in such quick succession. We continue to look forward for their assistance as well as constructive suggestions from our readers to make this publication further useful.

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GENERAL INFORMATION

The State of Rajasthan, as constituted on 1st November, 1956, under the State's Reorganisation Act, 1956, has come into existence through seven stages of merger of the erstwhile princely States and the former part 'C' State of Ajmer as well as the transfer of small enclaves from one State to another. In the first stage on 17th March, 1948 the four Princely States of Alwar, Bharatpur, Dholpur and Karauli including the Chiefship of Nimrana formed into the Matsya Union. In the second stage, within a week on 25th March, 1948 the nine Princely States of Banswara, Bundi, Dungarpur, Jhalawar, Kishangarh, Kota, Pratapgarh, Shahpura and Tonk formed into another union known as Rajasthan (Former). Udaipur joined later on 18th April, 1948, and the four States of Bikaner, Jaipur, Jaisalmer and Jodhpur on 30th March, 1949. On 15th May, 1949 Matsya Union merged with the United State of Greater Rajasthan. In the sixth stage on 26th January, 1950 part of the former Sirohi State was merged into Rajasthan. Finally in the last stage under the State's Reorganisation Act, 1956, the erstwhile Part 'C' State of Ajmer, the Abu Road Taluka of the former Bombay State and Sunel Tappa enclave of the former Madhya Bharat State were merged into Rajasthan and Sironj sub-division of Kota district was transferred to Madhya Pradesh. The area and population figures for the States/Territories forming the union are based on the Census reports of 1941 and 1951.

Thus Rajasthan, which was till lately the domain of princely rulers is now one of the 15 States of the Indian Republic and in order to better understand the socio-economic progress made by the State in the race along with other sister States two tables on "Rajasthan in Indian Economy" have been added. The latest available data has been obtained from the respective State Statistical Bureaux.

AREA AND POPULATION

Area.—Two sets of area figures have been given—one based on Surveyor General of India and the other on Village papers. There is slight difference between these two sets of figures because of the different methods by which they are collected and also because some areas are unsurveyed.

Village.—A 'Village' means a revenue *Muza* whose revenue is realised under a separate name. It includes all hamlets attached to it.

Town.—The criteria of a town to have a minimum population of 5,000 has been relaxed in the case of Rajasthan and all the Municipal areas have been taken as towns irrespective of their size and so also cantonments. In addition, some other places which had urban characteristics about them have also been treated as towns.

City.—A 'City' is normally defined as a town with a population of one lakh or over but this definition has been relaxed in the case of Rajasthan and towns with a population of 50,000 or over have also been treated as cities to bring the definition in uniformity with the one adopted in the Municipal Act.

The area according to the Surveyor General of India and the population figures are based on the 1951 Census reports and have been adjusted for the re-organised Rajasthan as if it existed at the time of 1951 Census. Wherever the figures for Sunel Tappa enclave, Abu Taluka and Sironj sub-divisions were not available they have been estimated as follows :—

(i) *Sunel Tappa enclave.*—Figures have been calculated from the District Census Hand-book of Mandsore district of former Madhya Bharat State on the basis of the list of villages that were transferred to Rajasthan and population was classified under various categories in proportion to the classification of population of Mandsore district.

(ii) *Abu Taluka.*—Figures have been extracted out from the District Census Hand-book of Banaskantha district of former Bombay State and wherever necessary have been estimated in proportion to the population of Banaskantha district.

(iii) *Sironj sub-division.*—Figures have been estimated in proportion to the figures of Kota district wherever not available directly from the District Census Hand-book of Kota district.

Population projections.—The figures of estimated population and projected population by sex and broad age-groups for Rajasthan as a whole have been worked out by the Planning Commission and the Labour Force Projections by the Directorate of Resettlement and Employment now known as the Directorate of Employment and Training, Government of India.

Population by age-groups.—The distribution of population according to the broad age-groups is based on 10 percent. sample population of the pre-reorganised State of Rajasthan and erstwhile Ajmer State.

Livelihood Classes.—(a) *Land* is deemed to be owned if it is held on any tenure (by whatever name it is known locally) which carries with it the right of permanent occupancy for purpose of cultivation, such right should be heritable. It may be (but need not necessarily be) also transferable.

(b) *Cultivator* is distinguished from a *Cultivating labourer* as the person who takes responsible decisions which constitute the direction of the process of cultivation. All cultivating labourers are employees of cultivators.

(c) The classification of a person employed in any non-agricultural enterprise or establishment is based on the nature of his own work, not on the nature of enterprise or establishment concerned. Their dependants are also included under the same head.

Economic Status:—(a) All *self supporting* persons are ordinarily economically active. But there are certain classes and groups which constitute an exception to this rule which are as follows:—

- 1 The non-cultivating owners of land, agricultural rent receivers and their dependants,
- 2 Non-working owners of non-agricultural property,
- 3 Pensions and remittance holders,
- 4 Persons living on charity and other persons with unproductive occupations, and
- 5 Inmates of penal institutions and asylums.

(b) All *earning dependants* are economically semi-active only. Though they contribute to the carrying on of economic activities the magnitude of their individual contribution deemed to be too small to justify their description as economically active.

(c) All *non-earning dependants* are economically passive. They include persons performing house work or other domestic or personal services for other members of the same family household. But they do not include unpaid family workers or persons who take part along with the members of the family/household in carrying on cultivation or a house industry as a family enterprise.

Employers, Employees and Independent workers:—Economically active persons engaged in Industries and services have been classified to that particular description of economic activity from which they have been in fact deriving a regular (that is non-casual) income as their principal means of livelihood.

Population according to Languages:—Persons have been classified according to languages spoken as mother tongues

Rajasthani includes Rajasthani, Ajmeri, Bagri or Shekhawati, Banjari or Labani, Bikaneri, Dhundhari or Jaipuri, Kishangarhi, Harauti, Malwi, Rangari or Ahiri, Marwari, Merwari, Mewari, Mewari-Khairari, Mewati, Rathi, Sondwari, Dhabadi and Dhado.

Western Hindi includes Western Hindi, Brij Bhasha, Bundel Khandi, Dangi, Hindi and Urdu.

Bhilli includes Bhilli, Gilasiya and Vagdi.

Others include Behari, Bengali, Eastern Pahari, Kanjari, Khandesi, Telugu, Tamil, Odiya, Kanarese, Eastern Hindi, Gohati and other foreign languages.

Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes:—These are the castes declared as Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes by the President of India under the Constitution from time to time.

The population of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes has been estimated in the office of the Registrar General, Government of India, for castes and tribes included in or excluded from the 1950 schedules in accordance with Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Amendment) Act, 1956. The figures, of course, are based on 1951 Census.

Migration:—This includes *immigrants* into any district of Rajasthan from the other States of India and also from places outside India and *emigrants* to the other places according to birth place.

Displaced persons:—*Displaced person* means any person who has entered India having left or been compelled to leave his home in Western Pakistan or his home in Eastern Pakistan on account of civil disturbances or the fear of such disturbances or on account of the setting up of the two Dominions of India and Pakistan.

Area and Population by Tehsils:—Area figures according to the village papers are for the year 1956 and have been supplied by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan. Accordingly in the table on "Area and Population by tehsils" population figures have been adjusted for the administrative set-up of the State as in 1956.

Growth of population in cities and Principal towns:—The mid-year estimated population of cities and towns is based on the same calculation procedure with adjustments, which is adopted for the calculation of population of similar towns in India by the Registrar General of India, New Delhi, viz.,

$$P_1 = P_0 \frac{2000 + ng}{2000 - ng}$$

Where P_1 = mid-year estimated population for any year, P_0 = population at the time of 1951 Census

n = number of years since 1951 Census and $g = \frac{\text{population of the town in 1951} - \text{population of the town in 1941}}{\text{population of the town in 1951} + \text{population of the town in 1941}} \times 200$

At places where 1951 population due to certain reasons was less than in 1941, g has been calculated on the basis of 1931-41 population and where 1941 population, too was less than 1931, the 1961 mid-year estimated population has not been worked out.

Mean decennial growth rate has been worked out as follows:—

CLIMATE

Temperature—Observations of temperature of air in shed are taken at most of the observatories twice a day at 0830 and 1730 hours IST. For this purpose thermometers are installed at a height of 4 feet above the ground in Stevenson Screens which provide free access to the air but, at the same time, protect the thermometers from direct rays of the sun.

Humidity—Relative humidity is the measure of water vapours present in the atmosphere relative to the corresponding amount for saturation. It is recorded at the principal observatories by standard records at 0830 and 1730 hours IST.

The temperature and humidity data has been compiled from the daily bulletin issued by the Meteorological Department, Government of India.

Rainfall—Actual rainfall is recorded at the stations at 0830 IST every day. The amount measured gives the rainfall of the previous 24 hours and the data is tabulated by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan.

Normal Annual rainfall is the average of rainfall data for the past 10 years and was last worked out for each district headquarter in the year 1956.

AGRICULTURE

Land Utilisation—The main purpose of the table on Land utilisation is to indicate broadly the utilisation of land in this State. The classification of area was formerly available under five classes, which have recently been amplified to nine to fall in line with standard classification.

Geographical area—Area according to Surveyor General of India is calculated in the office of the Surveyor General of India and area according to village papers is based on the returns of area estimates prepared by the Revenue staff. There is slight difference between these two sets of figures because of the different methods by which they are collected and also because some areas are unsurveyed.

Forests—The area shown under forests in the table on Land utilisation does not tally with that given in table under the head "Forests" because (i) the Forest department reports forests worked out by Forest Department while the tables on Agricultural Statistics include in addition, forest areas administered by district officers and (ii) certain villages and other lands not covered by forests but worked out by Forest Department are not treated as forests in the returns of Agricultural statistics.

Area not available for cultivation—This stands for all land which is absolutely barren or un-cultivable or covered by buildings, water, or roads or otherwise appropriated for non-agricultural purposes. Under sub-head "Land put to non-agricultural use" includes land occupied by buildings, roads, railways or under water and other lands put to uses other than agriculture while under the sub-head "Barren and unculturable land" comes mountains, forests, deserts etc.

Other uncultivated land excluding fallow land—This denotes land for cultivation but not taken up and include culturable waste, permanent pastures and other grazing land and land under miscellaneous tree crops and groves. The last one is that type of culturable land which is not included under net area sown but is put to some agricultural use.

Fallow land—It includes 'current fallows' i.e., land which is left fallow during the current year only and 'other fallow lands' i.e., lands which were taken up for cultivation but are temporarily out of cultivation for a period of not less than one year and not more than 5 years.

Net area sown, Area sown more than once and total cropped area—In computing the net area sown, areas sown more than once, have been counted only once Under the head 'area sown more than once' area sown with 2 and more than 2 crops in the same year is accounted more than once. The total cropped area is the total of net area sown and area sown more than once.

Area and production of crops—The figures of area and production are given for principal cereals, pulses and commercial crops. The area figures are compiled by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan, from the Agricultural statistics returns prepared by the Revenue staff, while the production figures for the State as a whole are estimated on the basis of crop-cutting experiment results for Bajra, Jowar, Wheat, Maize, Barley, Small millets and Sugarcane and for other crops, it is calculated on the basis of the average normal yield of the past 10 years. For estimating the production at the district level, yield is worked out separately for each of the major districts, depending upon different crops, and for the remaining districts the estimates are only tentative. The total of the districts tallies with the production for the State as a whole.

The figures are based on revised estimates as issued from time to time along with the final forecast for the following year. The data relates to the Agricultural year ending June.

Average yield of principal crops—It has been calculated by dividing production figures by area, both figures being based on Revised Final Estimates.


Agricultural Land Holdings—The results of the survey of land holdings in 22 selected tehsils of the then Rajasthan conducted in the year 1955-56 by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan have been given in this table.

Agricultural Implements and machinery—The figures relate to the agricultural implements and machinery in actual use as recorded in the Quinquennial Livestock Census Report, 1956 for the year 1955-56 and as reported by the Revenue Staff in the Agricultural statistics returns for subsequent agricultural year. The data in compiled form is supplied to this Directorate by the Board of Revenue (Land Records), Rajasthan.

FORESTS

The area of forests presented here is as reported by the Forest Department. It has been further classified by the legal status such as “*reserved*”, “*protected*” and “*unclassified*”. *Reserved forest* is one which is permanently dedicated either to the production of timber or other forest produce and in which right of grazing and cultivation is seldom allowed. In *protected forests* these rights are allowed subject to a few mild restrictions. *Unclassed forests* consist largely of inaccessible forest or unoccupied waste.

The forest statistics are reported for the administrative divisions of the Forest Department and not for Revenue administrative divisions/districts.

Forest produce is classified as major produce and minor produce. The value of out-turn relates to the products removed or utilised.

INDUSTRIES

Factory.—A factory means any premises including the precincts thereof—

- (i) Whereon ten or more workers are working, or were working on any day of the preceding 12 months and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on with the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on, or
- (ii) Whereon twenty or more workers are working or were working on any day of the preceding 12 months and in any part of which a manufacturing process is being carried on without the aid of power or is ordinarily so carried on,

but does not include a mine subject to the operation of the Mines Act, 1952 (XXXV of 1952), or a railway running shed.

Such factories are registered under section 2 (m) of the Factories Act, 1948.

Besides these, (a) The State Government may, by notification in the official Gazette, declare that all or any of the provisions of this Act shall apply to any place wherein a manufacturing process is carried on with or without the aid of power or is so ordinarily carried on, notwithstanding that—

- (i) the number of persons employed therein is less than ten, if working with the aid of power and less than 20 if working without the aid of power, or
- (ii) the persons working therein are not employed by the owner thereof but are working with the permission of or under agreement with such owner:

provided that this manufacturing process is not being carried on by the owner only with the aid of his family.

(b) After a place is so declared, it shall be deemed to be a factory for the purpose of this Act, and the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier and any person working therein, a worker.

In Rajasthan, factories carrying on any of the manufacturing processes, viz., (i) Saw Mills, (ii) Tobacco products, (iii) Printing (Including lithographing) and book binding and (iv) Wool cleaning and pressing and not falling within sec. 2 (m) are covered under section 85 of the Factories Act, 1948.

The data is based on the information supplied by the Chief Inspector of Factories & Boilers, Rajasthan.

Financial assistance to industries.—The State Government is financing large and medium industries through the Rajasthan Financial Corporation, khadi and village industries through the Rajasthan Khadi and Village Industries Board and small scale industries i.e., factories with a capital of less than Rs. 5 lacs, through the Directorate of Industries and Supplies. The khadi and village industries are also getting aid from the All India Khadi and Village Industries Commission, but mostly through the Rajasthan Khadi and Village Industries Board. The amount of assistance which some of the institutions are getting directly from the All India Khadi and Village Industries Commission are also included under table 9.3.

Census of Manufacturing Industries.—All the factories registered under section 2 (m) of the Factories Act, 1948 are grouped into 63 groups and factories falling under first 29 groups of industries and employing 20 or more workers and using power were covered under this census till 1956 on statutory basis and thereafter on voluntary basis till 1958 due to the repeal of the Industrial Statistics Act, 1942 by the Collection of Statistics Act, 1953. This work was transferred in 1957 from

the Directorate of Industries and Supplies, Rajasthan, to the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan when the Director of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan was declared as the Statistics Authority under the Collection of Statistics Act, 1953. During the year 1958 the scope of the census was enlarged and all the factories registered under sec. 2 (m) of the Factories Act, 1948 were covered under voluntary census. The returns were scrutinised and data compiled after rectification of defects, if any, in the Directorate itself and the broad results have been presented in this issue.

The following are the important definitions and concepts used for this census:

Productive capital.—It includes both fixed and working capitals, fixed capital being that capital which is invested in the factory itself and is comprised of land, building, plant and machinery and other equipments, etc., while the working capital is invested to run the factory and is comprised of the stock of raw material, semi finished goods, cash in hand and at bank, etc., but excludes fixed deposits or current credits. All particulars under this head are as on 31st December, 1958 or the last closing date of accounts, except in case of sugar industry the particulars of which are as on 30th June, 1958.

Worker.—As defined under section 2 (l) of the Factories Act, 1948 a worker means a person employed directly or through any agency, whether for wages or not, in any manufacturing process, or in clearing any part of the machinery or premises used for a manufacturing process, or in any other kind of work incidental to or connected with the manufacturing process, or the subject of the manufacturing process.

Persons other than workers.—This head includes persons employed in administrative and clerical jobs within the factory area and all those engaged in effecting delivery of the output.

The average daily employment has been worked out by dividing the aggregate number in attendance on all working days by total number of working days during the year. Daily attendance is the aggregate of attendance in all shifts. Days on which the factory was closed for whatever cause have not been treated as working days.

Wages.—The term wages is used in the same sense as defined in section 2 (vi) of the Payment of Wages Act, 1936 and means all remunerations capable of being expressed in terms of money which would if the terms of contract of employment express or implied were fulfilled be payable whether conditionally upon the regular attendance, good work or conduct or behaviour of the persons employed or otherwise to a person employed in respect of his employment or of work done in such employment and includes any bonus or other additional remuneration of the nature aforesaid which would be so payable and any sum payable to such person by reason of the termination of his employment, but does not include:—

- (a) The value of any house, accommodation, supply of light, water, medical attendance or other amenity for any services specifically excluded by general or special order of the State Government.
- (b) any contribution paid by the employer to any pension fund or provident fund.
- (c) any travelling allowance or the value of any travelling concession.
- (d) any sum paid to the person employed to defray special expenses entailed on him by the nature of his employment.
- (e) or any gratuity payable on discharge.

Other benefits.—These include various benefits over and above wages such as free or subsidised housing, food-grains at concessional rates, etc.

Ex-factory purchase value of fuels and raw materials consumed.—This is the purchase value of fuels and raw materials consumed in the factory and includes the purchase price, transport charges and other incidental costs like payment

of commission to agents etc. Value of fuels or materials manufactured within the factory and consumed for further processing has not been accounted for. The value of semi-finished goods at the beginning of the year has been included in it.

Value of work done by other concerns.—This term denotes the cost of services rendered to the factory by other concerns and by individuals other than its own employees.

Depreciation.—Depreciation on fixed assets is calculated at the rates allowed by the Income-tax authorities for assessing taxable income.

Ex-factory selling value of products and by-products.—This represents the value of products and by-products of the factory and is exclusive of transport charges from the factory, commission to selling agents etc. This term includes all products made during the year for sale (whether actually sold during the year or not. The value of semi-finished goods) at the end of the year has also been included in it.

Value of work done for others.—This means value of work done by the factory for others on payment when the materials are supplied by them.

Value added by Manufacture.—This represents that part of the value of the products which is created in the process of manufacturing and is calculated by subtracting the ex-factory purchase value of fuels and raw materials, value of work done by others and depreciation on fixed assets from the ex-factory selling value of products and value of work done for others.

All the data refer to calendar year except in case of sugar industry data for which refer to the year ending June in the following year

Textile Industry.—Data on Textile industry (Mills sector) has been extracted out mostly from the “Indian Textile Industry Journal” brought out by the Textile Commissioner, Government of India. The information therein is based on statutory returns obtained under Cotton Textile (Control) Order, 1948.

Industrial production.—In most cases data has been compiled in the Directorate of Economics and Statistics from the returns received under Census of Manufacturing Industries and where obtained directly foot note has been given. The smaller units have been left out and to that extent there is an omission in the data.

FUEL AND POWER

Distribution of Coal—The data on distribution of coal to various type of industries is extracted out from the monthly bulletin titled as “Monthly review of coal production and distribution” issued by the Coal Controller, Government of India, Calcutta.

Power—The data on Generation and consumption of electricity relates to both the private and public undertakings in the State. Military and factory power stations are excluded and so also railway power stations. Electricity generated covers the total power generation in the State through steam/Gas and Diesel.

The statistics are compiled in the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan from the monthly returns, obtained from the Central Water and Power Commission, Government of India, Simla. Data on State owned power houses for the year 1958-59 has been obtained from the Rajasthan State Electricity Board, Jaipur.



TRADE

The *trade* statistics gives quantity (generally net weight i.e. exclusive of packing) of certain commodities exported from the State of Rajasthan to other States and imported from other States to Rajasthan. Data relates to river and rail borne trade only and are presented for the financial year April to March. The figures are compiled by the Director General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India, Calcutta, and published in their reports entitled 'Accounts relating to the Inland (Rail and River borne) Trade of India.

These statistics are recorded on "Import basis". According to arrangements in force, each of the Railways register such traffic as is received at stations on its line within a trade block from other trade blocks without taking into account, the traffic en-route to a destination on a different railway station or to a station on the same system but located outside the trade blocks. The imports into the station on the minor railways are recorded by the major railways connecting them. The traffic carried partly by rail and partly by river, when booked through and carried by steamers running in connection with railways, is to be recorded generally by the railway administration concerned.

PRICES

Consumer's General Price Index Numbers for Working Classes—These indices relate only to working class families of Ajmer and Beawar. These represent change in the cost of a given basket of goods and services consumed by an average working class household. The items in the list of articles are grouped under five heads viz., food, fuel and lighting, clothing, bedding and footwear, house rent and miscellaneous and separate indices are worked out for individual groups. These are compiled and supplied by the Director, Labour Bureau, Government of India, Simla. The prices of certain prescribed commodities for this purpose are collected by the Labour Bureau, Simla for these centres of Rajasthan through the agency of this Directorate.

Index Numbers of Wholesale Prices in Rajasthan—The Directorate of Economics and Statistics have compiled index numbers of wholesale prices for measuring the variations in the price level in the State. It is a general purpose index with year 1952-53 as base. The index is divided into four major groups viz., food articles, industrial raw material, fuel, power and lubricants and manufactured articles. In all it covers 59 items for which 98 quotations are collected from 22 centres in the State by the Directorate on every Friday.

Retail Prices of Food-grains—Retail prices prevailing at district head-quarters of six food-grains viz., Wheat Barley, Gram, Jowar, Bajra and Maize are supplied by the Secretary, Board of Revenue (Land Records) Rajasthan who in turn, receives these prices from the Collectors of all districts of the State, Rajasthan. Rates are quoted in rupees per maund. These monthly averages are simply arithmetic averages of the prices reported at fortnightly intervals.

Spot Quotations of Bullion—The prices relate to the spot quotations at Jaipur city. These are collected on every Friday by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics. The average price is the simple average of the highest and lowest prices. Likewise the monthly averages are also simple arithmetic average of weekly prices.


Forward Quotations of Bullion—These are simple Arithmetic average of daily prices of forward transactions in silver. Maximum and minimum prices recorded during the month are taken and simple arithmetic average is calculated for the closing prices of all the market days of the month to arrive at an average price. These prices are collected from Bullion Exchange, Jaipur city by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics, Rajasthan.

Loans advanced—Statistics are loans issued to members.

Recoveries—Statistics made are amounts recovered against the loans advanced.

The data relates to the co-operative year ending 30th June of every year and is supplied by the Registrar, Co-operative Societies, Rajasthan.

PUBLIC FINANCE

First 14 tables of this section deal with the *Finances of the State Government*, both receipts and expenditure. The data in these tables has been culled out from the annual budget volumes published by the Finance Department of the Government of Rajasthan. The figures represent the actuals for the past 4 years and for the latest year budget estimates, revised estimates and actuals have been presented and all figures relate to the financial year from April to March. The tables have been classified on the basis of independent economically significant categories viz. the receipts have been classified into tax revenue, non-tax revenue and the like. Similarly the expenditure has been classified into revenue, capital, development and non development etc.,

The tax revenue of the State can be broadly classified into two important heads i.e. the State Tax Revenue and the Receipts from Centrally Levied Taxes. The important sources of state tax revenue and land revenue, state excise, sales tax, and taxes on motor vehicles. The receipts from centrally levied taxes represents the share of the State Government of Rajasthan from the divisible pool of income tax, union excise, taxes on railway fares, and estate duty. The share is receivable on the basis of recommendations of the Second Finance Commission. The share of State Government in income tax, union excise, tax on railway fares, and estate duty amounts to Rs. 4.09 per cent, 4.71 per cent, 4.47 per cent and 6.77 per cent of the total divisible pool allotted to States under the award of finance commission. A separate table has been given re-classifying these taxes on the basis of incidence of taxation distinguishing between direct and indirect taxes. The non-tax revenue largely comprises of receipts from public undertakings like forests, irrigation, multi-purpose river valley projects, civil works and receipts from civil administration. The total revenue expenditure has been broadly classified into development and non-development expenditure. The development expenditure has been further classified into expenditure on economic development and expenditure on social services with a view to present in a concise and consolidated form the progress of the development expenditure on revenue account into these broad categories which are the basic objectives of plans.

Under the head expenditure on non-development services the items included in direct demands on revenue comprise of the establishment charges for the collection of land revenue, state excise, sales tax and other important sources of tax revenue. Debt services include the amount of interest paid for its public debts.

The total capital expenditure has also been classified into development and non-development categories. The items included in Government trading under capital expenditure relate to the charges incurred for grain supply schemes, distribution of seeds, fertilisers and implements etc.,


Under the permanent debt the amount shown represents the receipts on account of the public loan floated in the year 1956 and 1958 which is repayable in 1968 and 1970 respectively.

The public account transactions have been given in a consolidated form showing the total of receipts and disbursement in table 15.14 under the head "Debt, Deposit and Remittance transactions".

Index numbers have also been given in most of the tables under this section with the year 1951-52 as base to facilitate a ready comparison of the financial transactions of the State Government from the beginning of the first five year plan over the years.

Land Revenue—This table presents data concerning estimates of land revenue along with other particulars. Data for the years 1953-54 to 1955-56 relates to pre-reorganised, Rajasthan. In districtwise agricultural population administrative changes other than due to state's reorganisation in 1956 have not been taken into account. The data is compiled by the Board of Revenue (Land Records) Rajasthan, on the basis of the Annual Agricultural Statistics returns.

Income Tax—Statistics presented in tables 15.21 to 15.29 relates to the assessment on account of income-tax, super-tax and surcharge made by the Income-tax Department, Government of India. The figures refer to regular assessments made under the Income-tax Act and do not include demands raised for advanced payment, provisional assessment and miscellaneous demands like penalties, warrant of fees etc. Figures of taxes represent the demand raised and not the collection actually made against those demands. These tables analyse the demand for income tax, super-tax and surcharge. According to the class of assessee viz:—(1) Individual (2) Hindu undivided families, (3) Registered firms, (4) Unregistered firms and other association of persons and (5) Company and other concern assessable at company rate. The statements are designed to show the total tax demand payable by assessee and net income-tax in their hands after the payment of tax. The number of assessee shown are in respect of each source of income and an assessee having more than one source is included under each of the source from which he derived his income. The figures for the latest year are presented separately by income ranges. The data has been supplied by the Central Board of Revenue, Government of India.



LABOUR

Trade unions—Data in table 16.1 relates to trade unions registered or cancelled under the Indian Trade Unions Act, 1926, and in table 16.2 and 16.3 they relate to only those trade unions that have submitted returns.

Industrial complaints—Only the number of complaints by causes received in the Labour Department have been reported.

Industrial disputes—Industrial disputes relate to strikes and lock-outs resulting in stoppage of work involving ten or more workers in all sectors of employment including factories, transport, municipal services etc. Sympathetic strikes and certain other types of stoppages which do not strictly come under the definition of industrial disputes as laid down in the Industrial Disputes Act, 1947 are not covered.

Factory accident—Under this head are covered only the accidents (enquired into) occurring in factories which result in either death or injury to a worker necessitating his absence from work for 48 hours or more. This information is collected under the Factories Act, 1948.

The data has been compiled in this Directorate from the monthly reports on labour situation issued by the Labour Department, Rajasthan and its Annual Administration Reports.

Manshifts worked—Number of manshifts worked during the month is obtained by adding together the number of workers who worked on each shift on each day of the month, i.e. the total presence of all the workers in the month.

Manshifts lost—Number of manshifts lost during the month on account of absence is obtained by adding together the number of workers absent on each shift on each day during the month. Manshifts lost by absence due to strike, lock out or employer ordered lay-off are to be excluded.

Manshifts lost through involuntary unemployment—Number of manshifts lost through involuntary unemployment is obtained by adding together the number of workers who in spite of being on rolls remained unemployed for want of coal, raw materials, break down of machinery, inadequacy of work etc. on each shift on each working day of the month.

Manshifts lost due to other causes—Some of the factories which had no proper record of absence of workers due to sickness, accident etc. have reported all absences under the head "other causes."

Manshifts scheduled to work—This is total of manshifts worked and lost.

Absenteeism in factories—It is the percentage of manshifts lost to manshifts scheduled to work and has been worked out as under:—

$$\frac{\text{Total Manshifts lost}}{\text{Total Manshifts worked + lost}} \times 100$$

The Directorate of Economics and Statistics is collecting Industrial Statistics Quarterly (Labour) returns on voluntary basis from all the factories registered under section 2 m (i) and (ii) of the Factories Act, 1948. The data relates to 369 factories which were working and submitted returns out of a total of 462 factories. Two ordinance factories have not been covered. The returns received from the factories were scrutinised and after rectification of defects, if any,

the data on absenteeism was compiled. The returns are expected to be kept confidential and as such no information about any factory is published unless there are 3 factories in one particular industry. In Rajasthan there were only 2 units under the head "Furniture and fixture" and one unit each under "Rubber and rubber products" and "Electrical appliances" and have been included under the heads, "Wood and Cork", "Chemicals and chemical products" and "Manufacture of machinery" respectively.

EMPLOYMENT

This section deals with industrial employment and their earnings, employment in Khadi and Village Industries, Mining and Public Sector, Rajasthan Government Employees and their emoluments and Employment Exchange Statistics. Statistics relating to Industrial Employment and average daily cash earnings of Industrial workers have been compiled in the Directorate of Economics and Statistics on the basis of returns collected on voluntary basis from the factories registered under section 2 (m) of the Factories Act 1948. The returns from individual factories are treated as confidential and no figures for any industry are presented unless there are 3 unit in the same industry. Accordingly two unit of the group "Furniture and fixture" and one unit of each of the groups, "Rubber and Rubber products" and "Electrical appliances" have been included under the groups "Wood and Cork", "Chemicals and Chemical products", and "Manufacture of machinery" respectively. Two ordnance factories have not been covered.

The figures for average number of workers employed during the last month of the quarter for individual factories have been added up to obtain the totals for each industry. Children have been included in the sub head women. In the case of Second, Third and Fourth quarters wherever the returns from any individual factories were not available, figures have been estimated on the basis of the returns relating to the past quarters.

Employment in Mining—The supply of such data to the Directorate of Mines and Geology, Rajasthan, is a statutory obligation on the part of the lessors. But in the case of certain minor minerals and especially building materials where rent-and-royalty leases are granted, average number of persons employed per day are just estimated on the basis of royalty collected through royalty collection contraction. In case of certain minerals where the data for any particular year was not available, it has been estimated on the basis of production during the last year. The figures given in this table represent the daily labour employed both above-ground and under-ground.


Rajasthan Government Employees—The Directorate of Economics & Statistics is conducting a regular census of Rajasthan Government Employees on half-yearly basis. The first census being conducted for the employees as on 31-12-56. The data is collected separately for gazetted and non-gazetted staff under various pay ranges. The non-gazetted staff has been further sub-divided into permanent, temporary and part-time piece rate etc., while the gazetted staff has been sub-divided into permanent and temporary. The data in the prescribed form is supplied by the Drawing and

Disbursing Officers to the respective Heads of the Departments and they in turn compiled the data for whole of the Department and passed on to the Directorate of Economics & Statistics for compilation at State level. Employment represents the actuals as on the date of census, while the monthly emoluments are estimated by multiplying the total employees with the value of the respective ranges.




RAJASTHAN GOVT. EMPLOYEES

INDUSTRIAL EMPLOYMENT






EMPLOYMENT IN KHADI & VILLAGE INDUSTRIES

EDUCATION

This section presents data on Literacy as available from the 1951 census report and other Educational Statistics are supplied by the Directorate of Education now known as Director of Primary and Secondary Education, Rajasthan, which in turn collects from the educational institutions of all standards for submission to the Ministry of Education, Government of India in form 'A'. The data on Examination results is based on the information supplied by the University of Rajasthan, Board of Higher Secondary Education and the Directorate of Education, Rajasthan for the portions covered by them.

For the purpose of these tables all statistics refer to recognised institutions only except for primary schools where unrecognised institutions have also been included.


Schools/Colleges for Agriculture, Commerce, Engineering, Law, Medicine, Physical Education, Teachers' Training, Veterinary Science etc. come under *Professional education* while those for Music, Dancing, Fine Arts, Oriental Studies, Social Education etc. under *Special education*. All other type of studies come under general education.

Scholar means a student admitted and getting education in an institution as regular student on roll as on the 31st March of the reporting year.

Teacher means a whole time person appointed by the management for teaching and as on staff on the 31st March of the reporting year.

Expenditure means the amount actually spent on education including recurring and non-recurring charges up to 31st March of the reporting year. *In direct expenditure* represents the amount incurred on direction, buildings, furniture, scholarships and other miscellaneous items. Its nature is such that it can not be apportioned to each type of institution.

Examination results refer to those students who were educated during the reporting year. These include results of private candidates also.

MEDICAL AND PUBLIC HEALTH

Medical and Health Personnel—The number of personnel given is based on sanctioned strength of State-Public Hospitals, Dispensaries, Primary Health Centres, Family Planning Centres, Maternity and Child Welfare Centres, Clinics and Health work.

Hospitals and Dispensaries—The distinction between a hospital and a dispensary has been made on the basis of provision of in-patient beds. A hospital has beds whereas dispensary has none.

The reduction in the number of hospitals and dispensaries in table No. 20.1 is due to the timelag taken in closing, shifting and re-opening them at different places which is being done because of converting them into Primary Health Centres.

Patients treated—The increase in the number of patients treated from year to year does not indicate the increased incidence of diseases but reflects the increased number of patients who came to State-run-institutions instead of remaining without treatment or going to private practitioners.

Deaths by causes—The data is based on the reports received from the Health Staff by the Directorate of Medical and Health Services. Hundred per-cent cases and deaths occurring in remote areas are not reported to the local health authorities, consequently there is an omission to that extent. The increase in the number of deaths may perhaps be due to better reporting.

Birth and Death Rates—In table No. 20.10 birth and death rates in 13 towns having a population of 30,000 and above according to 1951 census have been given. The data relates to rates per one thousand of mid-year estimated population of these towns.

In case of infant and maternal mortality rates given in table 20.11 the registration area is changing from year to year and as such the actual number of towns and tehsils under registration area for each year has been given. The infant mortality and maternal mortality rates were calculated on 1000 live births and 1000 total births (including still births) respectively.

The birth and death rates, infant and maternal mortality rates showing fluctuations from year to year are mainly due to the defect in registration. There was to a certain extent under-registration as well as mis-registration.

The statistics in respect of Allopathic system and birth and death rates have been made available by the Directorate of Medical and Health Services, Rajasthan, and in respect of Ayurvedic and Unani system by the Directorate of Ayurved, Rajasthan.



HOUSING

The scheme of *Industrial Housing* which is one of the Plan Schemes for the benefit of the Industrial workers is being executed by the Labour Department, Rajasthan, and till the year under review, the scheme was under operation only at four big industrial towns namely Bhilwara, Jaipur, Pali and Ganganagar.

Under the scheme of *Low Income Group Housing* loans are disbursed by the Collectors to the persons having an annual income up to Rs. 8 thousand for the construction of residential quarters and at the State level the scheme is controlled by the Planning Department of the Secretariat, Government of Rajasthan. Till the year under review the scheme was in operation at all the district headquarters.

PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

First Five Year Plan.—The data given in table No. 22.1 was collected by the Directorate of Economics and Statistics from the Plan executing authorities towards the end of the First Five Year Plan. The figures of outlay and expenditure presented in the table were reported to be final till the date of publication.

Second Five Year Plan.—The table No. 22.2 gives yearly allotment and expenditure against the total Second Plan provision. The figures of plan provision are those which have been earmarked for the State by the Planning Commission. The sector-wise plan provisions have been adopted as indicated in the original plan and subsequent inter-sector changes have not been taken into account. The expenditure reported in this table is only that which has been spent against State budget allotment and all other expenditure viz., outside plan ceiling, and against central grants not included in the State budget, have been excluded from the total expenditure. The yearly figures of expenditure are latest as reported by the plan executing authorities and are reconciled as far as possible.

The arrangement of sectors in the table has been made according to the classification indicated by the Planning Commission. While all other sectors are self-explanatory; the 'Medical and Public Health' under 'Social Services' sector includes the sub-sectors of Medical and Public Health, Water Supply, (Urban and Rural) and Ayurvedic. The 'Housing' sub-sector also includes Subsidiary Industrial Housing, Low Income Group Housing, Rural Housing and Slum Clearance. The sub-sector 'Others' under 'Miscellaneous' sector includes only the administrative buildings in Ajmer.

The scheme-wise details of Allotment and Expenditure and Physical Targets and Achievements are given in table No. 22.5 and 22.6.

The data is collected on monthly and quarterly basis from all the plan executing authorities within a time-lag of one month in case of monthly returns and 45 days in case of quarterly returns. The monthly data is compiled into quarterly figures and further perfected by the quarterly returns received from the plan executing authorities. The quarterly data is again compiled in annual form and is further perfected by the annual returns obtained from the plan executing authorities. The yearly figures are also got perfected every year and reconciled figures are taken for the year under report.

Second Five Year Plan—District-wise expenditure. The breakup of total expenditure in the State for the districts according to sectors is presented here. According to the nature of the schemes the total expenditure has been divided into 3 heads viz., (a) expenditure on districts, (b) expenditure on schemes beneficial to the State as a whole and (c) expenditure on headquarters. The expenditure on districts relates to the schemes which are in operation in a particular district and the benefit from them accrues to the district only. Expenditure on schemes beneficial to the State as a whole relates to the schemes like Multipurpose projects, both for Irrigation and Power, Professional College etc. which though operate in a particular district yet the benefit from them accrues to the State as a whole. Expenditure on headquarters relates to the amount spent at the headquarters for the planning and execution of the total plan programme in the State. This expenditure mainly includes the salary of the staff at the headquarters and the equipment used at the headquarters under Plan Schemes.

Community Projects.—The block is a unit of administration for the purpose of planning and development. The blocks are divided into the following categories:—


1. *Pre-Extension Block* is a Shadow block declared as such as a forerunner to the intensive phase of development block. Its life is generally one year.

2. *First-Stage Block* is a block declared as such after completion of pre-extension stage for intensive development. Its life is five years subject to further extension.
3. *Community Development Block* is a block declared as such for intensive development. Its life was three years. This category of block has not been declared as such since the introduction of First Stage Blocks.
4. *Second-Stage Block* is a block declared as such after it has completed its operational period of intensive development. Its life is five years.

Besides these, since the introduction of Democratic Decentralisation in Rajasthan, one more category of blocks is there known as *Shallow Block*. It is a block which has been de-limited as such but is not covered under the community development programme and hence not covered here.

In table No. 22.7, year of opening, present stage, area and villages covered and population served by each block has been given while in table No. 22.8 physical achievements for every financial year pertain to the number of blocks functioning in that year have been given. As the number of blocks go on increasing every year, the physical achievements also correspond accordingly. The physical achievements represent the physical output within the block area and are not necessarily the result of financial inputs made out of the block funds only. The source of this data is Development and Panchayats Department which obtain report from the Vikas Adhikari who in turn gets from the Gram Sewaks.

Welfare of backward classes.—The table No. 22.9 gives the progress of various activities undertaken for the welfare of backward classes in the State under plan. Backward classes include scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, denotified tribes and other backward classes. The data is collected from the Directorate of Social Welfare, Rajasthan.

GENERAL ELECTIONS


In Rajasthan under the terms of the Indian Constitution only the Vidhan Sabha with 176 directly elected members constitutes state legislature. 22 members are also directly elected from Rajasthan for the Lok Sabha and 10 members are sent to Rajya Sabha as elected representatives at the Rajasthan Vidhan Sabha.

In the following tables an attempt has been made to bring out broadly the salient characteristics of the electorates in the State, during the 1957 general elections and by-elections thereafter. For this the numbers of electorates, constituencies, seats allotted, votes polled and preferences of voting to each recognised party for the purpose of representation in the Vidhan Sabha and Lok Sabha have been given.

The election to the Vidhan Sabha and Lok Sabha is held on the basis of Adult suffrage, that is to say, that every person who is a citizen of India and has obtained the age of 21 years, if not otherwise disqualified, is entitled to be a voter at any such election. For the purpose of election single or double member representation has been determined. Each voter has one or more votes according to the nature of his constituency. The percentage of polling indicates the extent to which the voters exercise their franchise.

Tables on voting by sex, electoral strength of various parties and swing in political opinion have also been added.

The data contained in these tables has been compiled in the Directorate from the various reports and type studies brought out by Election Department, Government of Rajasthan.
